The Seven Sacraments: Life with Christ Eucharist

1406 Jesus said: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; if any one eats of this bread, he will live for ever; . . . he who eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life and . . . abides in me, and I in him" (Jn 6:51, 54, 56).
 1407 The Eucharist is the heart and the summit of the Church's life, for in it Christ associates his Church and all her members with his sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving offered once for all on the cross to his Father; by this sacrifice he pours out the graces of salvation on his Body which is the Church.
 1408 The Eucharistic celebration always includes: the proclamation of the Word of God; thanksgiving to God the Father for all his benefits, above all the gift of his Son; the consecration of bread and wine; and participation in the liturgical banquet by receiving the Lord's body and blood. These elements constitute one single act of worship.
 1409 The Eucharist is the memorial of Christ's Passover, that is, of the work of salvation accomplished by the life, death, and resurrection of Christ, a work made present by the liturgical action (the Mass).

Well, it's been one of those weeks. I've been pulled in every direction so I share with you this homily written on the Gospel according to Matthew by Saint John Chrysostom (A.D. 349-407), bishop. This homily appeared in the Office of Readings on July 25, the feast of St. James the Greater

Sharers in the suffering of Christ

The sons of Zebedee press Christ: *Promise that one may sit at your right side and the other at your left.* What does he do? He wants to show them that it is not a spiritual gift for which they are asking, and that if they knew what their request involved, they would never dare make it. So he says: *You do not know what you are asking*, that is, what a great and splendid thing it is and how much beyond the reach even of the heavenly powers. Then he continues: *Can you drink the cup which I must drink and be baptized with the baptism which I must undergo?* He is saying: "You talk of sharing honors and rewards with me, but I must talk of struggle and toil. Now is not the time for rewards or the time for my glory to be revealed. Earthly life is the time for bloodshed, war and danger."

Consider how by his manner of questioning he exhorts and draws them. He does not say: "Can you face being slaughtered? Can you shed your blood?" How does he put his question? *Can you drink the cup?* Then he makes it attractive by adding: *which I must drink*, so that the prospect of sharing it with him may make them more eager. He also calls his suffering a baptism, to show that it will effect a great cleansing of the entire world. The disciples answer him: *We can!* Fervor makes them answer promptly, though they really do not know what they are saying but still think they will receive what they ask for.

How does Christ reply? *You will indeed drink my cup and be baptized with my baptism.* He is really prophesying a great blessing for them, since he is telling them: You will be found worthy of martyrdom; you will suffer what I suffer and end your life with a violent death, thus sharing all with me. *But seats at my right and left are not mine to give; they belong to those for whom the Father has prepared them.* Thus, after lifting their minds to higher goals and preparing them to meet and overcome all that will make them desolate, he sets them straight on their request.

Then the other ten became angry at the two brothers. See how imperfect they all are: the two who tried to get ahead of the other ten, and the ten who were jealous of the two! But, as I said

before, show them to me at a later date in their lives, and you will see that all these impulses and feelings have disappeared. Read how John, the very man who here asks for the first place, will always yield to Peter when it comes to preaching and performing miracles in the Acts of the Apostles. James, for his part, was not to live very much longer; for from the beginning he was inspired by great fervor and, setting aside all purely human goals, rose to such splendid heights that he straightway suffered martyrdom.

IS YOUR MARRIAGE A VALID SACRAMENT?

If you were married civilly, that is not in the Catholic Church before a priest or deacon, it is not a valid sacramental marriage. This is an impediment to receiving the Eucharist and other sacraments. For a marriage to be valid in the Catholic Church, the marriage must be in a Catholic Church or Chapel and officiated by an authorized Catholic priest or deacon along with 2 witnesses. (There are limited interfaith exceptions with proper permission.)

I invite you to speak with one of our priests if there are any questions or if indeed you wish to validate your marriage. The process can be very simple and your marriage will now be blessed by the Church. Once the Marriage is convalidated, that is blessed in the Church, you will be able to receive the Eucharist, make Sacramental Confession, and receive the other sacraments.

Grief to Grace will help you identify the ways that past abuse may still impact your spirit as you enter into powerful meditations and reflections that allow your body and mind to be transformed into a new way to trust and appreciate your unique gifts, courage, creativity, and authentic yearning for connection and a supportive community. St. Frances Xavier Cabrini, M.S.C. (July 15, 1850 – December 22, 1917), also called Mother Cabrini, founded the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, a major support to the Italian immigrants to the US. She was the first naturalized citizen of the US to be canonized on July 7, 1946.

Cabrini arrived in New York City on March 31, 1889, along with six other sisters. She encountered disappointment and difficulties at every step. She obtained the permission of Archbishop Corrigan to found an orphanage, which is located in West Park, New York today and is known as Saint Cabrini Home.

Cabrini organized catechism and education classes for the Italian immigrants (including St. Anthony's in Silver Lake, Belleville). She established schools and orphanages despite tremendous odds. In New York City, she founded Columbus Hospital and Italian Hospital. In the 1980s, they were merged into Cabrini Medical Center.

In 1933, her remains were moved to the chapel of Mother Cabrini High School. Following her canonization, a new shrine was built in 1957 on the school grounds. The major portion of her body is now enshrined under glass in the altar of the shrine. Today, the Shrine continues as a center of welcome for new immigrants and pilgrims of many nationalities who come to pray and reflect. The street to the west of the shrine was re-named Cabrini Boulevard in her honor.

ESCUCHA TUS SUEÑOS

Dios visita a Salomón en un sueño, ¡y el relato bíblico no dice en ninguna parte que Salomón se despertó para tener esta conversación con Dios! Así, todavía en su sueño, Salomón responde a la pregunta de Dios sobre lo que más desea, y Dios le concede en abundancia su pedido de tener sabiduría.

En nuestras horas de vigilia, estamos muy distraídos con el trabajo, la casa, la familia, el tráfico, la diversión y muchas preocupaciones. 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TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

Esta semana celebramos la fiesta de la Virgen de Copacabana. Copacabana es la capital de Manco Cápac, Bolivia. En dicho lugar, un descendiente de los reyes incas, Francisco Tito Yupanqui buscó esculpir una imagen de la Candelaria. Su primera imagen fue colocada en la iglesia por su párroco, pero llegó un nuevo párroco quien la sacó del templo por tosca y fea. El pobre de Tito viajó a Potosí, Bolivia, donde emprendió cursos de escultura. Con el tiempo esculpió otra imagen de la Candelaria. Esta vez estudió varias imágenes de María y mandó ofrecer una Misa a la Santísima Trinidad pidiéndole la inspiración necesaria para esculpir una imagen digna de la Virgen. Los años de práctica en su arte, unidos a su devoción, le ayudaron a esculpir una imagen fina y bella que en 1583 fue colocada en su propio santuario.

La Virgen de Copacabana tiene uno de los primeros santuarios marianos en América Latina. Curiosamente, se celebra el 5 de agosto, día que María hizo nevar en la antigua ciudad de Roma, Italia, para mostrar dónde deseaba tener su primer templo.

Los Siete Sacramentos: Vida con Cristo Eucaristía

1406 Jesús dijo: "Yo soy el pan vivo, bajado del cielo. Si uno come de este pan, vivirá para siempre [...] El que come mi Carne y bebe mi Sangre, tiene vida eterna [...] permanece en mí y yo en él" (Jn 6, 51.54.56).

1407 La Eucaristía es el corazón y la cumbre de la vida de la Iglesia, pues en ella Cristo asocia su Iglesia y todos sus miembros a su sacrificio de alabanza y acción de gracias ofrecido una vez por todas en la cruz a su Padre; por medio de este sacrificio derrama las gracias de la salvación sobre su Cuerpo, que es la Iglesia.

1408 La celebración eucarística comprende siempre: la proclamación de la Palabra de Dios, la acción de gracias a Dios Padre por todos sus beneficios, sobre todo por el don de su Hijo, la consagración del pan y del vino y la participación en el banquete litúrgico por la recepción del Cuerpo y de la Sangre del Señor: estos elementos constituyen un solo y mismo acto de culto.
