**The Seven Sacraments: Life with Christ Holy Orders**

1594 The bishop receives the fullness of the sacrament of Holy Orders, which integrates him into the episcopal college and makes him the visible head of the particular Church entrusted to him. As successors of the apostles and members of the college, the bishops share in the apostolic responsibility and mission of the whole Church under the authority of the Pope, successor of St. Peter.

1595 Priests are united with the bishops in sacerdotal dignity and at the same time depend on them in the exercise of their pastoral functions; they are called to be the bishops' prudent co-workers. They form around their bishop the presbyterium which bears responsibility with him for the particular Church. They receive from the bishop the charge of a parish community or a determinate ecclesial office.

1596 Deacons are ministers ordained for tasks of service of the Church; they do not receive the ministerial priesthood, but ordination confers on them important functions in the ministry of the word, divine worship, pastoral governance, and the service of charity, tasks which they must carry out under the pastoral authority of their bishop.

## Our Father – Pater Noster - ΠΑΤΕΡ 'ΗΜΩΝ – Abba nan – (Mt 6:9)

When the disciples asked Jesus how to pray, he said to pray like this, “Our Father...” With these words Jesus altered history. Not only did man see God as a father-creator, but now we became like Jesus in the sense that Jesus did not use “My Father” or “The Father” but rather he made us his brothers and sisters when he said, “Our Father.” Now we know that Jesus spoke the Aramaic term, *Abba*, to refer to his heavenly Father. Though strictly speaking it means father, it had that more familiar connotation: dad.

Often when I pray the Lord’s Prayer, I use the term “My Father”. I am not being contrary or revolutionary when I do it. I simply need to emphasize to myself that God is MY Father. I would never insist on MY in public prayer nor do I use it regularly because I need more importantly to know that God is OUR Father. That we are brothers and sisters with Christ. In baptism we are begotten from above. In the flesh we are begotten by our fathers and born of our mothers, but in faith (in the spirit) we are begotten from above and born of our mother, the Church. Our holy Mother the Church gives birth to us, nurtures us, feeds us, teaches us and guides us for we are her children, the fruit of her womb and the seed of our Heavenly Father. As the Virgin Mary gave birth to the Son, the virgin Church gives birth to the sons and daughters of God. When the Spirit descended upon the Church (the Apostles at Pentecost) the seed of unending life was given to all those who would receive the Light of Christ. As Jesus is the Son of Mary we are the sons and daughters of the Church. And as Jesus is the Son of God we now are the heirs of God. We have become the Children of the Father, the brothers/sisters of the Son and have been wedded to the Spirit of God to be his instruments of exclusive and eternal love and life.

God is not my Father or Jesus’ Father, he is OUR Father. To forget this revelation of truth would distort any relationship we have with God and of course with our neighbors. The one who forgets God is OUR Father forgets that our neighbors are our brothers and sisters. He forgets to love them, to forgive

them, and to be exclusively united to them in the one holy catholic and apostolic Church, that Mother of Ours who has given birth to our Christian identity as the brothers and sisters of Jesus, our Lord and God.

So in the words given to us by Jesus himself, we say,  
“Our Father...”

### **IS YOUR MARRIAGE A VALID SACRAMENT?**

If you were married civilly, that is not in the Catholic Church before a priest or deacon, it is not a valid sacramental marriage. This is an impediment to receiving the Eucharist and other sacraments. For a marriage to be valid in the Catholic Church, the marriage must be in a Catholic Church or Chapel and officiated by an authorized Catholic priest or deacon along with 2 witnesses. (There are limited interfaith exceptions with proper permission.)

I invite you to speak with one of our priests if there are any questions or if indeed you wish to validate your marriage. The process can be very simple and your marriage will now be blessed by the Church. Once the Marriage is convalidated, that is blessed in the Church, you will be able to receive the Eucharist, make Sacramental Confession, and receive the other sacraments.

# ¿QUE PASA?

## TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

Las actas de los mártires son documentos de suma importancia en la Iglesia cristiana. En ellas se encuentra el testimonio de hombres y mujeres que con su sangre dieron testimonio del evangelio. En esta documentación encontramos el testimonio de quienes vieron y presenciaron su martirio. Por ejemplo, un soldado dice de los mártires: *“Dormían en el suelo. No les vi quejarse en ningún momento y estuvieron todo el tiempo rezando y muy recogidos. . . magníficos, unos santos. . .”*.

Testimonios como éste eran comunes en los primeros siglos del cristianismo cuando en la Roma pagana se perseguía a la Iglesia primitiva. Lamentablemente, este testimonio no viene de hace 17 ó 19 siglos, más bien, viene del siglo pasado, siglo en el cual la persecución de cristianos se multiplicó por todas partes del mundo produciendo más mártires que ningún otro siglo.

El testimonio del soldado fue acerca del primer santo Argentino, Héctor Valdivielso Sáez y compañeros, quienes fueron asesinados por los comunistas en Asturias, España. Él fue uno de los más de 8000 cristianos martirizados en España, 30,000 en China, incontables en Latinoamérica y otros lugares durante el siglo pasado.

1594 El obispo recibe la plenitud del sacramento del Orden que lo incorpora al Colegio episcopal y hace de él la cabeza visible de la Iglesia particular que le es confiada. 1596 Los diáconos son ministros ordenados para las tareas de servicio de la Iglesia; no reciben el sacerdocio ministerial, pero la ordenación les confiere funciones importantes en el ministerio de la palabra, del culto divino, del gobierno pastoral y del servicio de la caridad, tareas que deben cumplir bajo la autoridad pastoral de su obispo.
