 Baptism**

1275 Christian initiation is accomplished by three sacraments together: Baptism which is the beginning of new life; Confirmation which is its strengthening; and the Eucharist which nourishes the disciple with Christ's Body and Blood for his transformation in Christ.

1276 "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you" (Mt 28:19-20).

1277 Baptism is birth into the new life in Christ. In accordance with the Lord's will, it is necessary for salvation, as is the Church herself, which we enter by Baptism.

There are four types of Christians: the Martyrs, the Confessors, the Lukewarm, and the Deniers. Of these four, two make it to heaven yet all have the possibility of making it to heaven by the grace of God.

The martyr is one who has given his life as a witness to the faith. The word martyr comes from the Greek for witness. It is the martyr who has given witness to the faith by the shedding of his blood. In Matthew's Gospel we hear: "Brother will betray brother to death, and a father his child; and children will rise up against parents and cause them to be put to death" (10:21), and again "Then they will deliver you to tribulation, and will kill you, and you will be hated by all nations because of My name" (24:9). And in today's Gospel Jesus declares, "Do not fear those who kill the body but are unable to kill the soul; but rather fear Him who is able to destroy both soul and body in hell" (Mt 10:28). Examples of the martyrs are the apostles, St. Philomena, St. Thomas More and more recently our Christian brothers and sisters being killed by ISIS and other Islamic extremists. There are also those who are known as white martyrs, that is, they suffered dearly for their faith in Jesus, but did not die. Perhaps they endured torture or imprisonment. Bishop Walsh of the Maryknoll Fathers lingered in prison in Red China for 12 years. He was denied even his Rosary beads.

The second type of Christian is the confessor. He or she is the one who has not died for the faith but has borne witness to the Catholic faith by his life. In a world that is against the Christian message of hope, forgiveness and love of neighbor, you and I must live as instruments of Christ's teachings and as Christ to others whose only exposure to the Gospel is what they see in you and me. Teachers bring the message to the next generation (e.g. The Sisters of Charity, catechists), health workers are the healing hands of Jesus, and parents are the first teachers of the faith to their children and the most important example to them of what it means to confess the faith in what we say and do. The notable confessors of the faith are the clergy led by their bishops and the Pope, the catechists and the theologians who confront heresy (e.g. St. Thomas Aquinas, St. Augustine), and the Christians leaders who employ the right judgment, prudence and other virtues to administer their God-given authority, like St. Louis of France and St. Margaret of Scotland.

The other Christian is the denier. The denier knows he is a Christian and believes in Jesus, but lives in fear rather than in hope. Out of fear, the denier will waiver when his faith is challenged. He or she is more concerned about the importance of this life over eternal life. He wants to please others at the detriment of pleasing God. Out of fear of death, persecution, hardship, loss of friendship and ostracization he denies Jesus so as to live and live more comfortably. Christ emphatically said, "Whoever denies me before others, I will deny before my heavenly Father" (MT 10:33) and elsewhere, "If anyone wishes to come after me, he must deny himself, and take up his cross and follow Me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it; but whoever loses his life for my sake will find it." And this is where our hope lies. We can choose to reject the fear and take up the cross. St. Peter himself denied Jesus out of fear of persecution but he recognized Jesus' love and forgiveness and was able to put aside his fears and lose his life so that he can find it anew in Jesus. On the other hand Judas Iscariot betrayed Jesus but could not accept forgiveness and so he despaired, hung himself and suffered the consequences. Look to the words from the Book of Revelation and be courageous: "Do not fear what you are about to suffer. Behold, the devil is about to cast some of you into prison, so that you will be tested, and you will have tribulation for ten days. Be faithful until death, and I will give you the crown of life" (2:10).

Then there are the lukewarm. "So because you are lukewarm, and neither hot nor cold, I will spit you out of my mouth" (Rev 3:16). Jesus speaks with tough love to those who are neither convicted nor against the faith. He sees that these people are most dangerous to the Gospel message. They will speak of forgiveness but not forgive. They will be godfather to a child but dare not oppose the child or correct the child when he fails to live up to the norms of the Catholic teachings.

In the Catholic struggle for freedom in Mexico, the child martyr, St. José Luis Sanchez was taken by the Masons who imposed anticlerical laws. His godfather, the mayor of the town was a lukewarm Catholic. To save the boy he encouraged Jose to deny his faith in Jesus rather than encourage him to give his life for Christ. We all can easily fall into the lukewarm category if we are not careful to guard our faith in Jesus. Faith is precious and must be real and practiced daily. Like a weightlifter who must lift daily to stay toned, we must strengthen the muscle of faith each day or it will atrophy.

We must not be ashamed to bear witness to Christ in all we say and do. Each day we must trust in Jesus so that we will not fear to confess our faith in Jesus. And finally we must fear & respect only God; man can kill the body, but it is God who is our judge and can condemn the denier, the one who out of fear or respect of other people, denies Jesus.

IS YOUR MARRIAGE A VALID SACRAMENT?

If you were married civilly, that is not in the Catholic Church before a priest or deacon, it is not a valid sacramental marriage. This is an impediment to receiving the Eucharist and other sacraments. Some couples believe that a marriage before a Justice of the Peace or a non-Catholic minister is valid. For a marriage to be valid in the Catholic Church, the marriage must be in a Catholic Church or Chapel and officiated by an authorized Catholic priest or deacon along with 2 witnesses. (There are limited interfaith exceptions with proper permission.)

I invite you to speak with one of our priests if there are any questions or if indeed you wish to validate your marriage. The process can be very simple and your marriage will now be blessed by the Church. Once the Marriage is convalidated, that is blessed in the Church, you will be able to receive the Eucharist, make Sacramental Confession, and receive the other sacraments.

Ingresó a la Orden de los hermanos menores (franciscanos) a los dieciséis años y con el tiempo, llegó a ser profesor de filosofía, pero su verdadero deseo era ser misionero en el continente americano, lo que hoy conocemos como Hemisferio Occidental.

En 1749, su orden religiosa lo envió a México como administrador del Colegio Apostólico. Poco a poco se fue desprendiendo de sus cargos académicos para establecer misiones entre los indígenas. Aunque algunos afirman lo contrario, Junípero fue arduo defensor de los nativos. En California, más de una vez tuvo problemas con los soldados españoles, debido a que éstos abusaban de los amerindios, problemas que lo llevaron a defender los derechos humanos de los nativos ante el Virrey en México. Sus esfuerzos por cristianizar los indígenas de California tuvieron como resultado más de 6000 bautizos durante sus quince años en esa región.
