But if we deny him he will deny us. If we are unfaithful he remains faithful, for he cannot deny himself. (2 Timothy 2:12-13)

When I was in seminary many of my classmates smoked cigarettes. The rule was that smoking was allowed only in the courtyard behind the seminary, but many ignored that rule and smoked boldly on the front steps of the seminary where visitors and undergrads would pass by. As it were, I took voice classes which were taught in the undergraduate level and many of my classmates were undergrads. They questioned me about the seminarians smoking in front of the seminary, "The seminarians are allowed to smoke? Isn't it a sin?" I was amazed at their judgment. When did smoking become a sin but the wanton promiscuous activity of many an undergrad become not a sin?

I am accustomed to visiting the City from time to time. As the years have gone by I have watched as smoking has become restricted more and more. First it was prohibited indoors. Now there are designated areas outdoors where a person can indulge in his foul habit. Public areas like parks are now non-smoking areas. Yet ironically the smoking of marijuana is being legalized in many states. Though it may be prohibited to smoke it in public, I definitely inhaled wafts of cannabis while walking through the streets of Seattle.

The Boy Scouts of America used to enjoy the right of assembly as recognized in the US Constitution, no more. Recently they exercised this right by expelling a member who entered under the false pretense that a scout was a boy when in fact "he" is a girl. Their right to assemble was violated when they were fined \$18,000 for discrimination. However many lauded this judgment.

So why is it that we have such contradictions in morality? Abortion is legal and a woman's right, while cruelty to dogs can earn you a \$1000 fine and up to 6 months in prison in New Jersey [NJ Rev. Stat. Ann. 4:22-17 & 4:22-26]. The legal sale and distribution of marijuana is becoming ever more common while smoking of tobacco has become taboo, even a sin in some people's mind. (Mind you I am no friend of tobacco either; it has killed many in my family including my dear mother.) And the right of assembly is trumped by discrimination.

It is because we have forgone any moral compass. Because of our lack of belief in God as source of absolute truth and basis of our morality, we as a society can no longer clearly measure the good or evil of an act. Unfortunately we look to a Supreme Court, our legislators, judges or even a popular vote to determine right from wrong. To add to that, most of us are not even educated in moral philosophy and theology. Does anyone know Plato and Aristotle these days? It seems we determine right or wrong on our own wits, feelings and sentiments at a particular moment in our lives.

What we need today more than ever is a moral compass. A way to help us determine what is good and holy and what is bad and evil. We must return to God upon whom we measure our moral acts. What we do and say must be measured against the moral truths revealed to us in the Bible, centuries of sound philosophy, and good ole common sense. As Christ says to us in the Gospel, "Everyone who acknowledges me before others I will acknowledge before my heavenly Father. But whoever denies me before others, I will deny before my heavenly Father" (Matthew 10:32-33). We must not deny God and the truths that he has revealed to us through Scripture and Tradition.

Each of us is a sinner to one degree or another. When we do fail and sin, we are unfaithful but not lost. God always remains faithful to us because it is his nature to be faithful and loving, for He is love. We can always repent because we trust in his forgiveness. But when we self-determine what is a sin and

what is not, then we begin to deny God and act as gods. When we say abortion is a right, a boy is a girl, and up is down, then we deny God, the Supreme Lawmaker and Creator. When we believe we can judge right from wrong outside the context of the Moral Compass, aka God, we make ourselves the lawmaker and that is a contradiction. How then can we deny our Maker and believe that we are loved, redeemed and saved? So either we recognize God as the cradle of Truth or we make ourselves into gods who judge our neighbors and ourselves according to our manmade standards. Ouch!

NOTICIAS PARA TI

Hermanos de Holy Trinity: Jesucristo cargo la Cruz por nosotros, pero no existe solamente la cruz de Cristo, existe también nuestra cruz. Entonces, ¿cuál es esta cruz? Amigo, quiero decirte dos palabras, a este propósito, con mucha claridad, como se hace entre verdaderos amigos. Tenlo presente. La cruz que no te va bien es precisamente la tuya. La cruz no es un vestido, ni un par de zapatos, que te deben venir a la medida. La cruz jamás va a la medida de tu gusto y de tus exigencias particulares. Desgarra, magulla, araña, arranca la piel, aplasta, doblega...Y, sin embargo, no hay duda. Para que sea de verdad tuya, la cruz no debe irte bien. Por cualquier lado que la mires, la cruz nunca va bien. Tampoco a Cristo le iba bien su cruz. No le fue bien la traición de Judas, el sueño de los apóstoles, la conjura de sus enemigos, la fuga de los amigos, las negociaciones de Pedro, las burlas de los soldados, el grito feroz del pueblo.

La cruz, para que lo sea, no debe irte bien. Esa cruz que te viene encima en el momento menos oportuno -una enfermedad que te pilla mientras tienes muchas cosas que hacer y que te echa por tierra un montón de proyectos -es la "tuya". Esa cruz que nunca hubieras esperado -aquel golpe cobarde que te ha venido de un amigo, aquella frase que tenía el chasquido de un latigazo, aquella calumnia que te ha dejado sin respiración- es "tu" cruz. Esa cruz que tú no habrías elegido nunca entre otras mil -"una cosa así no debía sucederme a mí"- no hay duda: es "tu" cruz. Esa cruz que te parece excesiva, disparatada, desproporcionada a tus débiles fuerzas -"es demasiado, no puedo más"- no pertenece a los otros: es la "tuya". No te hagas ilusiones. No existe una cruz a la medida. Para ser cruz tiene que estar fuera de medidas, pero Cristo nunca te dará una cruz que no puedas cargar. Intenta buscar; Registra por todas partes. Examina todo bien. Valóralo con atención. Y, si encuentras al final la cruz que te va bien, tírala. Esa, ciertamente, no es la tuya.

Las señales para reconocer si una cruz es tuya son desconcertantes: imprevisión, repugnancia, malestar, imposibilidad, inoportunidad, sentido de debilidad. Si una cruz se te presenta como antipática, desagradable, excesiva, demasiado ruda, insostenible, no dudes en cargar con ella. Te pertenece, por otra parte, no importa que no sea "tuya" en el momento de partir. Llegará a serlo durante el camino, a través de una cierta familiaridad que se establecerá entre tú y ella. Al principio se te presentará como si te fuera extraña, después descubrirás que es verdaderamente tuya. Sólo llevándola te darás cuenta de que esa cruz es "tuya". Esto no quiere decir, entiéndase bien, que las relaciones entre tú y la cruz se hagan idílicas, que todo marche bien.
