It's mercy I desire, not sacrifice. (Matthew 9:13)

With these words of Jesus we come to understand that mercy is what trumps everything else. No matter what sacrifices we make, no matter how often we go to Mass, no matter how virtuous we are, if we do not exhibit mercy, and we fail to imitate our Lord in mercy, then all we do is in vain.

God's mercy is synonymous with his love. The 136th Psalm repeats over and over again: "His mercy endures forever," yet some translations render it as "His love endures forever." So love and mercy go hand in hand. If we say we love but fail to show mercy we are a walking contradiction. In all justice we ought to be condemned for our sins, the logical outcome of turning away from God, but in response to our waywardness God did not reject us but rather in his great mercy He came among us, like us in every way but sin. He walked the walk. He experienced the sorrows and joys of the human heart. He endured the pain and took delight in the way of our human existence. And why? Because of his great love for us.

Today is Divine Mercy Sunday in which we recall the mercy he has shown us from the cross and resurrection. Listen to the opening prayer of the Mass.

God of everlasting Mercy,
who in the very recurrence of the paschal feast
kindle the faith of the people you have made your own,
increase, we pray, the grace you have bestowed,
that all may grasp and rightly understand
in what font they have been washed,
by whose Spirit they have been reborn,
by whose Blood they have been redeemed.
Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son,
who lives and reigns with you
in the unity of the Holy Spirit,
one God forever and ever.

So in his mercy He has sparked our faith so that we can be his children, believing in the Father who created us and more wondrously redeemed us (in his mercy). We also pray to understand that it is through his mercy that we are saved in the waters of baptism, being reborn by the power of the Holy Spirit, the same Spirit that raised Jesus from the dead. It is this Spirit that raises us up from the death of sin to the life of righteousness. Finally in his great mercy and love He shed his blood on the cross by which we are redeemed. In a very simple act of love he gave himself up for us. His life in exchange for ours. The life of pure innocence for the justification of the guilty. His sacrifice is made holy because he did it with great love and mercy. If he were to simply die on the cross as an agitator or reformer, his sacrifice would have been in vain. It is his love and mercy that give credence of the cross, not the other way around; first comes love, then comes sacrifice. His sacrifice is real and meaningful because it is an act of great mercy.

NOTICIAS PARA TI

MENSAJE DEL PADRE OCTAVIO

Dentro de unos días estaremos celebrando el Domingo de la Divina Misericordia. El Papa San Juan Pablo II, en su homilía del 30 de abril de 2001, establece para toda la Iglesia Católica el Segundo Domingo como "El Domingo de la Divina Misericordia." Esta celebración está fundada en las revelaciones privadas que Cristo le quiso regalar a Santa Faustina Kowalska, una hermana religiosa de Polonia. Cuando el Papa Juan Pablo II canonizó a Sor Faustina en la homilía dijo estas palabras:

"Es importante que acogamos íntegramente el mensaje que nos trasmite la Palabra de Dios en este Segundo Domingo de Pascua, que a partir de ahora en toda la Iglesia se designará con el nombre de Domingo de la Divina Misericordia."

Para animar a los fieles a celebrar el "Domingo de la Divina Misericordia," la Iglesia otorga Indulgencias Plenarias a todos los que participen de ella devotamente y que cumplan con los requisitos para ganarlas. Pero, ¿qué son las indulgencias? La misma palabra nos puede ayudar a entender el significado de las Indulgencias. Esta palabra viene del latín "indulgeo" que significa ser indulgente y se puede traducir por "conceder." Consecuentemente, una indulgencia plenaria es un favor, un regalo, una gracia; que nos da la Iglesia. El Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica nos dice en su #1471:

"La indulgencia es la remisión ante Dios de la pena temporal por los pecados, ya perdonados, en cuanto a la culpa, que un fiel dispuesto y cumpliendo determinadas condiciones consigue por mediación de la Iglesia, la cual, como administradora de la redención, distribuye y aplica con autoridad el tesoro de las satisfacciones de Cristo y de los santos"

"Pena Temporal," según lo que nos enseña la Iglesia, es lo que queda después del pecado. En otras palabras, las consecuencias de nuestros pecados, aunque seamos perdonados, han dejado en el alma muchas cicatrices causadas por las heridas de nuestros pecados. Y según los evangelios nadie podrá entrar al Banquete Eterno sin el traje de fiesta. También, nos dice "Bienaventurados los limpios de corazón, porque ellos verán a Dios." Y por esta razón, nosotros los cristianos creemos verdaderamente en el Purgatorio.

Nuestro Señor Jesucristo en una de sus apariciones le dijo a Sor Faustina:

"Deseo que la Fiesta de la Misericordia sea refugio y amparo para todas las almas y, especialmente, para los pobres pecadores... El alma que se confiese y reciba la Santa Comunión obtendrá el perdón total de las culpas y de las penas... Que ningún alma tema acercarse a mí, aunque sus pecados sean como escarlata"

El año 2002, estas palabras reveladas por Cristo a Sor Faustina se hicieron "Oficiales" cuando por mandato de San Juan Pablo II, el Vaticano hizo público el decreto sobre las indulgencias que se pueden recibir el Domingo de la Divina Misericordia. También, estas indulgencias las pueden recibir los enfermos y los que se encuentran navegando en alta mar.

La segunda semana de pascua, que este año la celebraremos el 23 de mayo, se nos concederá a todos, la posibilidad de ganar las indulgencias plenarias; con los requisitos que normalmente se pide a los fieles que son: la confesión sacramental, la comunión eucarística y la oración por las intenciones del Santo Padre. También, participar de los actos de piedad que se realicen en honor a la Divina Misericordia, rezando la coronilla. Si asisten a la misa dominical, sabemos que proclamarán su fe y rezarán el Padre Nuestro, que también son requisitos para ganar una indulgencia plenaria.

Aprovechemos este tiempo de gracia para volver a la fuente de la misericordia que nunca se cansa de nosotros, aunque nosotros nos cansemos de volver a ella. El Señor siempre nos esperará con los brazos abiertos.
