**The Seven Sacraments: Life with Christ
Holy Orders**

1597 The sacrament of Holy Orders is conferred by the laying on of hands followed by a solemn prayer of consecration asking God to grant the ordinand the graces of the Holy Spirit required for his ministry. Ordination imprints an indelible sacramental character.

1598 The Church confers the sacrament of Holy Orders only on baptized men (viri), whose suitability for the exercise of the ministry has been duly recognized. Church authority alone has the responsibility and right to call someone to receive the sacrament of Holy Orders.

1599 In the Latin Church the sacrament of Holy Orders for the presbyterate is normally conferred only on candidates who are ready to embrace celibacy freely and who publicly manifest their intention of staying celibate for the love of God's kingdom and the service of men.

1600 It is bishops who confer the sacrament of Holy Orders in the three degrees.

Over forty years ago, Fr. John Van Wie (1966-1983) told Sr. Emily Walsh (1963-2015) that the Spanish speaking community at Holy Trinity would be the future. His prophecy came true. The Spanish speaking parishioners account for about half of the parishioners of Holy Trinity Church. We are grateful to our predecessors who recognized the pastoral need to reach out over 40 years ago to the Spanish speakers. Today over 600 attend Mass in Spanish every Sunday at 8:15 AM.

When I was asked to be pastor of Holy Trinity Church, one question was asked: Do you speak Spanish? I replied, "I can handle myself. I can say the *Misa* and hear *confesiones*." You see, the Lord had prepared me for this mission. Prior to coming to Holy Trinity Church, I assisted my classmate at St. Benedict's Church of Stamford. Baptized by fire, I was asked to hear confessions, do baptisms and celebrate the Mass all in Spanish! Mind you, my formal education in Spanish ended in 1981 when I graduated high school. I did this for four years.

Next week, together we celebrate 40 years with our Hispanic brothers and sisters. The Hispanic Community at Holy Trinity Church has been a blessing both for me and the wider community. Their dedication and piety is an encouragement to me that the Church is a living active body reaching out to every creature and filling them with the hope of salvation.

I hope that the Hispanic Community in union with the greater community, continues to grow in faith, numbers, and dedication to Christ and his Church, especially in this local Parish of Holy Trinity.

IS YOUR MARRIAGE A VALID SACRAMENT?

If you were married civilly, that is not in the Catholic Church before a priest or deacon, it is not a valid sacramental marriage. This is an impediment to receiving the Eucharist and other sacraments. For a marriage to be valid in the Catholic Church, the marriage must be in a Catholic Church or Chapel and officiated by an authorized Catholic priest or deacon along with 2 witnesses. (There are limited interfaith exceptions with proper permission.)

I invite you to speak with one of our priests if there are any questions or if indeed you wish to validate your marriage. The process can be very simple and your marriage will now be blessed by the Church. Once the Marriage is convalidated, that is blessed in the Church, you will be able to receive the Eucharist, make Sacramental Confession, and receive the other sacraments.

TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

La práctica de usar nudos en una cuerda para contar oraciones tiene una larga trayectoria en la fe cristiana. Originalmente un cordón con 150 nudos o piedritas se usaba para contar la recitación de los 150 salmos encontrados en la Sagrada Escritura. Con el tiempo, visto que mucha gente no podía leer o recitar de memoria los salmos, se sustituyeron por el uso de 150 Padrenuestros. A finales de la Edad Media muchos sustituyeron los Padrenuestros con el saludo del ángel Gabriel a María. En el siglo XVI se formuló lo que hoy reconocemos como el Avemaría, y en el año 1569, el Papa Pío V estableció el Rosario en su forma y uso actual.

En 1592 un fraile dominico mandó hacer una imagen de la Virgen del Rosario para su convento en Guatemala. Según la leyenda, María viajaba por América con su Hijito y éste se quedó dormido en Guatemala, por lo cual se quedaron allí. En 1821 los independistas guatemaltecos tomaron a la Virgen del Rosario como protectora y en 1833 fue nombrada patrona oficial de Guatemala.

1598 La Iglesia confiere el sacramento del Orden únicamente a varones (viri) bautizados, cuyas aptitudes para el ejercicio del ministerio han sido debidamente reconocidas. A la autoridad de la Iglesia corresponde la responsabilidad y el derecho de llamar a uno a recibir la ordenación.

1599 En la Iglesia latina, el sacramento del Orden para el presbiterado sólo es conferido ordinariamente a candidatos que están dispuestos a abrazar libremente el celibato y que manifiestan públicamente su voluntad de guardarlo por amor del Reino de Dios y el servicio de los hombres.

1600 Corresponde a los obispos conferir el sacramento del Orden en los tres grados.
