"He then took up a collection among all his soldiers, which he sent to Jerusalem to provide for an expiatory sacrifice. In doing this he acted in a very excellent and noble way, inasmuch as he had the resurrection of the dead in view; for if he were not expecting the fallen to rise again, it would have been useless and foolish to pray for them in death. But if he did this with a view to the splendid reward that awaits those who had gone to rest in godliness, it was a holy and pious thought. Thus he made atonement for the dead that they might be freed from this sin" (2 Maccabees 12:43-46).

June 1

We'll be accepting Mass Intentions for 2018 beginning **June 1, 2017** at the rectory. Intentions may be offered for the dead to gain indulgences. You may offer Mass for deceased individuals or for families. **No more than 3 Sunday Masses can be offered at this time. After July 1 you may offer more weekend Masses if they're available.** Intentions for Mass may also be offered for the living. One does not offer Mass for saints or the Blessed Mother since they are already in heaven.

Jesus said to his disciples:

"If you love me, you will keep my commandments. And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate to be with you always, the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot accept, because it neither sees nor knows him.

Years ago I taught at La Salle Military Academy. One of my best and friendliest students was Amin, the son of an Italian woman and Egyptian father. He was raised Muslim. We would often have nice conversations about religion. What interested me most were what Muslims believe about Jesus and the Virgin Mary. It never ceases to amaze me that I have found Islam to be a cult composed of heretical thought of Christians (Arians, Syrian Gnostics), apocryphal gospels, partial stories from the Old Testament, a splattering of paganism and Muhammed's desire to conquer and unite Arabia.

First point: Islam teaches that Jesus never died on the cross. In their belief system they cannot comprehend the idea that Allah would allow a great prophet like Jesus to suffer such a horrid death. Some believe that as Jesus was carrying the cross and Simon took it from him, it was ultimately Simon who was crucified. (This story is similar to an ancient Syrian gnostic story.) Others believe that Jesus was replaced by Pilate though these switches were hidden from the crowd. In the end they do not accept that Jesus died on the cross. It says in the Quran: "That they said, 'We killed Christ Jesus the son of Mary, the Messenger of Allah'; but they killed him not, nor crucified him, but so it was made to appear to them, and those who differ therein are full of doubts, with no knowledge, but only conjecture to follow, for of a surety they killed him not: Nay, Allah raised him up unto Himself" (Surah 4:157-158). They do not believe that God redeemed us sinners by his own sacrifice.

Second point: Islam teaches that Mary did conceive Jesus as a virgin and that the angel announced that she is the greatest among all women, but the child was not the Son of God. The point of the story of Mary in the Quran is to state erroneously, that Jesus is not the Son of God. It says: "Whereby the heavens are almost torn, and the earth is split asunder, and the mountains fall in ruins, that they ascribe a son to the Most Beneficent (Allah). But it is not suitable for the Most Beneficent (Allah) that He should beget a son" (Surah Maryam 90-29, Quran).

Third point: The Islam religion teaches that the Advocate whom Jesus would send to reveal all things is not the Holy Spirit

but rather Muhammed (Surah 61:6). My old student pointed out that the Apostles misunderstood Jesus, and so the Christian religion was based not on Jesus' teachings but rather on the teachings of St. Paul and Constantine, the emperor who converted the Roman Empire and called for the first ecumenical council in 325 in which the bishops clarified and defined the divine nature of Jesus in apposition to Arius who denied the divinity of Jesus Christ.

Six hundred years after Christ, three hundred years after the legalization of Christianity, Muhammed a businessman from Arabia rewrote biblical revelation to show that Ishmael, son of Abraham and father of the Arabs, was the child Abraham offered in sacrifice and not Isaac as the Bible depicts. He claimed the Apostles misunderstood Jesus while he is the one who misinterpreted the message of Christ Jesus. He confused the writings of the Gospels and ultimately ignored the Holy Spirit's activity in the Church to whom the Holy Spirit, the Advocate, revealed all truth necessary for the salvation of souls.

TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

En Uruguay se celebra la fiesta patronal más grande durante el mes de junio. Celebran a san Cono, un santo italiano del siglo doce. En el siglo diecinueve los inmigrantes italianos que vivían en Uruguay deseaban tener una capilla para honrar la memoria de este santo, oriundo de la provincia de Salerno, Italia. En junio de 1885, las campanas de una modesta capillita anunciaron el recibimiento de una imagen de san Cono que llegó en procesión. Desde entonces esta costumbre italiana se fue haciendo parte integral de la devoción cristiana en Uruguay. Cono fue el hijo único de una pareja anciana que vivía en la ciudad de Teggiano, Salerno. Según la leyenda, una noche mientras dormían, esta pareja soñó un cono de luz que brotaba de la madre. Al nacer el niño decidieron llamarlo Cono. Desde muy niño, Cono mostró un afán por las cosas de Dios y a los dieciséis años ingresó a un monasterio benedictino siguiendo el consejo de una voz interior que lo invitaba a consagrarse al Señor. A los dieciocho, su monasterio se llenó de luz y una voz anunció su muerte, y al día siguiente falleció.
