**The Seven Sacraments: Life with Christ  
Matrimony**

1663 Since marriage establishes the couple in a public state of life in the Church, it is fitting that its celebration be public, in the framework of a liturgical celebration, before the priest (or a witness authorized by the Church), the witnesses, and the assembly of the faithful.

1664 Unity, indissolubility, and openness to fertility are essential to marriage. Polygamy is incompatible with the unity of marriage; divorce separates what God has joined together; the refusal of fertility turns married life away from its "supreme gift," the child (GS 50 # 1).

1665 The remarriage of persons divorced from a living, lawful spouse contravenes the plan and law of God as taught by Christ. They are not separated from the Church, but they cannot receive Eucharistic communion. They will lead Christian lives especially by educating their children in the faith.

1666 The Christian home is the place where children receive the first proclamation of the faith. For this reason the family home is rightly called "the domestic church," a community of grace and prayer, a school of human virtues and of Christian charity.

(The philosophers) took (Paul) and led him to the Areopagus and said, 'May we learn what this new teaching is that you speak of?' (Acts 17:18-19)?

Besides the murder of many innocent people, particularly Christians and Kurds, ISIS has also tried to erase history. ISIS has tried to wipe out every vestige of non-Muslim history, art, and structure. ISIS destroyed a centuries old statue of the Buddha. They have dismantled Roman ruins from the 3<sup>rd</sup> century. They had ruined countless Catholic churches some of which are centuries old. They have forced Christians who have been a part of the landscape since the time of the Apostles out of their cities and villages. In other words whatever is offensive to them has to be destroyed, erased from history.

This makes me think of what is happening in the USA today. If someone or some group finds a statue offensive, then the powers that be remove it regardless that it may be meaningful to others, its importance to history or the lessons it teaches. My history teachers always taught me that if we forget our history, particularly the bad parts, then we are doomed to repeat it. Yes, the Confederacy supported slavery but General Lee and the like were not necessarily evil. Unfortunately at the time slavery was still accepted by many and was not seen as a moral evil, not unlike abortion today. I hope that will change. As for the statues of Confederates I am neither for nor against them. If they stand or are taken down it does not affect me or my friends. For many it is an important issue so before anything is done a civil discourse is needed so that in the end people understand one another.

Now it hits home when some people want to remove statues of Christopher Columbus. He is an Italian who sailed for the Spanish crown. Many, and I believe erroneously, call him a murderer and enslaver. I read his journal and found no such inkling to these accusations. In fact he expressed a great admiration for the natives he encountered. They were docile and as he saw them amenable to becoming Christians. Yes, many unexpected and unfortunate crimes were committed. When Columbus brought some of the Indians to Spain in chains, the Queen reprimanded him for putting her subjects in chains.

The conquistadors were no angels. Many were greedy, looking for gold at the expense of the Indians' lives. They were put in chain gangs and forced labor to retrieve gold. However Bishop de las Casas wrote a letter, *the Destruction of the Indies* to the King of Spain. So moved was the king that he prohibited the enslavement and mistreatment of the Indian. And while crimes, intended or not, were committed against the Indians, there were also benefits. The Spanish intermarried with the natives and a new race was created, the Mestizo. Most of the Hispanics we meet today are of this new race. Also Catholicism was introduced and many converts were added. In Mexico, the human sacrifices were ended and Montezuma's son graduated from the new Holy Cross University.

Ultimately who can determine what is offensive or not? I find pornography offensive, dangerous, and all too available even to children, but it seems no one else is offended and so it endures. Some find a Crèche offensive and it has been removed from many public displays but I find it to be a symbol of God's love and gift of

### **IS YOUR MARRIAGE A VALID SACRAMENT?**

If you were married civilly, that is not in the Catholic Church before a priest or deacon, it is not a valid sacramental marriage. This is an impediment to receiving the Eucharist and other sacraments. For a marriage to be valid in the Catholic Church, the marriage must be in a Catholic Church or Chapel and officiated by an authorized Catholic priest or deacon along with 2 witnesses. (There are limited interfaith exceptions with proper permission.)

I invite you to speak with one of our priests if there are any questions or if indeed you wish to validate your marriage. The process can be very simple and your marriage will now be blessed by the Church. Once the Marriage is convalidated, that is blessed in the Church, you will be able to receive the Eucharist, make Sacramental Confession, and receive the other sacraments.

### TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

En 2006, en la plaza de Taos se erigió una estatua de bronce que conmemora al "cura de Taos", Antonio José Martínez, un sacerdote recordado como controversial ante varios gobiernos por defender a su pueblo.

Él fue sacerdote en Taos, Nuevo México cuando era territorio español, luego mexicano y finalmente cuando pasa a manos de EE. UU. Durante la época española y mexicana Antonio estableció escuelas para niños y niñas y fundó un seminario para preparar un clero nativo. En 1830 empezó a imprimir libros y estableció el primer periódico Nuevo Mexicano. De esta manera estableció Taos como un centro de educación.

En 1851 llegaron los representantes del gobierno estadounidense con la intención de "americanizar" a los nuevos mexicanos prohibiéndoles sus tradiciones declarando que eran ignorantes y supersticiosas.

Antonio José contradijo este movimiento convirtiendo su seminario en una escuela de leyes. Decía que el gobierno de EE. UU es un burro que debe ser montado por abogados. Muchos se opusieron a su obra pero él continuó luchando por su pueblo hasta su muerte en 1867. Su tumba lo declara: "La honra de su país".

## Los Siete Sacramentos: Vida con Cristo Matrimonio

1663 Dado que el matrimonio establece a los cónyuges en un estado público de vida en la Iglesia, la celebración del mismo se hace ordinariamente de modo público, en el marco de una celebración litúrgica, ante el sacerdote (o el testigo cualificado de la Iglesia), los testigos y la asamblea de los fieles.

1664 La unidad, la indisolubilidad, y la apertura a la fecundidad son esenciales al matrimonio. La poligamia es incompatible con la unidad del matrimonio; el divorcio separa lo que Dios ha unido; el rechazo de la fecundidad priva la vida conyugal de su "don más excelente", el hijo (GS 50,1).

1665 Contraer un nuevo matrimonio por parte de los divorciados mientras viven sus cónyuges legítimos contradice el plan y la ley de Dios enseñados por Cristo. Los que viven en esta situación no están separados de la Iglesia pero no pueden acceder a la comunión eucarística. Pueden vivir su vida cristiana sobre todo educando a sus hijos en la fe.

1666 El hogar cristiano es el lugar en que los hijos reciben el primer anuncio de la fe. Por eso la casa familiar es llamada justamente "Iglesia doméstica", comunidad de gracia y de oración, escuela de virtudes humanas y de caridad cristiana.
