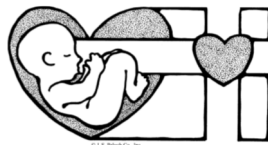

PARISH MISSION – APRIL 1 THRU APRIL 5

“You are Peter, and upon this Rock I will build my Church.” Jesus Christ.

This past week I was blessed enough to travel to Rome, the center of the Catholic Church. For five days I wandered around the streets of the Eternal City visiting churches and restaurants, my favorite two pastimes. I wasn't alone, Peter was with me. It was his first time in this city of Caesars and Popes. My highlights were my celebration of the Holy Mass in St. Peter's Basilica and visit to the Scavi. We arrived at the sacristy of St. Peter's around 7 AM and I requested to celebrate Mass (without a reservation) and the sacristan graciously set me up for a Mass. The acolyte, Peter and I wandered around the basilica unable to find a free altar. We then proceeded to the crypt of popes below. I celebrated Mass in the Chapel of Our Lady of Vilnius. I offered that Mass for our deceased mothers. On Wednesday we were back at St. Peter's to visit the Scavi. The Scavi are excavations beneath the Basilica of an ancient necropolis, city of the dead begun in the 1930's. It had a narrow roadway betwixt mausoleums of Romans, both pagans and believers. As the road gently sloped upward we came to the top of the hill and there we found ourselves at the grave of St. Peter directly beneath the high Altar of the Basilica. His remains are his bones identified in the 1960's. What a blessing it was to be there.

On Thursday we were off to Assisi, a two hour train ride. We arrived first at the Basilica of St. Mary of the Angels. This temple enshrines the Portiuncula, the small chapel that St. Francis built when our Lord commanded him, "Build my Church." In this church I celebrated the Holy Mass for you, my beloved parishioners. A newly wedded couple, Dave and Dorothy of Waco, Texas, joined us. Then it was time to go up to Assisi. It is like stepping back in time. I could only imagine the knights on horses and the ladies waiting for them as they entered through the gates in triumph. We first visited the Basilica of St. Francis built on the former site of executions. St. Francis is buried in the crypt of the church where I spent some time in quiet prayer. We then proceeded to the Convent of St. Clare which houses the uncorrupted body of St. Clare and the crucifix (San Damiano Cross) from which our Lord spoke to Francis, "Build my Church."

The final day we spent leisurely walking about the Eternal City. We met a seminarian of the North American College who graciously gave us a tour of the college and then to the roof top for a panoramic view of Rome. Then we went off to Trastevere, a section of the city where the locals still speak the ancient Roman dialect; and the food is great. It was only four and a half days, but filled with memories, faith, and joy. I hope that every Catholic could make such a trip if only for a few days if it be God's will.

2017 LENTEN REGULATIONS

1. The days of both Fast and Abstinence during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection. The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence.

2. On a day of Fast, only one (1) full meal is permitted, and 2 smaller meals which if added together, would not exceed the main meal in quantity.

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast. On a day of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of abstinence.

3. The obligation to observe the laws of Fast and Abstinence "substantially" or as a whole is a serious obligation.

4. The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.

5. The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty*) extends from the First Sunday of Lent, March 5, 2017 to the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, June 11, 2017.

*Canon 920, §1. *All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year.* (Sacramental Confession is necessary if one is aware of having committed a serious sin.)

Las Reglas de Cuaresma

1. Los días de Ayuno y Abstinencia durante la Cuaresma son el Miércoles de Ceniza y el Viernes Santo. Si es posible, el ayuno del Viernes Santo se continúa hasta la Vigilia de Pascua como el "ayuno pascual" para honrar el sufrimiento y la muerte del Señor Jesús, y para prepararnos a participar más plenamente y celebrar más fácilmente su Resurrección. Los otros viernes de Cuaresma son días de abstinencia.

2. En un día de ayuno, sólo una (1) comida completa está permitido, y 2 comidas más pequeñas que, si se sumaran, no superaría la comida principal en cantidad. Aquellos entre las edades de 18 y 59 años son obligados a ayunar. En un día de abstinencia, no se come carne. Los que han llegado a la edad de 14 años están obligados por la ley de la abstinencia.

3. La obligación de observar las leyes de Ayuno y Abstinencia "sustancialmente" o en su conjunto es una obligación seria.

4. Los viernes del año, fuera de la Cuaresma, son designados como días de penitencia, pero cada individuo puede sustituir a la tradicional abstinencia de comer carne por alguna otra práctica de las privaciones voluntarias como penitencia.

5. El tiempo para cumplir con el precepto pascual (Deber Pascual *) se extiende desde el primer domingo de Cuaresma, 5 de marzo 2017 a la solemnidad de la Santísima Trinidad, 11 de junio 2017.

*Canon 920, § 1. *Todo fiel, después de la primera comunión, esta obligado a comulgar por lo menos una vez al año.*

(Confesión Sacramental es necesario si uno es consciente de haber cometido un pecado grave)

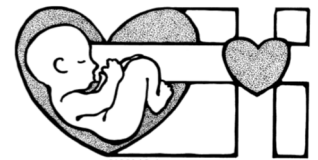
