**Life with Christ: The Commandments  
The Ninth & Tenth Commandments**

“You shall not covet your neighbor's house; you shall not covet your neighbor's wife, or his manservant, or his maidservant, or his ox, or his ass, or anything that is your neighbor's.”

“Everyone who looks at a woman lustfully has already committed adultery with her in his heart” (Mt 5:28).

2529 The ninth commandment warns against lust or carnal concupiscence.

2530 The struggle against carnal lust involves purifying the heart and practicing temperance.

2531 Purity of heart will enable us to see God: it enables us even now to see things according to God.

2532 Purification of the heart demands prayer, the practice of chastity, purity of intention and of vision.

2533 Purity of heart requires the modesty which is patience, decency, and discretion. Modesty protects the intimate center of the person.

“Where your treasure is, there will your heart be also” (Mt 6:21).

2552 The tenth commandment forbids avarice arising from a passion for riches and their attendant power.

2553 Envy is sadness at the sight of another's goods and the immoderate desire to have them for oneself. It is a capital sin.

2554 The baptized person combats envy through good-will, humility, and abandonment to the providence of God.

2555 Christ's faithful “have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires” (Gal 5:24); they are led by the Spirit and follow his desires.

2556 Detachment from riches is necessary for entering the Kingdom of heaven. “Blessed are the poor in spirit.”

2557 “I want to see God” expresses the true desire of man. Thirst for God is quenched by the water of eternal life (cf In 4:14).

## “Avoid immorality” (1 Cor 6:18).

Fornication, adultery, self-abuse, pornography, lack of custody of the eyes, etc. are not only a profanation of the body but also of the Temple of the Holy Spirit—for God dwells in the soul, through grace, as in a temple. On the day of our baptism we were incorporated into the Body of Christ with Christ Jesus as the Head of this mystical Body. In that, our body belonged to Christ completely. “Soul and body, flesh and bones, all our senses and faculties. If one has the spirit of God, chastity is not a troublesome and humiliating burden, but a joyful affirmation. Will-power, dominion, self-mastery do not come from the flesh or from the instinct. They come from the will, especially if it is united to the Will of God. In order to be chaste (and not merely continent) we must subject our passions to reason, but for a noble motive, namely, to the promptings of Love” (St. Jose Maria Escriva). Without this Love, we fall. If we want to avoid the temptations of the flesh, we must take heart and trust in the Love that God gives us and fly far from the temptations and toward God, in pursuit of Love.

St. Thomas Aquinas said that we must shun sexual immorality. We must run as fast as we can when tempted against chastity. “Temptations against other virtues can be overcome by putting up resistance, but in this case “one does not win by putting up resistance, because the more one thinks about the thing, the more influenced one becomes; one wins by fleeing—that is, by avoiding unclean thoughts completely and by avoiding all occasions of sin” (St. Thomas Aquinas).

St. John Vianney outlined the approach we ought to take in confronting the lust that crouches like a hungry lion ready to devour us:

1. Be very vigilant about  
what you look at – (pornography, immodesty)  
what you think – (fantasy, lust)  
what you say & do – (suggestive talk, innuendo, improper touch, etc.)
2. Have recourse to prayer – pray, pray, pray
3. Frequent the Sacraments worthily – be sure to confess serious sin before receiving the other sacraments
4. Fly from whatever may tempt us to sin – we cannot defeat it, we must run
5. Great devotion to the BVM – rosary, angelus, devotion, etc.

“If we do all that no matter what our enemies do, no matter how frail this virtue be, we can be quite sure of holding on to it” (St. John Vianney).

As St. Paul said, “Avoid immorality. Every other sin a person commits is outside the body, but the immoral person sins against his own body.”

VATICAN CITY, JANUARY 7, 2018 The address Pope Francis gave before praying the midday Angelus with those gathered in St. Peter’s Square.

Dear Brothers and Sisters, good morning!

Today’s feast of the Baptism of the Lord ends the Christmas season and invites us to think of our Baptism. Jesus willed to receive the baptism preached and administered by John the Baptist in the river Jordan. It was a baptism of penance: all those who approached it expressed the desire to be purified from sin and, with God’s help, committed themselves to begin a new life.

We understand then the great humility of Jesus, He who had not sinned, put himself in the queue with the penitents, mixing among them, to be baptized in the waters of the river. What humility Jesus has! And, by doing so, He manifested what we celebrated at Christmas: Jesus’ willingness to immerse Himself in the river of humanity, to take upon himself the failures and weaknesses of men, to share their desire of liberation and to overcome all that distances one from God and renders brothers strangers. As at Bethlehem, along the banks of the Jordan God keeps His promise to take charge of the human being’s fate, and Jesus is the tangible and definitive sign of it. He took charge of all of us, He takes charge of all of us, in life, in the days.

Today’s Gospel stresses that Jesus “when He came up out of the water, immediately He saw the Heavens opened and the Spirit descending upon Him like a dove” (Mark 1:10). The Holy Spirit, who had worked from the beginning of Creation and had guided Moses and the people in the desert, now descends in fullness upon Jesus to give Him the strength to carry out His mission in the world. The Spirit is the artifice of Jesus’ Baptism and also of our Baptism. It’s the Spirit that opens the eyes of our heart to truth, to the whole truth. He pushes our life on the path of charity. He is the gift that the Father gave to each one of us on the day of our Baptism. He, the Spirit, transmits to us the tenderness of divine forgiveness. And it is also He, the Holy Spirit, that makes the revealing Word of God resound: “Thou art my beloved Son” (v. 11

The feast of Jesus’ Baptism invites every Christian to remember his own Baptism. I can’t ask you the question if you remember the day of your Baptism, because the majority of you were babies, like me; we were baptized as babies. However, I can ask you another question? Do you know what day you were baptized? Each one of you think about it. And if you don’t know the date or have forgotten it, when you go home ask your mother, your grandmother, your uncle, your aunt, your grandfather, your godfather, your godmother: what day? And we must always have that date in our memory, because it’s a date of celebration, it’s the date of our initial sanctification; it’s the date in which the Father gave us the Holy Spirit who pushes us to walk; it’s the date of the great forgiveness. Don’t forget: what’s the date of my Baptism?

We invoke the maternal protection of Mary Most Holy so that all Christians can understand increasingly the gift of Baptism and commit themselves to live it with coherence, witnessing the love of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

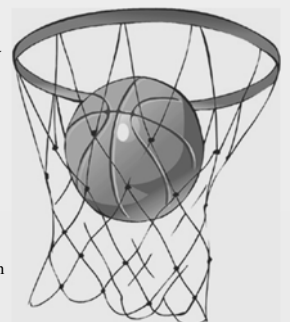

**THE LAMB OF GOD**

"Behold the Lamb of God!" We hear this phrase every Sunday at Mass, but there's a good chance that many Roman Catholics do not know who in the Bible originally spoke it. The phrase appears only in the Gospel of John, on the lips of John the Baptist, who utters it twice. In today's Gospel reading, John proclaims Jesus as the Lamb of God, and two of John's own disciples then follow Christ. A little bit later Andrew, who heard John and then followed Jesus, brings his brother Simon to be re-named Cephas, or Peter. A careful look at these Bible verses shows us the mission of everyone baptized into the Body of Christ: we must always proclaim our faith in Christ, so that others will follow him. We may not know how the will of God might work through those we bring to Christ; that is not the point. The point is that our ongoing mission as a church is to bring others to Christ, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world.

Según una vieja costumbre latina, no se les debe llamar por nombre a los niños mientras todavía están en el vientre de su madre. Si tu hijo nace el 16 de enero puedes nombrarlo: Fulgencio, Acursio, Adiuto, Frisio y Tolomeo. O si es niña, Priscila o el femenino de los previos.

2529 El noveno mandamiento pone en guardia contra el desorden o concupiscencia de la carne.

2530 La lucha contra la concupiscencia de la carne pasa por la purificación del corazón y por la práctica de la templanza

2531 La pureza del corazón nos alcanzará el ver a Dios: nos da desde ahora la capacidad de ver según Dios todas las cosas.

2532 La purificación del corazón es imposible sin la oración, la práctica de la castidad y la pureza de intención y de mirada.

2533 La pureza del corazón requiere el pudor, que es paciencia, modestia y discreción. El pudor preserva la intimidad de la persona.

“Donde [...] está tu tesoro allí estará tu corazón” (Mt 6,21).

2552 El décimo mandamiento prohíbe el deseo desordenado, nacido de la pasión immoderada de las riquezas y del poder.

2553 La envidia es la tristeza experimentada ante el bien del prójimo y el deseo desordenado de apropiárselo. Es un pecado capital.

2554 El bautizado combate la envidia mediante la caridad, la humildad y el abandono en la providencia de Dios.

2555 Los fieles cristianos “han crucificado la carne con sus pasiones y sus concupiscencias” (Ga 5,24); son guiados por el Espíritu y siguen sus deseos.

2556 El desprendimiento de las riquezas es necesario para entrar en el Reino de los cielos. “Bienaventurados los pobres de corazón” (Mt 5, 3).

2557 El hombre que anhela dice: “Quiero ver a Dios”. La sed de Dios es saciada por el agua de la vida (cf Jn 4,14).
