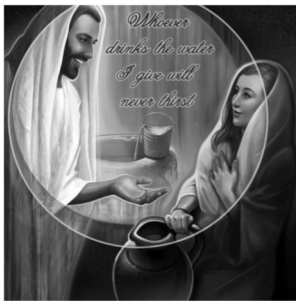

From the Catecheses of Saint John Chrysostom, bishop

Christ and Moses

The Israelites witnessed marvels; you also will witness marvels, greater and more splendid than those which accompanied them on their departure from Egypt. You did not see Pharaoh drowned with his armies, but you have seen the devil with his weapons overcome by the waters of baptism. The Israelites passed through the sea; you have passed from death to life. They were delivered from the Egyptians; you have been delivered from the powers of darkness. The Israelites were freed from slavery to a pagan people; you have been freed from the much greater slavery to sin.

Do you need another argument to show that the gifts you have received are greater than theirs? The Israelites could not look on the face of Moses in glory, though he was their fellow servant and kinsman. But you have seen the face of Christ in his glory. Paul cried out: We see the glory of the Lord with faces unveiled.

In those days Christ was present to the Israelites as he followed them, but he is present to us in a much deeper sense. The Lord was with them because of the favor he showed to Moses; now he is with us not simply because of Moses but also because of your obedience. After Egypt they dwelt in desert places; after your departure you will dwell in heaven. Their great leader and commander was Moses; we have a new Moses, God himself, as our leader and commander.

What distinguished the first Moses? Moses, Scripture tells us, was more gentle than all who dwelt upon the earth. We can rightly say the same of the new Moses, for there was with him the very Spirit of gentleness, united to him in his inmost being. In those days Moses raised his hands to heaven and brought down manna, the bread of angels; the new Moses raises his hands to heaven and gives us the food of eternal life. Moses struck the rock and brought forth streams of water; Christ touches his table, strikes the spiritual rock of the new covenant and draws forth the living water of the Spirit. This rock is like a fountain in the midst of Christ's table, so that on all sides the flocks may draw near to this living spring and refresh themselves in the waters of salvation.

Since this fountain, this source of life, this table surrounds us with untold blessings and fills us with the gifts of the Spirit, let us approach it with sincerity of heart and purity of conscience to receive grace and mercy in our time of need. Grace and mercy be yours from the only-begotten Son, our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ; through him and with him be glory, honor and power to the Father and the life-giving Spirit, now and always and for ever. Amen.

Bishop of Constantinople, Doctor of the Church (344-407)

St. John Chrysostom, born in Antioch in 344, was endowed with a superior genius strengthened by a brilliant education. In order to break with a world which admired and courted him, in 374 he retired for six years to a neighboring mountain, having found Christ through his friendship with Saint Basil. After acquiring the art of Christian silence, he returned to Antioch and there labored as a priest under the direction of its bishop. His eloquence was such that the entire city, up to a hundred thousand listeners, came to hear him, a young man not yet thirty years old. He fled this popularity and adopted the monastic life for fourteen years, until he was taken forcibly to Constantinople, to be consecrated Patriarch of the imperial city in 398.

The effect of his sermons was everywhere marvelous. He converted a large number of pagans and heretics by his eloquence, then in its most brilliant luster, and constantly exhorted his Catholic people to frequent the Holy Sacrifice. In order to remove all excuse for absence he abbreviated the long liturgy then in use. Saint Nilus relates that Saint John Chrysostom, when the priest

began the Holy Sacrifice, very often saw many of the Blessed coming down from heaven in shining garments, eyes intent, and bowed heads, in utter stillness and silence, assisting at the consummation of the tremendous mystery.

Beloved as he was in Constantinople, his denunciations of vice made him numerous enemies. In 403 these procured his banishment; and although he was almost immediately recalled, it was not more than a reprieve. In 404 he was banished to Caucasus in the deserts of the Taurus Mountains. His reply to the hostile empress was: Chrysostom fears only one thing — not exile, prison, poverty or death — but sin.

In 407, at sixty-three years old his strength was waning, but his enemies were impatient and transported him to Pytius on the Euxine, a rough journey of nearly 400 miles. He was assiduously exposed to every hardship — cold, wet clothing, and semi-starvation, but nothing could overcome his cheerfulness and his consideration for others. On the journey his sickness increased, and he was warned that his end was near. Thereupon, exchanging his travel-stained clothes for white garments, he received Viaticum, and with his customary words, Glory be to God for all things. Amen, passed to Christ. He does not have the title of martyrdom, but possesses all its merit and all its glory..

NOTICIAS PARA TI

De las catequesis de san Juan Crisóstomo, obispo

MOISÉS Y CRISTO

Los judíos pudieron contemplar milagros. Tú los verás también, y más grandes todavía, más fulgurantes que cuando los judíos salieron de Egipto. No viste al Faraón ahogado con sus ejércitos, pero has visto al demonio sumergido con los suyos. Los judíos traspasaron el mar; tú has traspasado la muerte. Ellos se liberaron de los egipcios; tú te has visto libre del maligno. Ellos escaparon de la esclavitud en un país extranjero; tú has huido de la esclavitud del pecado, mucho más penosa todavía. ¿Quieres conocer de otra manera cómo has sido honrado con mayores favores? Los judíos no pudieron, entonces, mirar de frente el rostro glorificado de Moisés, siendo así que no era más que un hombre al servicio del mismo Señor que ellos; tú, en cambio, has visto el rostro de Cristo en su gloria. Y Pablo afirma: Nosotros todos, que llevamos la cara descubierta, reflejamos la gloria del Señor.

Ellos tenían entonces a Cristo que los seguía; con mucha más razón, nos sigue él ahora. Porque, entonces, el Señor los acompañaba en atención a Moisés; a nosotros, en cambio, no nos acompaña solamente en atención a Moisés, sino también por nuestra propia docilidad. Para los judíos, después de Egipto, estaba el desierto; para ti, después del éxodo de esta vida, está el cielo. Ellos tenían, en la persona de Moisés, un guía y un jefe excelente; nosotros tenemos otro Moisés, Dios mismo, que nos guía y nos gobierna.

¿Cuál era, en efecto, la característica de Moisés? Moisés —dice la Escritura— era el hombre más sufrido del mundo. Pues bien, esta cualidad puede muy bien atribuírsele a nuestro Moisés, ya que se encuentra asistido por el dulcísimo Espíritu que le es íntimamente consubstancial. Moisés levantó, en aquel tiempo, sus manos hacia el cielo e hizo descender el pan de los ángeles, el maná; nuestro Moisés levanta hacia el cielo sus manos y nos consigue un alimento eterno. Aquél golpeó la roca e hizo correr un manantial; éste toca la mesa, golpea la mesa espiritual y hace que broten las aguas del Espíritu. Por esta razón, la mesa se halla situada en medio, como una fuente, con el fin de que los rebaños puedan, desde cualquier parte, afluir a ella y abrevarse con sus corrientes salvadoras.
