**The Seven Sacraments: Life with Christ
Penance & Reconciliation**

1490 The movement of return to God, called conversion and repentance, entails sorrow for and abhorrence of sins committed, and the firm purpose of sinning no more in the future. Conversion touches the past and the future and is nourished by hope in God's mercy.

1491 The sacrament of Penance is a whole consisting in three actions of the penitent and the priest's absolution. the penitent's acts are repentance, confession or disclosure of sins to the priest, and the intention to make reparation and do works of reparation.

1492 Repentance (also called contrition) must be inspired by motives that arise from faith. If repentance arises from love of charity for God, it is called "perfect" contrition; if it is founded on other motives, it is called "imperfect."

1493 One who desires to obtain reconciliation with God and with the Church, must confess to a priest all the unconfessed grave sins he remembers after having carefully examined his conscience. the confession of venial faults, without being necessary in itself, is nevertheless strongly recommended by the Church.

Jesus said to him, "If you wish to be perfect, go, sell what you have and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven. Then come, follow me" (Matthew 19:22).

The word volunteer comes from the Latin *volus* meaning *will*. When one volunteers he is giving of himself out of his own free will: no coercion, no guilt, no expectation of reimbursement. A volunteer is one who does something without being forced. A parish, in deed every community, needs volunteers to run properly, efficiently and for the good of the people. Without volunteers we could too easily become a bureaucracy or a business. So much of my time is spent on the business side of the parish corporation, that I can easily avoid the pastoral duties leaving them to others.

This past Sunday, we celebrated our volunteers from choir singers and ushers, to altar servers and the many ministries and apostolates that flourish here in the parish. Without my volunteers the parish would dwindle, I and the staff would become exhausted, and the doors would close.

Today's Catholics can no longer say I am a good Catholic because I come to Mass every Sunday. In the Gospel the young rich man asked Jesus, what do I have to do to gain eternal life? Jesus responds, "Why do you ask me about the good? There is only One who is good." At that the young man acknowledged that he has kept the commandments but he wanted to know what more he could do to be perfect. Jesus told him that he would have to sell all he has, give it to the poor and follow him. The man left sad because he had many possessions.

One way for us to be free of our possessions which compromise our free will, and be the Catholic we are called to be, is to volunteer. To give of ourselves without expectation of return (save God's blessing and grace) is a martyrdom that is a witness to the Gospel. Jesus tells us over and over to love (*αγαπειν*) and to put ourselves at the service of others. We are not to make ourselves number one, but to defer to the other. In marriage, husbands and wives are asked to defer to one another (see St. Paul's Letter to the Ephesians). This willingness to do for the other, respect the other, and love the other is what makes marriage strong. Likewise the community, parish and others are made stronger when we willing give of ourselves, when we volunteer.

Today's society is getting more and more broken. What I mean is people are becoming so individualistic, that they are isolated. Perhaps it is the technology that allows us to do so much without interacting with human beings or the philosophical thought of relativism which says basically we do not need each other, rather my own thoughts are enough, leaving us not to have conversations. If we are all right in what we think and believe, then what is there to discuss. I noticed recently when there was that demonstration in Virginia and the left and the right had a violent confrontation, there was no room for discussion, only condemnation and fighting. Have the skills of persuasion, debate, and dialogue disappeared totally from our society?

Yes, along with cooperation, understanding, and discus-

sion, volunteering, that willful giving of the self for others, is going to the wayside. We as Catholics must preserve in this because without it our Christian community cannot prevail. I invite you to consider volunteering in the parish if you already don't. We need Catechist, Singers for the Choir, Instrumentalist for music, Altar servers, Communion Ministers, helpers at the food pantry, members for the Human Concerns Committee, Readers at Mass, Caretakers for the grounds, Office help, etc. I could go on forever. If you have a skill or would just like to help out let us know and we can fit you in. There is always work to be done. Rome wasn't built in a day and the work of God's Church is always to be done.

IS YOUR MARRIAGE A VALID SACRAMENT?

If you were married civilly, that is not in the Catholic Church before a priest or deacon, it is not a valid sacramental marriage. This is an impediment to receiving the Eucharist and other sacraments. For a marriage to be valid in the Catholic Church, the marriage must be in a Catholic Church or Chapel and officiated by an authorized Catholic priest or deacon along with 2 witnesses. (There are limited interfaith exceptions with proper permission.)

I invite you to speak with one of our priests if there are any questions or if indeed you wish to validate your marriage. The process can be very simple and your marriage will now be blessed by the Church. Once the Marriage is convalidated, that is blessed in the Church, you will be able to receive the Eucharist, make Sacramental Confession, and receive the other sacraments.

SÉ UNA ROCA

La historia de Pedro como seguidor o amigo de Jesús es un poco irregular. Resulta natural preguntarnos si Jesús, al darle las llaves del Reino, no se sintió un poco como el padre que le entrega a su adolescente las llaves del auto de la familia. Pero fue en el momento en que el poder y la presencia de Dios irrumpió traspasándolo todo para que brotara de Pedro la gran profesión de fe en Cristo como Mesías que Jesús eligió establecer el vínculo entre la misericordia amorosa de Dios y nuestra vocación como testigos de ese amor y ese perdón en la tierra.

Como cualquier padre, Jesús sin duda previó las fallas, las maniobras irresponsables y los sentidos dañados, las colisiones hacia donde se dirigiría la Iglesia. Pero, lo que es más importante, también nos vio en el momento en que Dios prefiere vernos: capaces de manifestar gran fe, con el deseo de permanecer a los pies de Cristo para comprender lo que realmente es ser Mesías y ser Cristo. Como nos lo señala hoy la carta a los romanos, no hemos conocido jamás el pensamiento del Señor o llegado a ser su consejero, mas Dios nos conoce y aún elige para que manifestemos el reino de justicia, gozo, hermosura y paz. Que esta sea nuestra vocación. Que siempre busquemos ser tierra firme donde se pueda fundar la Iglesia de Jesucristo y sobre la cual sigue edificándose.

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TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

Más del 40% de la población católica en Estados Unidos es de origen hispano y sólo el 6% de los sacerdotes son hispanos. Hay algo que está mal en las cifras. Parte del problema es que en los seminarios estadounidenses no saben qué hacer con las vocaciones y culturas hispanas. Por otra parte, los hispanos deseamos que nuestros hijos tengan mejor vida y la vocación sacerdotal no constituye un lugar privilegiado en la escala social.

Ciertamente, había un tiempo en que los sacerdotes se trataban con mucho respeto, ya no. Últimamente la escasez de sacerdotes y los escándalos en la Iglesia han hecho que el sacerdocio pierda mucho de su encanto. La vida sacerdotal se ha hecho muy difícil. Hoy día el joven que busca el sacerdocio lo busca por servicio y vocación, no por prestigio o posición social.

El sacerdocio es un apostolado que se recibe con el sacramento del Orden. Ser ordenado es recibir órdenes, es decir, ser obediente. Hoy más que nunca, el sacerdote está llamado a la misma obediencia de Jesucristo, obediencia que lo llevó a la cruz y a la resurrección. Oremos por nuestros sacerdotes para que su entrega sea total.

Los Siete Sacramentos: Vida con Cristo Penitencia y Reconciliación

1490 El movimiento de retorno a Dios, llamado conversión y arrepentimiento, implica un dolor y una aversión respecto a los pecados cometidos, y el propósito firme de no volver a pecar. La conversión, por tanto, mira al pasado y al futuro; se nutre de la esperanza en la misericordia divina.

1491 El sacramento de la Penitencia está constituido por el conjunto de tres actos realizados por el penitente, y por la absolución del sacerdote. Los actos del penitente son: el arrepentimiento, la confesión o manifestación de los pecados al sacerdote y el propósito de realizar la reparación y las obras de penitencia.

1492 El arrepentimiento (llamado también contrición) debe estar inspirado en motivaciones que brotan de la fe. Si el arrepentimiento es concebido por amor de caridad hacia Dios, se le llama "perfecto"; si está fundado en otros motivos se le llama "imperfecto".

1493 El que quiere obtener la reconciliación con Dios y con la Iglesia debe confesar al sacerdote todos los pecados graves que no ha confesado aún y de los que se acuerda tras examinar cuidadosamente su conciencia. Sin ser necesaria, de suyo, la confesión de las faltas veniales está recomendada vivamente por la Iglesia.
