*Continued from last week*

Another stream of thought is politicism which grows on the tails of nihilism. It is the doctrine that all human problems are political in nature and so they can only be solved through political mechanisms. So truth and morality can and must be determined by public opinion. Marxism/communism is the prime example of politicism. The proponents of these political philosophies strongly believe in the destruction of old structures, like religion and monarchy, which need be destroyed in order to solve the social problems of poverty, inequality, and injustice. In fact Marx called religion the *opiate of the people*. As we can see even in our contemporary political milieu a situation where many believe that if we elect the right government, have the most progressive leader, or just fundamentally change America we will end the inequality, the poverty, and the injustices. Any clear thinking Catholic who knows that our salvation is not in societal change but rather in a change of heart must reject this politicism and its older brother nihilism.

Christ said we will always have the poor with us. He wasn't being sarcastic, he was revealing to us a fundamental truth. Sin exists. And because it exists, our human structures cannot solve a single thing. We need a structure that is built on a solid foundation who is Christ and is held in tact by the Holy Spirit. We have come to know this as the Church. It is one, holy, catholic and apostolic. The unity of the Church is fundamental in bringing about a holy revolution to a world set on destruction (nihilism). The Church, while even its members are influenced by these corruptive ideologies, is called to Love (love one another as I have loved you) and to be united (May they be one Father as you and I are one). The divine love we have been given must be shared not only within the community of the Church but even toward our enemies. I feel that this is one of the most difficult commandments of Christ: to love our enemies. In the world today we have enemies in the fanatical Islamists, like ISIS. They are killing many of our brothers and sisters in Syria and Iraq and they threaten us here on American soil. How do we love them? As St. Stephen was being stoned to death and Saul (to be St. Paul) watched over his execution, Saul heard St. Stephen's words of love: Forgive them. Saul, an enemy of the Church, would soon become her greatest ally.

This world and its structures of sin can only be conquered by the love of Christ and the unity of the Church. One of the dismissals of the Mass is: Go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life. Let's get out in the world and end this great divorce so that we can be salt of the earth and light of the world and bring about a change in the hearts of men so that our human structures can be less harmful, less destructive to the poor and those who do not yet know God.

### **2017 LENTEN REGULATIONS**

1. The days of both Fast and Abstinence during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection. The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence.

2. On a day of Fast, only one (1) full meal is permitted, and 2 smaller meals which if added together, would not exceed the main meal in quantity.

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast. On a day of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of abstinence.

3. The obligation to observe the laws of Fast and Abstinence "substantially" or as a whole is a serious obligation.

4. The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.

5. The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty\*) extends from the First Sunday of Lent, March 5, 2017 to the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, June 11, 2017.

\*Canon 920, §1. *All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year.* (Sacramental Confession is necessary if one is aware of having committed a serious sin.)

# NOTICIAS PARA TI

## Las Reglas de Cuaresma

1. Los días de Ayuno y Abstinencia durante la Cuaresma son el Miércoles de Ceniza y el Viernes Santo. Si es posible, el ayuno del Viernes Santo se continúa hasta la Vigilia de Pascua como el "ayuno pascual" para honrar el sufrimiento y la muerte del Señor Jesús, y para prepararnos a participar más plenamente y celebrar más fácilmente su Resurrección. Los otros viernes de Cuaresma son días de abstinencia.

2. En un día de ayuno, sólo una (1) comida completa está permitido, y 2 comidas más pequeñas que, si se sumaran, no superaría la comida principal en cantidad. Aquellos entre las edades de 18 y 59 años son obligados a ayunar. En un día de abstinencia, no se come carne. Los que han llegado a la edad de 14 años están obligados por la ley de la abstinencia.

3. La obligación de observar las leyes de Ayuno y Abstinencia "sustancialmente" o en su conjunto es una obligación seria.

4. Los viernes del año, fuera de la Cuaresma, son designados como días de penitencia, pero cada individuo puede sustituir a la tradicional abstinencia de comer carne por alguna otra práctica de las privaciones voluntarias como penitencia.

5. El tiempo para cumplir con el precepto pascual (Deber Pascual \*) se extiende desde el primer domingo de Cuaresma, 5 de marzo 2017 a la solemnidad de la Santísima Trinidad, 11 de junio 2017.

\*Canon 920, § 1. *Todo fiel, después de la primera comunión, esta obligado a comulgar por lo menos una vez al año.*

(Confesión Sacramental es necesario si uno es consciente de haber cometido un pecado grave)


