**The Seven Sacraments: Life with Christ  
Matrimony**

1659 St. Paul said: "Husbands, love your wives, as Christ loved the Church.... This is a great mystery, and I mean in reference to Christ and the Church" (Eph 5:25, 32).

1660 The marriage covenant, by which a man and a woman form with each other an intimate communion of life and love, has been founded and endowed with its own special laws by the Creator. By its very nature it is ordered to the good of the couple, as well as to the generation and education of children.

Christ the Lord raised marriage between the baptized to the dignity of a sacrament (cf CIC, can. 1055 # 1; cf. GS 48 # 1).

1661 The sacrament of Matrimony signifies the union of Christ and the Church. It gives spouses the grace to love each other with the love with which Christ has loved his Church; the grace of the sacrament thus perfects the human love of the spouses, strengthens their indissoluble unity, and sanctifies them on the way to eternal life (cf Council of Trent: DS 1799).

1662 Marriage is based on the consent of the contracting parties, that is, on their will to give themselves, each to the other, mutually and definitively, in order to live a covenant of faithful and fruitful love.

October is Right to Life month. But why do we need to celebrate the basic right to life in a nation that is privileged, educated, and free? Freedom is a gift that is linked to life and both are very delicate. Yet like human life, freedom is abused, distorted and destroyed. The self-proclaimed guardians of liberty have become the greatest adversaries of life and therefore liberty. They want abortion to be an unfettered right, they want euthanasia to be normative, and they desire distortions of human sexuality to be acceptable practice condoned by the law and individual conscience.

We as Christians, who believe that God created life out of nothing and sanctified human life when he breathed his spirit into the human animal making him in the likeness of God himself, are to cherish life as a gift from God and honor human sexuality in its unadulterated form. Our founding fathers in all their limitedness did recognize that life and liberty are basic to the human citizen, and that these inalienable rights were given to us by God. The legalization of abortion, euthanasia, homosexual "marriage", and whatever farfetched "right" arises in the dim minds of influential people must be opposed by those who love God, their neighbor and the freedom He has given to us. ### **IS YOUR MARRIAGE A VALID SACRAMENT?**

If you were married civilly, that is not in the Catholic Church before a priest or deacon, it is not a valid sacramental marriage. This is an impediment to receiving the Eucharist and other sacraments. For a marriage to be valid in the Catholic Church, the marriage must be in a Catholic Church or Chapel and officiated by an authorized Catholic priest or deacon along with 2 witnesses. (There are limited interfaith exceptions with proper permission.)

I invite you to speak with one of our priests if there are any questions or if indeed you wish to validate your marriage. The process can be very simple and your marriage will now be blessed by the Church. Once the Marriage is convalidated, that is blessed in the Church, you will be able to receive the Eucharist, make Sacramental Confession, and receive the other sacraments.

### TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

La Virgen María tiene siglos de estar apareciéndose a los cristianos. Aún antes de que fuese asunta al cielo, ella ya se le había aparecido al apóstol Santiago en Zaragoza, España. Según una antigua leyenda, Santiago llegó a tierra española en el año 40 para predicar el Evangelio. Tuvo poco éxito y desanimado pensaba sacudirse de los pies el polvo de aquella tierra y buscar convertir otras gentes. Mientras estaba en oración, María, la madre de Jesús, se le apareció con palabras de consuelo, ánimo y un pequeño obsequio. Le dio una imagen de ella misma sobre un pilar y con el Niño Jesús en brazos.

En esa tierra ella pidió la construcción de un templo donde ella misma sería altar para la gloria de Dios. Santiago mismo construyó la primera iglesia donde hoy se encuentra una gran basílica en honor de Nuestra Señora del Pilar. En el siglo XVIII, el Papa Clemente XII declaró el 12 de octubre como su fiesta en memoria de la llegada de los europeos al continente americano. De María vienen los principios del Día de la Raza.

## Los Siete Sacramentos: Vida con Cristo Matrimonio

1659 San Pablo dice: "Maridos, amad a vuestras mujeres como Cristo amó a la Iglesia [...] Gran misterio es éste, lo digo con respecto a Cristo y la Iglesia" (Ef 5,25.32).

1660 La alianza matrimonial, por la que un hombre y una mujer constituyen una íntima comunidad de vida y de amor, fue fundada y dotada de sus leyes propias por el Creador. Por su naturaleza está ordenada al bien de los cónyuges así como a la generación y educación de los hijos. Entre bautizados, el matrimonio ha sido elevado por Cristo Señor a la dignidad de sacramento (cf. GS 48,1; CIC can. 1055, §1).

1661 El sacramento del Matrimonio significa la unión de Cristo con la Iglesia. Da a los esposos la gracia de amarse con el amor con que Cristo amó a su Iglesia; la gracia del sacramento perfecciona así el amor humano de los esposos, reafirma su unidad indisoluble y los santifica en el camino de la vida eterna (cf. Concilio de Trento: DS 1799).

1662 El matrimonio se funda en el consentimiento de los contrayentes, es decir, en la voluntad de darse mutua y definitivamente con el fin de vivir una alianza de amor fiel y fecundo.
