**The Seven Sacraments: Life with Christ
 Anointing of the Sick**

1526 "Is any among you sick? Let him call for the presbyters of the Church, and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord; and the prayer of faith will save the sick man, and the Lord will raise him up; and if he has committed sins, he will be forgiven" (Jas 5:14-15).

1527 The sacrament of Anointing of the Sick has as its purpose the conferral of a special grace on the Christian experiencing the difficulties inherent in the condition of grave illness or old age.

1528 The proper time for receiving this holy anointing has certainly arrived when the believer begins to be in danger of death because of illness or old age.

1529 Each time a Christian falls seriously ill, he may receive the Anointing of the Sick, and also when, after he has received it, the illness worsens.

1530 Only priests can give the sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, using oil blessed by the bishop, or if necessary by the celebrating presbyter himself.

1531 The celebration of the Anointing of the Sick consists essentially in the anointing of the forehead and hands of the sick person, the anointing being accompanied by the liturgical prayer of the celebrant asking for the special grace of this sacrament.

1532 The special grace of the sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick has as its effects:

- the uniting of the sick person to the passion of Christ, for his own good and that of the whole Church;
- the strengthening, peace, and courage to endure in a Christian manner the sufferings of illness or old age;
- the forgiveness of sins, if the sick person was not able to obtain it through the sacrament of Penance;
- the restoration of health, if it is conducive to the salvation of his soul;
- the preparation for passing over to eternal life.

(Oratio 10 in Exaltatione sanctae crucis: PG 97, 1018-1019, 1022-1023)

The cross is Christ's glory and triumph

We are celebrating the feast of the cross which drove away darkness and brought in the light. As we keep this feast, we are lifted up with the crucified Christ, leaving behind us earth and sin so that we may gain the things above. So great and outstanding a possession is the cross that he who wins it has won a treasure. Rightly could I call this treasure the fairest of all fair things and the costliest, in fact as well as in name, for on it and through it and for its sake the riches of salvation that had been lost were restored to us.

Had there been no cross, Christ could not have been crucified. Had there been no cross, life itself could not have been nailed to the tree. And if life had not been nailed to it, there would be no streams of immortality pouring from Christ's side, blood and water for the world's cleansing. The legal bond of our sin would not be canceled, we should not have attained our freedom, we should not have enjoyed the fruit of the tree of life and the gates of paradise would not stand open. Had there been no cross, death would not have been trodden underfoot, nor hell despoiled.

Therefore, the cross is something wonderfully great and honorable. It is great because through the cross the many noble acts of Christ found their consummation—very many indeed, for both his miracles and his sufferings were fully rewarded with victory. The cross is honorable because it is both the sign of God's suffering and the trophy of his victory. It stands for his suffering because on it he freely suffered unto death. But it is also his trophy because it was the means by which the devil was wounded and death conquered; the barred gates of hell were smashed, and the cross became the one common salvation of the whole world.

The cross is called Christ's glory; it is saluted as his triumph. We recognize it as the cup he longed to drink and the climax of the sufferings he endured for our sake. As to the cross being Christ's glory, listen to his words: Now is the Son of Man glorified, and in him God is glorified, and God will glorify him at once. And again: Father, glorify me with the glory I had with you before the world came to be. And once more: Father, glorify your name. Then a voice came from heaven: I have glorified it and I will glorify it again. Here he speaks of the glory that

would accrue to him through the cross. And if you would understand that the cross is Christ's triumph, hear what he himself also said: When I am lifted up, then I will draw all men to myself. Now you can see that the cross is Christ's glory and triumph.

IS YOUR MARRIAGE A VALID SACRAMENT?

If you were married civilly, that is not in the Catholic Church before a priest or deacon, it is not a valid sacramental marriage. This is an impediment to receiving the Eucharist and other sacraments. For a marriage to be valid in the Catholic Church, the marriage must be in a Catholic Church or Chapel and officiated by an authorized Catholic priest or deacon along with 2 witnesses. (There are limited interfaith exceptions with proper permission.)

I invite you to speak with one of our priests if there are any questions or if indeed you wish to validate your marriage. The process can be very simple and your marriage will now be blessed by the Church. Once the Marriage is convalidated, that is blessed in the Church, you will be able to receive the Eucharist, make Sacramental Confession, and receive the other sacraments.

¿QUE PASA?

De los sermones de san Andrés de Creta, obispo

(Sermón 10, Sobre la Exaltación de la santa cruz: PG 97, 1018-1019. 1022-1023)

LA CRUZ ES LA GLORIA Y EXALTACIÓN DE CRISTO

Por la cruz, cuya fiesta celebramos, fueron expulsadas las tinieblas y devuelta la luz. Celebramos hoy la fiesta de la cruz y, junto con el Crucificado, nos elevamos hacia lo alto, para, dejando abajo la tierra y el pecado, gozar de los bienes celestiales; tal y tan grande es la posesión de la cruz. Quien posee la cruz posee un tesoro. Y, al decir un tesoro, quiero significar con esta expresión a aquel que es, de nombre y de hecho, el más excelente de todos los bienes, en el cual, por el cual y para el cual culmina nuestra salvación y se nos restituye a nuestro estado de justicia original. Porque, sin la cruz, Cristo no hubiera sido crucificado. Sin la cruz, aquel que es la vida no hubiera sido clavado en el leño. Si no hubiese sido clavado, las fuentes de la inmortalidad no hubiesen manado de su costado la sangre y el agua que purifican el mundo, no hubiese sido rasgado el documento en que constaba la deuda contraída por nuestros pecados, no hubiéramos sido declarados libres, no disfrutaríamos del árbol de la vida, el paraíso continuaría cerrado. Sin la cruz, no hubiera sido derrotada la muerte, ni despojado el lugar de los muertos. Por esto, la cruz es cosa grande y preciosa. Grande, porque ella es el origen de innumerables bienes, tanto más numerosos, cuanto que los milagros y sufrimientos de Cristo juegan un papel decisivo en su obra de salvación. Preciosa, porque la cruz significa a la vez el sufrimiento y el trofeo del mismo Dios: el sufrimiento, porque en ella sufrió una muerte voluntaria; el trofeo, porque en ella quedó herido de muerte el demonio y, con él, fue vencida la muerte. En la cruz fueron demolidas las puertas de la región de los muertos, y la cruz se convirtió en salvación universal para todo el mundo. La cruz es llamada también gloria y exaltación de Cristo. Ella es el cáliz rebosante, de que nos habla el salmo, y la culminación de todos los tormentos que padeció Cristo por nosotros. El mismo Cristo nos enseña que la cruz es su gloria, cuando dice: Ahora es glorificado el Hijo del hombre, y Dios es glorificado en él, y pronto lo glorificará. Y también: Padre, glorifícame con la gloria que yo tenía cerca de ti, antes que el mundo existiese. Y asimismo dice: "Padre, glorifica tu nombre." Entonces vino una voz del cielo: "Lo he glorificado y volveré a glorificarlo", palabras que se referían a la gloria que había de conseguir en la cruz. También nos enseña Cristo que la cruz es su exaltación, cuando dice: Cuando yo sea elevado sobre la tierra, atraeré a todos hacia mí. Está claro, pues, que la cruz es la gloria y exaltación de Cristo.

1526 "¿Está enfermo alguno entre vosotros? Llame a los presbíteros de la Iglesia, que oren sobre él y le unjan con óleo en el nombre del Señor. Y la oración de la fe salvará al enfermo, y el Señor hará que se levante, y si hubiera cometidos pecados, le serán perdonados" (St 5,14-15).

1527 El sacramento de la Unción de los enfermos tiene por fin conferir una gracia especial al cristiano que experimenta las dificultades inherentes al estado de enfermedad grave o de vejez.

1528 El tiempo oportuno para recibir la Santa Unción llega ciertamente cuando el fiel comienza a encontrarse en peligro de muerte por causa de enfermedad o de vejez.

1529 Cada vez que un cristiano cae gravemente enfermo puede recibir la Santa Unción, y también cuando, después de haberla recibido, la enfermedad se agrava.

1530 Sólo los sacerdotes (presbíteros y obispos) pueden administrar el sacramento de la Unción de los enfermos; para conferirlo emplean óleo bendecido por el obispo, o, en caso necesario, por el mismo presbítero que celebra.

1531 Lo esencial de la celebración de este sacramento consiste en la unción en la frente y las manos del enfermo (en el rito romano) o en otras partes del cuerpo (en Oriente), unción acompañada de la oración litúrgica del sacerdote celebrante que pide la gracia especial de este sacramento.

1532 La gracia especial del sacramento de la Unción de los enfermos tiene como efectos:

-la unión del enfermo a la Pasión de Cristo, para su bien y el de toda la Iglesia;

-el consuelo, la paz y el ánimo para soportar cristianamente los sufrimientos de la enfermedad o de la vejez;

-el perdón de los pecados si el enfermo no ha podido obtenerlo por el sacramento de la penitencia;

-el restablecimiento de la salud corporal, si conviene a la salud espiritual;

-la preparación para el paso a la vida eterna.
