The Seven Sacraments: Life with Christ

Eucharist

1414 As sacrifice, the Eucharist is also offered in reparation for the sins of the living and the dead and to obtain spiritual or temporal benefits from God.

1415 Anyone who desires to receive Christ in Eucharistic communion must be in the state of grace. Anyone aware of having sinned mortally must not receive communion without having received absolution in the sacrament of penance.

1416 Communion with the Body and Blood of Christ increases the communicant's union with the Lord, forgives his venial sins, and preserves him from grave sins. Since receiving this sacrament strengthens the bonds of charity between the communicant and Christ, it also reinforces the unity of the Church as the Mystical Body of Christ.

1417 The Church warmly recommends that the faithful receive Holy Communion each time they participate in the celebration of the Eucharist; she obliges them to do so at least once a year.

1418 Because Christ himself is present in the sacrament of the altar, he is to be honored with the worship of adoration. "To visit the Blessed Sacrament is . . . a proof of gratitude, an expression of love, and a duty of adoration toward Christ our Lord" (Paul VI, MF 66).

1419 Having passed from this world to the Father, Christ gives us in the Eucharist the pledge of glory with him. Participation in the Holy Sacrifice identifies us with his Heart, sustains our strength along the pilgrimage of this life, makes us long for eternal life, and unites us even now to the Church in heaven, the Blessed Virgin Mary, and all the saints.

This past week I had lunch with a lovely lady from Peru. She came to the country and worked very hard to learn English, get a job, get married and raise a daughter. She brought the girl up in the faith. Church every Sunday and teaching her the prayers. Her daughter is now grown. She lives alone in the city with her dog who has health insurance. Only one thing, she does not go to Mass. Her mother is perplexed. Why not? The girl was brought up in the faith and she hoped to impart her values on her daughter. It seems to have been a failure.

I said half-jokingly, "You did one thing wrong. You let her watch TV." What I am getting at is that the milieu that she had been immersed in from a very young age was one of television and Hollywood. The entertainment world I contend has been brainwashing the youth since about the mid-70's. Everything we had known to be good and true has been assaulted by the media. "Why do we need a paper to say we love each other?" Michael Stivik barked to Archie Bunker about marriage. Three's Company implied that people of the opposite sex living together is acceptable. Prior to the 70's father knew best, but by the 80's fathers were depicted as incompetent, dopey, stupid, and often absent. Friends were a group of adults who didn't want to grow up and were involved in many "different" relationships all projected as good, normal, and healthy. Suicide is often glorified in films. Even a film I enjoy greatly, Fight Club, ends with a downer presenting suicide as a legitimate escape from problems. I can go on and on.

But it is clear that the children learned more from the entertainment media than any parent could teach. Even if you were the best parents, the child still grew up surrounded by thoughts, mores, and propaganda contrary to centuries of knowledge and revelation. Prior to this turn in culture which came to fruition in the 70s, marriage was good, abortion was evil, homosexuality was considered disordered behavior, and going to church on Sundays was the norm. Today, abortion is a right, marriage is optional, sexuality is confused, and church is for the old ladies and "those religious" ethnic groups. It's difficult to beat the system. Just as racism is systemic, which means people and culture can be racist without realizing it, so too people and culture can be evil or at least contrary to sound thinking and solid ethics. The days when everyone generally knew what was right and wrong and agreed upon it are far away. Now what is right and wrong is arbitrary and left to the individual conscience or the ruling of a court, not the Judeo-Christian tradition that has formed a civilized world for centuries. When we no longer look to God and revelation as the sources of truth and consider man to be the ultimate arbitrator of truth we collapse: the family, the country, the world.

My brothers and sisters, we must give ourselves over to Christ and the Christian way or otherwise we will go down. We cannot love both God and mammon. Either we will love Christ and hate the evil one, or love the evil one and hate Christ. As St. Peter called on Christ when he doubted, likewise we must say loud and clearly, "Lord, save me."

IS YOUR MARRIAGE A VALID SACRAMENT?

If you were married civilly, that is not in the Catholic Church before a priest or deacon, it is not a valid sacramental marriage. This is an impediment to receiving the Eucharist and other sacraments. For a marriage to be valid in the Catholic Church, the marriage must be in a Catholic Church or Chapel and officiated by an authorized Catholic priest or deacon along with 2 witnesses. (There are limited interfaith exceptions with proper permission.)

I invite you to speak with one of our priests if there are any questions or if indeed you wish to validate your marriage. The process can be very simple and your marriage will now be blessed by the Church. Once the Marriage is validated, that is blessed in the Church, you will be able to receive the Eucharist, make Sacramental Confession, and receive the other sacraments.



How to Report Abuse



NADA QUE TEMER

A un rabino le preguntaron por qué Dios envía pruebas y tribulaciones a los humanos. "Porque Dios siente la ausencia de su pueblo", fue la respuesta. Hay ecos de esta sabiduría en el Evangelio de hoy, cuando Jesús hace que sus discípulos se suban a la barca sin él y se va por su cuenta mientras ellos se aventuran en aguas turbulentas. Por cierto, ni judíos ni cristianos creen que el Todopoderoso hace este tipo de jugadas antojadizas con ellos, pero tiene algo de verdad la afirmación de que no acudimos a Dios pidiendo que nos salve sino cuando estamos en un apuro. Hoy el papel de Pedro, como aparece en todo el Nuevo Testamento, es ser un signo o representación de cada miembro de la Iglesia y de toda la Iglesia. 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Los Siete Sacramentos: Vida con Cristo Eucaristía

1414 En cuanto sacrificio, la Eucaristía es ofrecida también en reparación de los pecados de los vivos y los difuntos, y para obtener de Dios beneficios espirituales o temporales.

1415 El que quiere recibir a Cristo en la Comunión eucarística debe hallarse en estado de gracia. Si uno tiene conciencia de haber pecado mortalmente no debe acercarse a la Eucaristía sin haber recibido previamente la absolución en el sacramento de la Penitencia.

1416 La Sagrada Comunión del Cuerpo y de la Sangre de Cristo acrecienta la unión del comulgante con el Señor, le perdona los pecados veniales y lo preserva de pecados graves. Puesto que los lazos de caridad entre el comulgante y Cristo son reforzados, la recepción de este sacramento fortalece la unidad de la Iglesia, Cuerpo místico de Cristo.

1417 La Iglesia recomienda vivamente a los fieles que reciban la sagrada comunión cuando participan en la celebración de la Eucaristía; y les impone la obligación de hacerlo al menos una vez al año.

1418 Puesto que Cristo mismo está presente en el Sacramento del Altar es preciso honrarlo con culto de adoración. "La visita al Santísimo Sacramento es una prueba de gratitud, un signo de amor y un deber de adoración hacia Cristo, nuestro Señor" (MF).

1419 Cristo, que pasó de este mundo al Padre, nos da en la Eucaristía la prenda de la gloria que tendremos junto a Él: la participación en el Santo Sacrificio nos identifica con su Corazón, sostiene nuestras fuerzas a lo largo del peregrinar de esta vida, nos hace desear la Vida eterna y nos une ya desde ahora a la Iglesia del cielo, a la Santa Virgen María y a todos los santos.
