Life with Christ: The Creed The Fall

413 "God did not make death, and he does not delight in the death of the living. It was through the devil's envy that death entered theworld". 414 Satan or the devil and the other demons are fallen angels who have freely refused to serve God and his plan. Their choice against God is definitive. They try to associate man in their revolt against God. 415 "Although set by God in a state of rectitude man, enticed by the evil one, abused his freedom at the very start of history. He lifted himself up against God, and sought to attain his goal apart from him". 416 By his sin Adam, as the first man, lost the original holiness and justice he had received from God, not only for himself but for all human beings. 417 Adam and Eve transmitted to their descendants human nature wounded by their own first sin and hence deprived of original holiness and justice; this deprivation is called "original sin". 418 As a result of original sin, human nature is weakened in its powers, subject to ignorance, suffering and the domination of death, and inclined to sin (this inclination is called "concupiscence"). 419 "We therefore hold, with the Council of Trent, that original sin is transmitted with human nature, "by propagation, not by imitation" and that it is. . . 'proper to each'" (Paul VI). 420 The victory that Christ won over sin has given us greater blessings than those which sin had taken from us: "where sin increased, grace abounded all the more" (Rom 5:20). 421 Christians believe that "the world has been established and kept in being by the Creator's love; has fallen into slavery to sin but has been set free by Christ, crucified and risen to break the power of the evil one. . ." <u>Catechism of the Catholic Church</u>, 2nd Ed. Libreria Editrice Vaticana, 1997

Advanced Directives/Living Wills/Health Surrogate

Recently one of our dear parishioners, Desmond "Desi" Ward passed away. For nearly 8 weeks Desi was in the hospital suffering from the ravages of a terminal illness. Early on he was given a tracheotomy to help him breathe but of course now he could not speak. I had visited before the trach and administered the last rites: anointing of the sick, viaticum, and the apostolic blessing. I then went away on my retreat to Jerusalem expecting that he most likely would have passed before my return, however he was still in the hospital. I visited him last about a week ago, I heard his confession with nods of yesses and shakes of the head for no's as I went through the Ten Commandments. I absolved him and together we prayed his penance. I asked him if he were afraid and he nodded yes. I encouraged him not to be afraid, that Jesus is with him. Then I prayed the Divine Mercy Chaplet as he fell asleep: it was the last time I saw him. Desi was a faithful Christian who attended Mass weekly and celebrated the Sacrament of Penance & Reconciliation regularly. He prayed for his family and the guys at the Y all the while struggling with his alcoholism. He always kept the faith. On Monday this past week the ventilator was disconnected. Desi's struggle to live was lost and he surrendered himself to the mercy of God.

Desi was put on a ventilator not to save his life but to allow him to breathe though his prognosis was dim. He was dying but there was no one to express his wishes since he was unconscious at the time that the ventilator was connected. The Church teaches us that life is sacred. We are required to use the natural gifts God has given us to preserve life and to heal the wounds. However the Church is neither unreasonable nor irrational. When one is deathly ill, one can refuse extraordinary means to extend one's days on this earth. It is neither immoral nor unethical to refuse extraordinary means when it has been determined that the illness is terminal and there is no reasonable expectation of recovery. And so we can with good conscience refuse extraordinary means. (I remind you that suicide and euthanasia are never an option even with the extreme suffering of the patient. To directly kill another person or oneself is always a grave sin, and to do this deliberately and with full consent is a mortal sin.)

It behooves us to complete an Advanced Directive so that our wishes are clear to our family, our doctors, and our closest friends. Also we need to designate a Heath Care Surrogate, who will assure us that our wishes will be carried out. I have provided for you copies of the **Catholic Declaration on Life and Death (Living Will)** and **Designation of Health Care Surrogate** contained herein. Please avail yourselves of this copy (or go to: https:// www.flacathconf.org/declaration-on-life-and-death), complete it and make copies for your Surrogate, your Doctors and your Executor. Keep a copy at home and bring it to the hospital in case of emergencies.

KEEP HOLY THE SABBATH

There's no better way to deepen our Lenten practice than to review the Ten Commandments. The first three, having to do with our right relationship to God, get the most ink. The one we busy people probably have the most problem with is keeping holy the Sabbath.

If we take this commandment literally, babies will go undiapered and dishes will stay on the table, or perhaps meals will not be served. The sick will go unattended and nothing that has anything to do with physical labor will be done. Is mental labor really work? How about changing that dirty diaper (poor baby!)?

We need to depend on God to discern how to observe real Sabbath time in our lives. The point of this commandment is that God has given us a great gift: one whole day per week when we are free to rest, worship God, sing, feast, love, and rejoice. As Psalm 19 proclaims: "The law of the LORD is perfect, / refreshing the soul" (19:8). Our Sabbath rest is a great gift, to be received from God with joy, not with nitpicking.

413 "No fue Dios quien hizo la muerte ni se recrea en la destrucción de los vivientes [...] por envidia del diablo entró la muerte en el mundo". 414 Satán o el diablo y los otros demonios son ángeles caídos por haber rechazado libremente servir a Dios y su designio. Su opción contra Dios es definitiva. Intentan asociar al hombre en su rebelión contra Dios.

415 "Constituido por Dios en la justicia, el hombre, sin embargo, persuadido por el Maligno, abusó de su libertad, desde el comienzo de la historia, levantándose contra Dios e intentando alcanzar su propio fin al margen de Dios" (GS 13,1).

416 Por su pecado, Adán, en cuanto primer hombre, perdió la santidad y la justicia originales que había recibido de Dios no solamente para él, sino para todos los humanos.

417 Adán y Eva transmitieron a su descendencia la naturaleza humana herida por su primer pecado, privada por tanto de la santidad y la justicia originales. Esta privación es llamada "pecado original".

418 Como consecuencia del pecado original, la naturaleza humana quedó debilitada en sus fuerzas, sometida a la ignorancia, al sufrimiento y al dominio de la muerte, e inclinada al pecado (inclinación llamada "concupiscencia").

419 «Mantenemos, pues, siguiendo el Concilio de Trento, que el pecado original se transmite, juntamente con la naturaleza humana, "por propagación, no por imitación" y que "se halla como propio en cada uno"» (Pablo VI, Credo del Pueblo de Dios, 16).

420 La victoria sobre el pecado obtenida por Cristo nos ha dado bienes mejores que los que nos quitó el pecado: "Donde abundó el pecado, sobreabundó la gracia" (Rm 5,20).

421 "Los fieles cristianos creen que el mundo [...] ha sido creado y conservado por el amor del Creador, colocado ciertamente bajo la esclavitud del pecado, pero liberado por Cristo crucificado y resucitado, una vez que fue quebrantado el poder del Maligno..." (GS 2,2). Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica, 2º Edición.
