STEWARDSHIP

Last Sunday's Collection/Colecta de Domingo Pasado: \$8397.00

Tempus Fugit. Memento Mori: It has happened on more than one occasion that a parishioner dies and has not informed his next of kin of his/her wishes for a funeral. The family comes to the parish office and to the funeral director with no idea but their own of what grandma or Uncle Tito wanted. So they plan according to either what they want or to what they believed their deceased loved one wanted: "Aunt Marie would really want to be buried in that chartreuse dress with the pink hat." Or, "Grandpa was so Irish, he would definitely want "Oh! Danny Boy" sung at his funeral."

Might I suggest that you make plans for your funeral and leave them with the parish office so that when the time comes, we can assure your family of your final wishes. Some of the things that need to be planned are the wake, the funeral mass, and burial. Also it would be great if the family had some clue of what to do with your possessions.

First I recommend that you have a Health Care Surrogate and a Catholic Living Will. The former document gives someone you trust, especially if you are widowed or single, the power to make health/medical decisions for you if you become incapacitated. The latter assures that the decisions are made consistent with Catholic teachings on life and death.

Second, let your trusted friend or family know your wishes for your personal property. A Will is very important especially if you have assets: money, jewelry, house, etc. Families can get into all sorts of disputes over who has what and who has authority to make decisions. Choose your executor or executrix well.

Third, plan your funeral. Where and how long of a wake do you want? Think of the mourners in this case, not yourself. People need time to mourn and the wake gives them the opportunity to do this with friends and family offering condolences, masses, and bequests. Even the flowers give the family a sense that the deceased is loved and appreciated. It is appropriate and consoling that a eulogy be given at this time.

The funeral Mass (aka Mass of Christian Burial) is very important to the Christian. From baptism, to confirmation, to weekly Mass, and to marriage, the church has been a place where the deceased has marked the passages of his/her Christian life. It is a proper and holy thing to celebrate the Mass, reminding the mourners of the Christian experience, from new life at baptism to entrance into eternal life at death. The funeral Mass is a public liturgy in which we celebrate the Word and the Sacrament of the Eucharist. Often the mourners demand songs that are not appropriate for the liturgy even though they are decent Broadway numbers or pop hits; they have no place in the Sacred Liturgy. At present eulogies are not permitted in the Mass, and are more appropriately given at the wake or graveside. Another possibility, though discouraged, is that the eulogy be delivered in the church prior to the Mass.

Burial of the body is significant in the Christian life. In fact it is one of the corporal works of mercy. After the Mass we depart for the cemetery to lay the body on holy ground (grave or mausoleum) to await the Resurrection of the Dead. A Catholic cemetery is optimal. Your family ought to know where you want to be buried and where the *right of burial* papers are to facilitate the planning. Many have opted to make advanced plans with the funeral directors. Give these plans to your family. Some choose cremation. This is for exceptional cases. Since 1969 the Church has lifted the ban on cremation, however the remains must be laid to rest in a grave or niche at a cemetery. We will not plan a funeral Mass if there is not a proper final disposition of the remains in a cemetery.

So call Lynn Berhalter at 201-343-5170 and plan your funeral so that the day the Lord calls you home, we can help your family fulfill your wishes.

I once knew a man named Oscar.

Eight years ago I arrived at Holy Trinity Church and I met many different characters, all of whom I have come to love as my own. One among many who fascinated me is Oscar. Oscar was nearly 90 when I met him though he never revealed his age. He was very private and spoke little of himself. A quality of a very humble and unassuming Christian man.

Oscar participated in all sorts of ways that many would not notice. He served funerals Masses, a type of adult altar boy. However as his posture began to get the better of him he slowly bowed out of that selfless service. Every day Oscar would attend the 12:10 PM Mass in the chapel having set up for the Mass, being sure we had a reader and a communion minister along with his friend Walter. Every Saturday evening he would attend Mass and assist me and the other priests in distributing Holy Communion. And on Sundays, like clockwork he rang the bell at 8:45 AM sharp. He was here to help count the Sunday collection. He gathered the paperwork and shuffled off to the counting room to get ready for the others. A scrupulous and honest man, he carefully accounted for every dollar that the good parishioners gave so generously. And when we were done, he went off. "What are you doing today, Oscar?" I asked. "I'm going home and will prepare myself dinner," he said.

On Sunday, March 6, Oscar to whom one could set his watch, did not ring that bell at 8:45 AM. I knew something was wrong having not seen him at the 12:10 Mass Friday afternoon. Lynn Berhalter went to his home, but there was no answer. I called the Hackensack police to do a welfare check. They arrived hastily and sure enough they found Oscar sitting on his couch. He had passed away quietly, like he lived. Apparently he had just come home from shopping and he sat down for his eternal rest, a gentle death for a gentle-man. We will miss Oscar, the epitome of a Catholic gentleman.

Many others work in the parish to serve Jesus quietly and unassumingly. They are the many Oscars that I have come to know, love, and appreciate. May God bless you all and may we be so blessed as to serve Christ to the end as did our dear brother Oscar. Eternal rest grant unto him, O Lord....

Mensaje de Pascua 2017

Nos dirigimos rápidamente hacia la Pascua que es la fiesta de las fiestas, el día que alegra y regocija a todos los seres del cielo y de la tierra. Este tiempo de Cuaresma está pasando rápidamente y si no lo aprovechamos perderemos la oportunidad de entrar en el gozo y la alegría de la Pascua, la cual es un anticipo del Reino de los Cielos.
