**Life with Christ: The Creed
I believe in God the Creator**

315 In the creation of the world and of man, God gave the first and universal witness to his almighty love and his wisdom, the first proclamation of the "plan of his loving goodness", which finds its goal in the new creation in Christ.

316 Though the work of creation is attributed to the Father in particular, it is equally a truth of faith that the Father, Son and Holy Spirit together are the one, indivisible principle of creation.

317 God alone created the universe, freely, directly and without any help.

318 No creature has the infinite power necessary to "create" in the proper sense of the word, that is, to produce and give being to that which had in no way possessed it to call into existence "out of nothing").

319 God created the world to show forth and communicate his glory. That his creatures should share in his truth, goodness and beauty - this is the glory for which God created them.

320 God created the universe and keeps it in existence by his Word, the Son "upholding the universe by his word of power" (Heb 1:3), and by his Creator Spirit, the giver of life.

321 Divine providence consists of the dispositions by which God guides all his creatures with wisdom and love to their ultimate end.

322 Christ invites us to filial trust in the providence of our heavenly Father (Mt 6:26-34), and St. Peter the apostle repeats: "Cast all your anxieties on him, for he cares about you" (I Pt 5:7)

323 Divine providence works also through the actions of creatures. To human beings God grants the ability to co-operate freely with his plans.

324 The fact that God permits physical and even moral evil is a mystery that God illuminates by his Son Jesus Christ who died and rose to vanquish evil. Faith gives us the certainty that God would not permit an evil if he did not cause a good to come from that very evil, by ways that we shall fully know only in eternal life.

Let Peace begin with Me

I have always been a strong contender that the evil of society will not change until we change the hearts and minds of the individual. How can there be peace in the world if families are not at peace? How can there be justice if we treat our neighbor as a stranger or enemy? How can we stop the abortions if we have an extreme view of rights?

My mom always reminded us that charity begins at home and not only at home but more deeply in the heart. We are all in need of a metanoia, an inner conversion of the heart toward Jesus who is Love. When we have that personal loving relationship with our Creator, we can then love his creation. Our relationship with God fortifies virtue and character. Virtue is so important in fact that we speak of the gifts and fruits of the Holy Spirit and the theological virtues we receive at our baptism: faith, hope and charity.

Gone in our society today is any sense of personal responsibility. How often have you heard that a criminal is only a criminal because he/she had a bad childhood or grew up in the wrong neighborhood? We are constantly looking for societal causes to our woes rather than a lack of virtue and character on the part of the individual. The Church teaches that the home is the domestic church. It is at home that we learn to be good citizens, to be people of integrity, virtue and good character. Unfortunately today too many children are not growing up in intact homes. Parents, especially fathers, instill virtue and build character in their children.

While a stable society is important, a stable family is vital. And a family that practices its faith assures us of children who are mature and virtuous, and a mature adult is a stalwart of a good society. And a good society in turn fosters family and faith. Thus a faithful intact family raises good citizens and the good citizens of virtue and good character are the bedrock of a stable society that can in turn support the family. A society however that opts to become the family, the teacher of morals and virtue becomes a tyrant. It is not a free society but one that believes it needs to cure the societal woes (racism, sexism, homophobia, abortion, etc.) by coopting the family as is done in communist countries and I dare say is happening here and now.

To preserve the freedom that we have in the US, we must have faith in God and solid families so that children mature into virtuous citizens not abusing their freedoms but exercising their freedoms with modicum, self-restraint, and with respect due to one's neighbor. To practice freedom without morals becomes no more than licentiousness where one, in doing as he pleases, only seeks to tolerate his neighbor rather than love and respect him. Hence the isms rise and the charity falls and society becomes the ruler/teacher rather than the servant of the people.

Let us pray that the family is restored and the faith of the people is revived for without these two, the state, the government, the society, the tyrant or whatever name it goes by, will demand of us subservience for the good of “society”.

ARCHDIOCESE OF NEWARK 2018 LENTEN REGULATIONS

1. The days of both Fast and Abstinence during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the “paschal fast” to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection.
2. The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence.
3. On a day of Fast, only one (1) full meal is permitted, and two (2) smaller meals, which, if added together, would not exceed the main meal in quantity.
4. Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast.
5. On a day of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of abstinence.
6. The obligation to observe the laws of Fast and Abstinence is a serious obligation.
7. The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.
8. The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty*) extends from the First Sunday of Lent, February 18, 2018 to The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, May 27, 2018.

*Canon 920, § 1. All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year.

¿QUE PASA?

Las Reglas de Cuaresma

1. Los días de Ayuno y Abstinencia durante la Cuaresma son el Miércoles de Ceniza y el Viernes Santo. Si es posible, el ayuno del Viernes Santo se continúa hasta la Vigilia de Pascua como el "ayuno pascual" para honrar el sufrimiento y la muerte del Señor Jesús, y para prepararnos a participar más plenamente y celebrar más fácilmente su Resurrección. Los otros viernes de Cuaresma son días de abstinencia.

2. En un día de ayuno, sólo una (1) comida completa está permitido, y 2 comidas más pequeñas que, si se sumaran, no superaría la comida principal en cantidad. Aquellos entre las edades de 18 y 59 años son obligados a ayunar. En un día de abstinencia, no se come carne. Los que han llegado a la edad de 14 años están obligados por la ley de la abstinencia.

3. La obligación de observar las leyes de Ayuno y Abstinencia "sustancialmente" o en su conjunto es una obligación seria.

4. Los viernes del año, fuera de la Cuaresma, son designados como días de penitencia, pero cada individuo puede sustituir a la tradicional abstinencia de comer carne por alguna otra práctica de las privaciones voluntarias como penitencia.

5. El tiempo para cumplir con el precepto pascual (Deber Pascual *) se extiende desde el primer domingo de Cuaresma, 18 de febrero 2018 a la solemnidad de la Santísima Trinidad, 27 de mayo 2018.

*Canon 920, § 1. *Todo fiel, después de la primera comunión, esta obligado a comulgar por lo menos una vez al año.*

(Confesión Sacramental es necesario si uno es consciente de haber cometido un pecado grave)

Vida con Cristo: El Creador Creador en el Creador

315 En la creación del mundo y del hombre, Dios ofreció el primero y universal testimonio de su amor todopoderoso y de su sabiduría, el primer anuncio de su "designio benevolente" que encuentra su fin en la nueva creación en Cristo.

316 Aunque la obra de la creación se atribuya particularmente al Padre, es igualmente verdad de fe que el Padre, el Hijo y el Espíritu Santo son el principio único e indivisible de la creación.

317 Sólo Dios ha creado el universo, libremente, sin ninguna ayuda.

318 Ninguna criatura tiene el poder infinito que es necesario para "crear" en el sentido propio de la palabra, es decir, de producir y de dar el ser a lo que no lo tenía en modo alguno (llamar a la existencia de la nada) (cf Congregación para la Educación Católica, Decreto del 27 de julio de 1914, Theses approbatae philosophiae tomisticae: DS 3624).

319 Dios creó el mundo para manifestar y comunicar su gloria. La gloria para la que Dios creó a sus criaturas consiste en que tengan parte en su verdad, su bondad y su belleza.

320 Dios, que ha creado el universo, lo mantiene en la existencia por su Verbo, "el Hijo que sostiene todo con su palabra poderosa" (Hb 1, 3) y por su Espíritu Creador que da la vida.

321 La divina providencia consiste en las disposiciones por las que Dios conduce con sabiduría y amor todas las criaturas hasta su fin último.

322 Cristo nos invita al abandono filial en la providencia de nuestro Padre celestial (cf Mt 6, 26-34) y el apóstol san Pedro insiste: "Confíadle todas vuestras preocupaciones pues él cuida de vosotros" (1 P 5, 7; cf Sal 55, 23).

323 La providencia divina actúa también por la acción de las criaturas. A los seres humanos Dios les concede cooperar libremente en sus designios.

324 La permisión divina del mal físico y del mal moral es misterio que Dios esclarece por su Hijo, Jesucristo, muerto y resucitado para vencer el mal. La fe nos da la certeza de que Dios no permitiría el mal si no hiciera salir el bien del mal mismo, por caminos que nosotros sólo conoceremos plenamente en la vida eterna.
