## “We are an Easter People and Alleluia is our Song!”

These words of Saint Augustine ring true on this Easter Sunday! For it is on this, the holiest day for Christians, that we recall how we have become sons and daughters of God our Father. We need not live in fear, but rather as an Easter people, knowing full well that our lives have changed and that Christ will continue to change our lives until we meet Him in the glory of heaven! 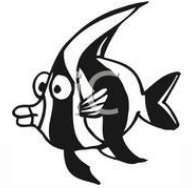
