**Life with Christ: The Commandments  
 The Second Commandment**

You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain.

2160 "O Lord, our Lord, how majestic is your name in all the earth" (Ps 8:1)!  
 2161 The second commandment enjoins respect for the Lord's name. the name of the Lord is holy.  
 2162 The second commandment forbids every improper use of God's name. Blasphemy is the use of the name of God, of Jesus Christ, of the Virgin Mary, and of the saints in an offensive way.  
 2163 False oaths call on God to be witness to a lie. Perjury is a grave offence against the Lord who is always faithful to his promises.  
 2164 "Do not swear whether by the Creator, or any creature, except truthfully, of necessity, and with reverence" (St. Ignatius of Loyola, Spiritual Exercises, 38).  
 2165 In Baptism, the Christian receives his name in the Church. Parents, godparents, and the pastor are to see that he be given a Christian name. the patron saint provides a model of charity and the assurance of his prayer.  
 2166 The Christian begins his prayers and activities with the Sign of the Cross: "in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen."  
 2167 God calls each one by name (cf Isa 43:1).

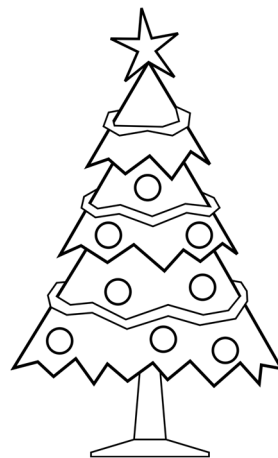
## TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Today we have a modern feast, less than a century old, and placed at the very end of the liturgical cycle of Sundays only in 1969. In 1925, the world was in a sorry state from the vantage point of Pope Pius XI. The winds of war had swept the map of Europe raw, and ancient Christian dynasties had fallen in Russia and Spain. Although the Great War had ended, wars were breaking out everywhere. Fascism was already in control in Italy, and Nazism was on the horizon for Germany. The disorder making its claim on the human race was, the pope felt, an insult to the Divine Order. Pius XI designated the last Sunday in October as a day of universal recognition of the kingship of Christ. Creating this feast was an act of bravery by the pope, who was standing up against idolatry of the state and the dehumanizing forces of the modern world, things that are not hard to detect in today's world as well. In 1969 it seemed fitting to move the feast to a place of honor at the end of the year, a way of summing up the whole movement of the liturgical year toward the perfection of the Kingdom of God. In recent decades, many Protestant churches have adopted this day from the new Roman calendar, so it is shared now with the Church of England, the Episcopal, Presbyterian, and Lutheran churches, and others.

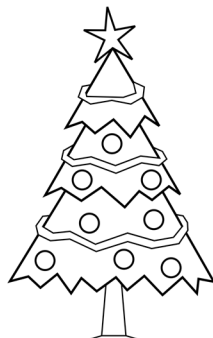

### Vida con Cristo: Los Mandamientos El Segundo Mandamiento

«No tomarás en falso el nombre del Señor tu Dios»

2160 "Señor, Dios Nuestro, ¡qué admirable es tu nombre por toda la tierra!" (Sal 8, 2).

2161 El segundo mandamiento prescribe respetar el nombre del Señor. El nombre del Señor es santo.

2162 El segundo mandamiento prohíbe todo uso inconveniente del nombre de Dios. La blasfemia consiste en usar de una manera injuriosa el nombre de Dios, de Jesucristo, de la Virgen María y de los santos.

2163 El juramento en falso invoca a Dios como testigo de una mentira. El perjurio es una falta grave contra el Señor, que es siempre fiel a sus promesas.

2164 "No jurar ni por Criador ni por criatura, si no fuere con verdad, necesidad y reverencia" (San Ignacio de Loyola, Ejercicios Espirituales, 38).

2165 En el Bautismo, la Iglesia da un nombre al cristiano. Los padres, los padrinos y el párroco deben procurar que se dé un nombre cristiano al que es bautizado. El patrocinio de un santo ofrece un modelo de caridad y asegura su intercesión.

2166 El cristiano comienza sus oraciones y sus acciones haciendo la señal de la cruz "en el nombre del Padre y del Hijo y del Espíritu Santo. Amén".

2167 Dios llama a cada uno por su nombre (cf Is 43, 1).
