“Repent, and believe in the gospel” (Mark 1:15).

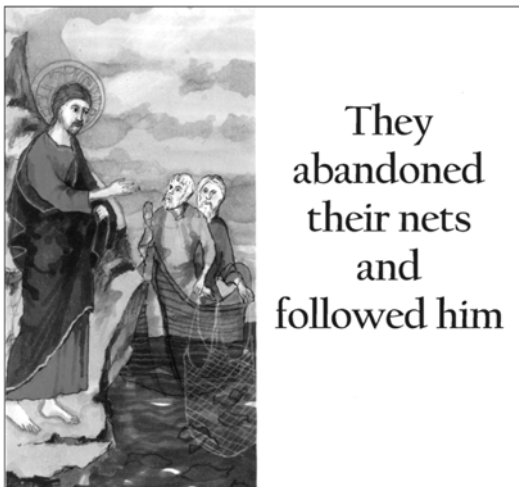
Gospel. What is gospel? For that we need to look into the New Testament. The word in Greek is *evangelios* which simply translated is good message or good news. In this word we see the word *angel*, remember an angel is the messenger of God. And so the news that Christ proclaims is good and is from God. In the old English good was spelled “god” and the word for news was *spell*, so the good news becomes *godspell* which morphs into Gospel.

Imagine the first newscast. Was it Adam and Eve enjoy bliss in the Garden? No. It was: EVE EATS THE APPLE. ADAM JOINS IN. MAN CONDEMNED TO DEATH. Common knowledge dictates that news is inherently bad or evil. Did you hear the news? Immediately our thoughts go to something tragic. In our newspapers and television we hear all about what is going on in the world: wars, terrorism, natural disasters, foul language, crimes, protests etc. It’s what sells after all. If there is something good to speak about it gets a special page in the paper. What I am getting at is that when Christ comes to proclaim his message, he must clearly define it as GOOD. Only what is good can come from GOD. Often when someone is asked, ‘How are you?’ they respond, “Good.” I quickly jump in with the retort, “Only God is good.” That’s from our Lord’s own lips (see Mark 10:18).

If what Christ proclaims is the good news as opposed to the daily news, then we have something to rejoice about. What sparks my interest is that even though we desire the Good News, when we hear the bad news our curiosity peaks and we listen in. Our desire for the base in life due to our concupiscence is probably what draws us into gossip and our willingness to listen to lies, fabrications, and the latest dirt on celebrities (TMZ).

Yes, ever since Adam and Eve desired rather than loved, we have been starved for the Good News. Finally in the completion of days, God himself came to proclaim the good news so that we were no longer imprisoned by our passions and weaknesses. He has liberated us from the clasp of the Evil One and has opened up the way to the tree of life. The Good News is this: For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him (John 3:16-17).

So when we’re inclined to hear the news or spread it around, let’s turn off the radio, hang up the phone and say a prayer. Read the Bible, do a good deed and proclaim the Good News to anyone who will listen. In other words, abandon your nets that entangle you in the ways of the world, and follow Jesus.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

One of the most unusual Catholic churches in the world is in Amsterdam: Our Lord in the Attic, or as the locals say, “Ons Lieve Heer op Solder.” What looks like a beautiful narrow brick mansion alongside a canal is a clever disguise for a very well-preserved seventeenth-century home and a secret church. During the Reformation, the Netherlands was divided into Protestant Holland and the Spanish Netherlands, now known as Belgium, a Catholic stronghold. Protestant reformers seized all the Catholic parishes in Holland and “de-Catholicized” them. New laws forbade the celebration of the Mass in public. St. Nicholas Church was renamed “Old Church” by the new owners, and the dispossessed Catholics got to work “hiding” St. Nicholas Parish in the upper floors of this mansion. Other Catholics did the same thing, but this is the only hidden church that survives today. Sunday Mass is still celebrated here.

It’s a beautiful hideaway, with nothing spared in regard to marble, gilding, a pipe organ, and classic Dutch painting. A few steps away, the Old Church, begun in 1250, stands emptied of the statues and carvings of its Catholic days, its windows replaced by plain glass. The new tenants gave up when it came to the ceiling, which is still painted with saints, biblical scenes, and merchant ships. The Dutch reformers were “tolerant” sorts, and as long as the Catholics kept out of sight, they were out of mind. Catholicism was at last tolerated in Holland after 1853, but in 1924 when the International Eucharistic Congress was held in Amsterdam, processions of Catholics were still forbidden in the streets. Today, Roman Catholics are about 19 percent of the population, and there’s no need for any of them to hide in the attic.

TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

La cruda realidad de nuestro continente es que América es tierra de mártires. Esta semana recordamos el martirio del indígena quechua Segundo Francisco Guamán de Ecuador. Como la mayor parte de los indígenas americanos, los quechuas consideran la tierra como pertenencia de la comunidad humana. De ella come y vive todo ser viviente. Desde la llegada de los europeos la tierra americana ha sido explotada y con ella los indígenas también.

El siglo pasado unos campesinos ecuatorianos dirigidos por Segundo Francisco comenzaron a reunirse con el Ministerio de Agricultura y el Instituto Ecuatoriano de Reforma Agraria y Colonización. Que agencias civiles tomen interés por los derechos del indígena es siempre "buena nueva". Lamentablemente lo que es "buena nueva" para la muchedumbre pobre es "mala noticia" para los poderosos. Uno de éstos decidió vengarse en contra de los campesinos. En su rabia, asesinó al joven Segundo Francisco de sólo 25 años de edad. Pero su muerte, como la de todo mártir, no fue en vano. Su sangre derramada sobre la madre tierra ha ido sembrando más movimientos por los derechos de los indígenas.
