**The Seven Sacraments: Life with Christ
Penance & Reconciliation**

1485 "On the evening of that day, the first day of the week," Jesus showed himself to his apostles. "He breathed on them, and said to them: 'Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained'" (Jn 20:19, 22-23).

1486 The forgiveness of sins committed after Baptism is conferred by a particular sacrament called the sacrament of conversion, confession, penance, or reconciliation.

1487 The sinner wounds God's honor and love, his own human dignity as a man called to be a son of God, and the spiritual well-being of the Church, of which each Christian ought to be a living stone.

1488 To the eyes of faith no evil is graver than sin and nothing has worse consequences for sinners themselves, for the Church, and for the whole world.

1489 To return to communion with God after having lost it through sin is a process born of the grace of God who is rich in mercy and solicitous for the salvation of men. One must ask for this precious gift for oneself and for others.

100 years ago, Our Lady appeared to three meek shepherd children in a small town of Fatima. Ever since the Lord bestowed the singular grace of the immaculate conception upon Mary, a virgin from Galilee; we had been given a gift that is beyond price. The Mother of God is now our Mother. She who was without sin did not suffer the ravages of sin, which is death, but rather was taken up to heaven, body and soul, upon the completion of her earthly life.

And from her throne in heaven she has interceded on our behalf for centuries. She has even visited us on many occasions. Fatima is the last of her many visitations to be confirmed by the Church. At Fatima her message was two-fold: Pray the rosary for peace and make reparation for sinners, and repent and abandon sin.



Her message from 100 years past, was as pertinent then as it is today. In 1917, the world was at war and soon after even a greater war would engulf the whole globe. Today we are in danger of an atomic war. Also, the new modern age ushered in new liberal attitudes that questioned and even ridiculed the traditional values of family life, the gift of children, the sacredness of conjugal love, the dignity of the human person.

Today those modern “values” are now held as superior to the Catholic and traditional values we hold so dear. Those who support the sanctity of life are called radicals; those who have more than two children are accused of overpopulating the world and enlarging their carbon-footprint on the planet; and those who manipulate human DNA to produce the perfect baby (eugenics), the Superman, are hailed as heroes.

Today more than ever we must pray asking our heavenly Mother to intercede on the behalf of our wayward brothers and sisters. We must do reparation for their sins as well as our own, and above all as an image of Christ on this earth we must abandon sin. Our Lady at Fatima warned that more go to hell because of sins of the flesh than all others. Today the flesh is glorified even deified to the point that many worship the body and no longer worship the God who created it. As St. Paul said this only leads to unnatural sexual acts and the degradation of the very body (see Romans 1) they adore. True worship of God exalts the dignity of the human person and the sacredness of the sexual act.



So let's pray fervently and do reparation for sin with our prayers, especially the Rosary, and our good deeds; keeping true to our religion and faithful to our God in whom we place all our trust. Queen of Heaven, pray for us. Fr. Paul

IS YOUR MARRIAGE A VALID SACRAMENT?

If you were married civilly, that is not in the Catholic Church before a priest or deacon, it is not a valid sacramental marriage. This is an impediment to receiving the Eucharist and other sacraments. For a marriage to be valid in the Catholic Church, the marriage must be in a Catholic Church or Chapel and officiated by an authorized Catholic priest or deacon along with 2 witnesses. (There are limited interfaith exceptions with proper permission.)

I invite you to speak with one of our priests if there are any questions or if indeed you wish to validate your marriage. The process can be very simple and your marriage will now be blessed by the Church. Once the Marriage is convalidated, that is blessed in the Church, you will be able to receive the Eucharist, make Sacramental Confession, and receive the other sacraments.

Statement of Joseph W. Cardinal Tobin, C.Ss.R., Archbishop of Newark, on the Events of this Past Weekend in Charlottesville, VA

The one and a half million Catholic men, women and children of the Archdiocese of Newark – people who trace their roots to every continent of the world and represent every race and ethnicity – view with horror the recent events in Charlottesville and condemn the racism and vicious rhetoric that contributed to this tragic moment in our nation's history. We stand in prayer and solidarity with all people of good will and we witness to our Christian calling to "love your enemies...that you may be children of your heavenly Father." (Mt. 5:44-45)

In the wake of her daughter's brutal death, the mother of Heather Heyer told reporters in Charlottesville that "hate cannot fix the world. Hate only creates more hate." We join her in rejecting the brutality that killed her child, contributed to the deaths of two Virginia State Troopers and left dozens injured. While we denounce such violence, we also call for a thorough examination of racial bigotry and intolerance in the light of reason and love. "For everyone who does wicked things hates the light and does not come toward the light, so that his works might not be exposed" (Jn 3:20). Dark words and deeds must be met with light and love.

Mientras que la población de estudiantes que no son hispanos va bajando en Estados Unidos de América, el número de estudiantes hispanos va creciendo en las escuelas primarias y secundarias. Esta es buena noticia para los latinos. La mala noticia es que el porcentaje de estudiantes latinos que abandonan la escuela y nunca terminan su educación sigue creciendo. Durante la primaria, él y mi mamá me corregían la tarea, y cuando no quería ir a la escuela, me hacían ver lo difícil que es la vida cuando no se tiene estudios. Mis padres no terminaron la escuela pero todos sus hijos ahora somos maestros. La educación comienza en el hogar, animen a sus hijos.

LLAMADOS A ACTUAR EN EL NOMBRE DE DIOS

“¡Que todos los pueblos te alaben!” (Salmo 67:4) exclama la respuesta del salmo de hoy. En el salterio y en otras escrituras hebreas, este tipo de invocación es en realidad una invitación a Dios para que actúe e intervenga en las vidas humanas de tal manera que haga que todos —no sólo el Pueblo Elegido— exprese alabanzas. Dicho algo más fuerte, es como desafiar a Dios para que “aguante o se calle”, el tipo de palabras duras que los salmistas de Israel, confiando en su íntima relación de amor con Dios, no temían expresar.

El Evangelio tiene su propia exclamación que anuncia la aparición de la mujer cananea con un “Entonces” (Mateo 15:22). “Entonces” o “he aquí” es una señal en la Biblia que nos indica que observemos con mucha atención, que Dios está por actuar o anunciar algo por medio de un individuo o una situación. En el caso de Jesús, Dios iba a obrar a través de esta mujer, a quien ninguno de los seguidores de Jesús hubiera creído pudiera ser una agente de la voluntad divina. Como los salmistas, puede que informemos en forma pasiva a Dios o quizás hasta activamente le desafiamos para que haga algo para que todos lleguen a creer, mas Dios siempre nos volteará las posiciones. Se convierte en nuestro llamado, nuestro deber (como lo fue para Jesús) observar atentamente las situaciones y a las personas en nuestra vida diaria para que Dios pueda actuar a través de nosotros, para que el Reino sea anunciado en nuestro diario vivir.

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Los Siete Sacramentos: Vida con Cristo Penitencia y Reconciliación

1485 En la tarde de Pascua, el Señor Jesús se mostró a sus Apóstoles y les dijo: "Recibid el Espíritu Santo. A quienes perdonéis los pecados, les quedan perdonados; a quienes se los retengáis, les quedan retenidos" (Jn 20, 22-23).

1486 El perdón de los pecados cometidos después del Bautismo es concedido por un sacramento propio llamado sacramento de la conversión, de la confesión, de la penitencia o de la reconciliación.

1487 Quien peca lesiona el honor de Dios y su amor, su propia dignidad de hombre llamado a ser hijo de Dios y el bien espiritual de la Iglesia, de la que cada cristiano debe ser una piedra viva.

1488 A los ojos de la fe, ningún mal es más grave que el pecado y nada tiene peores consecuencias para los pecadores mismos, para la Iglesia y para el mundo entero.

1489 Volver a la comunión con Dios, después de haberla perdido por el pecado, es un movimiento que nace de la gracia de Dios, rico en misericordia y deseoso de la salvación de los hombres. Es preciso pedir este don precioso para sí mismo y para los demás.
