

**The Seven Sacraments: Life with Christ Holy Orders**

1590 St. Paul said to his disciple Timothy: "I remind you to rekindle the gift of God that is within you through the laying on of my hands" (2Tim 1:6), and "If any one aspires to the office of bishop, he desires a noble task." (1 Tim 3:1) To Titus he said: "This is why I left you in Crete, that you amend what was defective, and appoint presbyters in every town, as I directed you" (Titus 1:5).

1591 The whole Church is a priestly people. Through Baptism all the faithful share in the priesthood of Christ. This participation is called the "common priesthood of the faithful." Based on this common priesthood and ordered to its service, there exists another participation in the mission of Christ: the ministry conferred by the sacrament of Holy Orders, where the task is to serve in the name and in the person of Christ the Head in the midst of the community.

1592 The ministerial priesthood differs in essence from the common priesthood of the faithful because it confers a sacred power for the service of the faithful. The ordained ministers exercise their service for the People of God by teaching (munus docendi), divine worship (munus liturgicum) and pastoral governance (munus regendi).

1593 Since the beginning, the ordained ministry has been conferred and exercised in three degrees: that of bishops, that of presbyters, and that of deacons. The ministries conferred by ordination are irreplaceable for the organic structure of the Church: without the bishop, presbyters, and deacons, one cannot speak of the Church (cf St. Ignatius of Antioch, Ad Trall. 3,1).

There are many kinds of alms the giving of which helps us to obtain pardon for our sins; but none is greater than that by which we forgive from our heart a sin that someone has committed against us.

**F**orgiving someone can be very difficult. Many emotions interfere and pride (superbia) rears its ugly head. St. Peter asks the Lord how many times does he have to forgive, “Seven times?” You see Peter was being very magnanimous. The tradition was to forgive three times. He is offering 7, but our Lord tops that with 77 times. Wow! How can we do that. To be hurt over and over again and still forgive? Also our pride gets in the way. Won’t people think us the fool and won’t the offender think us to be patsies?

Look at it this way. We have offended God in many and varied ways in our short lives, but each time we come to Him and confess, asking forgiveness, seeking absolution, and desiring the full love and grace that God gives to us. If you think you have not offended God then you are really lost. Even the saints and the popes sought God’s forgiveness. In fact the closer you grow in your relationship with the Lord, the more you realize your sins against Him and your neighbor. Remember this, where sin abounds, grace abounds all the more. That is because when we sin, we seek his grace, forgiveness, mercy, and friendship even more deeply. The true Christian is not sinless. He is the one who loves God, his neighbor as himself, and knows when to ask forgiveness of Him and of his neighbor. The Christian also forgives as God has forgiven him. Forgive, forgive and forgive and you will be forgiven, forgiven, forgiven....

### **IS YOUR MARRIAGE A VALID SACRAMENT?**

If you were married civilly, that is not in the Catholic Church before a priest or deacon, it is not a valid sacramental marriage. This is an impediment to receiving the Eucharist and other sacraments. For a marriage to be valid in the Catholic Church, the marriage must be in a Catholic Church or Chapel and officiated by an authorized Catholic priest or deacon along with 2 witnesses. (There are limited interfaith exceptions with proper permission.)

I invite you to speak with one of our priests if there are any questions or if indeed you wish to validate your marriage. The process can be very simple and your marriage will now be blessed by the Church. Once the Marriage is convalidated, that is blessed in the Church, you will be able to receive the Eucharist, make Sacramental Confession, and receive the other sacraments.

## Los Siete Sacramentos: Vida con Cristo El Sacramento del Orden

1590 San Pablo dice a su discípulo Timoteo: "Te recomiendo que reavives el carisma de Dios que está en ti por la imposición de mis manos" (2 Tm 1,6), y "si alguno aspira al cargo de obispo, desea una noble función" (1 Tm 3,1). A Tito decía: "El motivo de haberte dejado en Creta, fue para que acabaras de organizar lo que faltaba y establecieras presbíteros en cada ciudad, como yo te ordené" (Tt 1,5).

1591 La Iglesia entera es un pueblo sacerdotal. Por el Bautismo, todos los fieles participan del sacerdocio de Cristo. Esta participación se llama "sacerdocio común de los fieles". A partir de este sacerdocio y al servicio del mismo existe otra participación en la misión de Cristo: la del ministerio conferido por el sacramento del Orden, cuya tarea es servir en nombre y en la representación de Cristo-Cabeza en medio de la comunidad.

1592 El sacerdocio ministerial difiere esencialmente del sacerdocio común de los fieles porque confiere un poder sagrado para el servicio de los fieles. Los ministros ordenados ejercen su servicio en el pueblo de Dios mediante la enseñanza (munus docendi), el culto divino (munus liturgicum) y por el gobierno pastoral (munus regendi).

1593 Desde los orígenes, el ministerio ordenado fue conferido y ejercido en tres grados: el de los obispos, el de los presbíteros y el de los diáconos. Los ministerios conferidos por la ordenación son insustituibles para la estructura orgánica de la Iglesia: sin el obispo, los presbíteros y los diáconos no se puede hablar de Iglesia (cf. San Ignacio de Antioquía, Epistula ad Trallianos 3,1).
