esus remained in the desert for forty days.

On my recent adventure to the Holy Land we were fortunate enough to go to the site of the Baptism of the Lord in the River Jordan. It was not very impressive as rivers go, the Hackensack River is wider and clearer! It was the rainy season; the river was swollen, over flowing her banks. Immediately across the river was the country of Jordan with its flag proudly displayed. On both sides of the river were armed guards protecting the border. There was also an impressive church across the Jordan.

As the Scriptures account, Jesus was baptized in the Jordan not to make himself holy, but to make holy the waters of baptism so that we who are immersed in the sacred waters can become sons and daughters of the Father, co-heirs with the Son and united in the Spirit. After we left the Jordan having renewed our baptismal vows we headed up to Jerusalem, literally. The elevation of the Jordan near Jericho is 846 feet below sea level and the Holy City is 2,474 feet above sea level that is a steady ascent of 3,320 feet (2/3 mile). Fortunately we were in a bus.

Now the land between Jerusalem and Jericho is mostly desert, not like the Mojave or Sahara, but more like the Arizona desert, a wilderness. It was barren, dry, and somewhat surreal. In Jesus' time lions and other dangerous beasts roamed the wilderness; it was dangerous. We could see that after leaving the Jordan, that Jesus, prompted by the Holy Spirit fasted and prayed in the desert. He was discerning what had just happened to him at the Jordan. Some believe that Jesus being God knew everything, others say he had like all human beings, to learn and discover who he is and what his mission is. God after all spoke the words, "Behold my Son," and so he went to pray.

We all are called to be sons and daughters of God and must discern our mission. We can only do this through prayer. We must spend that "desert" time with the Lord. In the quiet of the desert can we hear God speak to us. Some call it contemplation others call it centering prayer but regardless of the terms we use or the technique, we must be still and know God. Today's milieu is noisy, distractive, too busy. We have smartphones that make us dumb, we have TV and radio that fill us with anxiety, we have chatrooms and Facebook that clutter our hearts with gossip and we're bombarded with all sorts of sensuality and false conceptions of sexuality. These things are of the Adversary (aka Satan). If he can keep our hearts and minds preoccupied with the inane and insane, then we are not listening to God. As the men and women who found the city life distractive and went to desert monasteries to pray, we must put aside the distractions of modernity and go to the desert of our hearts so that we can hear god and respond to the mission he has called us to fulfill.

Enough said. Let's get praying in the wilderness of our hearts, before we get lost in the wildness of the world.





¿QUE PASA?

Las Reglas de Cuaresma

- 1. Los días de Ayuno y Abstinencia durante la Cuaresma son el Miércoles de Ceniza y el Viernes Santo. Si es posible, el ayuno del Viernes Santo se continúa hasta la Vigilia de Pascua como el "ayuno pascual" para honrar el sufrimiento y la muerte del Señor Jesús, y para prepararnos a participar más plenamente y celebrar más fácilmente su Resurrección. Los otros viernes de Cuaresma son días de abstinencia.
- **2.** En un día de ayuno, sólo una (1) comida completa está permitido, y 2 comidas más pequeñas que, si se sumaran, no superaría la comida principal en cantidad. Aquellos entre las edades de 18 y 59 años son obligados a ayunar. En un día de abstinencia, no se come carne . Los que han llegado a la edad de 14 años están obligados por la ley de la abstinencia.
- **3.** La obligación de observar las leyes de Ayuno y Abstinencia "sustancialmente" o en su conjunto es una obligación seria.
- **4.** Los viernes del año , fuera de la Cuaresma, son designados como días de penitencia , pero cada individuo puede sustituir a la tradicional abstinencia de comer carne por alguna otra práctica de las privaciones voluntarias como penitencia.
- **5.** El tiempo para cumplir con el precepto pascual (Deber Pascual *) se extiende desde el primer domingo de Cuaresma, 18 de febrero 2018 a la solemnidad de la Santísima Trinidad, 27 de mayo 2018.
- *Canon 920, § 1. Todo fiel, después de la primera comunión, esta obligado a comulgar por lo menos una vez al año.

(Confesión Sacramental es necesario si uno es consciente de haber cometido un pecado grave)
