The Seven Sacraments: Life with Christ Confirmation

1315 "Now when the apostles at Jerusalem heard that Samaria had received the word of God, they sent to them Peter and John, who came down and prayed for them that they might receive the Holy Spirit; for it had not yet fallen on any of them, but they had only been baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus. Then they laid their hands on them and they received the Holy Spirit" (Acts 8:14-17).

1316 Confirmation perfects Baptismal grace; it is the sacrament which gives the Holy Spirit in order to root us more deeply in the divine filiation, incorporate us more firmly into Christ, strengthen our bond with the Church, associate us more closely with her mission, and help us bear witness to the Christian faith in words accompanied by deeds.

1317 Confirmation, like Baptism, imprints a spiritual mark or indelible character on the Christian's soul; for this reason one can receive this sacrament only once in one's life.

Old-Fashioned, is that bad thing?

Recently I was at a friend's home down the shore. She related a conversation she had with her niece. "Aunt when you come to San Francisco, why don't you stay a week?"

I can't," said her aunt. "I really have to get back home."

"Aunt Sandy, don't you want to know my children?" she questioned.

"Are you pregnant?" her aunt retorted.

"No."

"Are you getting married?"

"No, Aunt Sandy, you're so old-fashioned."

Wow! When did marriage become old-fashioned? And what does that mean anyway. I know clothes styles change. Haircuts go out of vogue. And the language evolves. But ancient institutions like marriage go out of fashion? How can this be or is it that the perceptions of people change and not the institutions.

Blessed Margaret of Costello was a humble woman from the middle-ages. When she joined the convent, she was very happy. One of the rules of the convent was silence in the halls. Mind you, Margaret was blind, and one day as she passed through the halls she heard the other nuns gossiping. She corrected them, "Sisters talking in the hall is prohibited."

"Oh, Margaret, you're so old-fashioned,," they scornfully responded. Imagine, someone from the 12th century was calling someone else old-fashioned. Then they tossed her out.

Some things about marriage become old-fashioned, like the age of marriage. At one time marrying at 15 was ordinary, but today it is unacceptable in many parts and even illegal. The size of a family changes with society, times, economics and the like, but a family is still, by most, accepted as a home with parents and their offspring and an openness to new life regardless of the number.

Marriage is a primordial institution. From the dawn of man, men and women came together to reproduce, from the basic unit of society, and usually for the whole of life. Only as time went on did marriage develop more and more into what we know it to be. However along the way novelties have come and gone; that is, become old-fashioned. Polygamy is old-fashioned. Concubines and mistresses are old-fashioned. All these attacks against and contortions of marriage are not new. Men "enjoying the company of men" while leaving their wives at home was a common practice in ancient Greece. How old-fashioned is that? Moses allowed divorce because of man's stubbornness. That makes divorce very old-fashioned. Today multiple marriages are more common. Some Mormons secretly practice polygamy. Moslems allow it. Polygamy is old-fashioned yet it is practiced today in many different forms. However, Christ said one man and one woman as it was intended from the beginning. Monogamy however ancient is also quite new once Christ raised marriage to the dignity of a Sacrament.

Marriage has been under attack for years. Contraception was introduced as normative in the early 20th Century. Now Western civilization is dying by attrition. I was at the Bergen Irish Festival last month and it dawned on me that in a few years there will be no more Irish festivals, or Italian ones. Those of us who are the fruit of fecund marriages of the early 20th century are now opting for larger houses, grander cars, and an iPhone for everyone rather than a house filled with the joy of children and the hope of future generations to carry on our traditions and faith. The idea that two men can marry or two women is antithetical to

what marriage is. How can man redefine what has been known forever, instituted by divine law, and raised to a Sacrament by Christ? Can this divine institution be contorted and dismantled merely by the will of some men in robes and the roar of the people?

Perhaps heterosexual monogamous marriage is old-fashioned, but it never grows old. The home is the domestic church, the basic cog of a civilized society where future generations are nourished. The Church sees in the family the hope of a faith renewed and transmitted through the centuries until we meet Christ and become one with him in bond so tight it can never become undone. Christian marriage signifies this bond of love; may it be honored and revered no matter how "old-fashioned" it may be.

IS YOUR MARRIAGE A VALID SACRAMENT?

If you were married civilly, that is not in the Catholic Church before a priest or deacon, it is not a valid sacramental marriage. This is an impediment to receiving the Eucharist and other sacraments. For a marriage to be valid in the Catholic Church, the marriage must be in a Catholic Church or Chapel and officiated by an authorized Catholic priest or deacon along with 2 witnesses. (There are limited interfaith exceptions with proper permission.)

I invite you to speak with one of our priests if there are

any questions or if indeed you wish to validate your marriage. The process can be very simple and your marriage will now be blessed by the Church. Once the Marriage is convalidated, that is blessed in the Church, you will be able to receive the Eucharist, make Sacramental Confession, and receive the other sacraments.

St. Frances Xavier Cabrini, M.S.C. (July 15, 1850 – December 22, 1917), also called Mother Cabrini, founded the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, a major support to the Italian immigrants to the US. She was the first naturalized citizen of the US to be canonized on July 7, 1946.

Cabrini arrived in New York City on March 31, 1889, along with six other sisters. She encountered disappointment and difficulties at every step. She obtained the permission of Archbishop Corrigan to found an orphanage, which is located in West Park, New York today and is known as Saint Cabrini Home.

Cabrini organized catechism and education classes for the Italian immigrants (including St. Anthony's in Silver Lake, Belleville). She established schools and orphanages despite tremendous odds. In New York City, she founded Columbus Hospital and Italian Hospital. In the 1980s, they were merged into Cabrini Medical Center.

In 1933, her remains were moved to the chapel of Mother Cabrini High School. Following her canonization, a new shrine was built in 1957 on the school grounds. The major portion of her body is now enshrined under glass in the altar of the shrine. Today, the Shrine continues as a center of welcome for new immigrants and pilgrims of many nationalities who come to pray and reflect. The street to the west of the shrine was renamed Cabrini Boulevard in her honor.
