452 The name Jesus means "God saves". the child born of the Virgin Mary is called Jesus, "for he will save his people from their sins" (Mt 1:21): "there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved" (Acts 4:12). 453 The title "Christ" means "Anointed One" (Messiah). Jesus is the Christ, for "God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power" (Acts 10:38). He was the one "who is to come" (Lk 7:19), the object of "the hope of Israel" (Acts 28:20). 454 The title "Son of God" signifies the unique and eternal relationship of Jesus Christ to God his Father: he is the only Son of the Father (Jn 1:14, 18; 3:16, 18); he is God himself (Jn 1:1). To be a Christian, one must believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God (Acts 8:37;1 Jn 2:23).

455 The title "Lord" indicates divine sovereignty. To confess or invoke Jesus as Lord is to believe in his divinity. "No one can say 'Jesus is Lord' except by the Holy Spirit" (I Cor 12:3).

In those days, ... the people added infidelity to infidelity, practicing all the abominations of the nations and polluting the LORD's temple ... (2 Chronicles 36:14)

When I read the opening of today's first reading from the Second Book of Chronicles, I can't help but think of our own nation, how it has so drifted away from its Judeo-Christian heritage, so far away from its founding message of truth and justice, two great virtues that form the basis of the American way. In under 50 years we went from truth, justice and the American way to my truth (relativism), my rights (rights theory), and my way (individualism).

Ideas like objectivity are supplanted by subjectivity. There is no longer such a thing as objective truth. What is true is now determined by the individual or group without consideration for precedence, revelation, philosophy and history. A person or society which has adopted the individual conscience as the final arbiter of truth is in effect making man and not God the source of truth. This is dangerous because the others are now subject to the tyranny of a majority or at least a strong and vocal minority. If we recognize God as the source of all truth, then we are obliged to seek the truth through revelation, human experience, and history (philosophy, science, theology, ethics, etc), but if we see man as the source of truth then we can sit in a circle and without reflection on the cumulative knowledge of man, come to some very onerous and selfserving "truths" that in effect suppress or oppress others. Remember, Jesus said, "The truth will set you free," but if our truth is subjective (man-centered) rather than objective (God-centered), the "truth" will imprison us.

For example, it is a truth that pornography is evil. It abuses the "actors", violates the intent of the sexual act, distorts human love, and does incalculable damage to children. However, in our "rights" based society it has been determined by fallible people that pornography is protected under the freedom of expression and freedom of the press! The false narrative has proven my point. We have an entire generation (79% of men ages 18-30) hooked on porn. Sexual abuse in colleges is astronomical and adultery all too common. St. Paul saw this happening in ancient Rome where "their females exchanged natural relations for unnatural, and the males likewise gave up natural relations with females and burned with lust for one another. Males did shameful things with males and thus received in their own persons the due penalty for their perversity" (Romans 1:26-27).

The American way was about freedom but it cannot be good if it is not kept in check. It is only through knowledge of the (objective) truth, believing in God (the source of truth) and discipline (applying the truth) that freedom can be good for the individual and beneficial to the society at large. If we stay the course and practice freedom unrestrained, create our own truths, and insist on our rights over the common good, the individual will suffer and society will breakdown as God's grace is withdrawn over a nation once blessed by God. Yet if we turn once again to God, seek the truth and desire justice for all, America will rise again to be a light to the nations.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Year B of the Lectionary has the Letter to the Ephesians today. Ephesus, today in Turkey, was in the first century a great Greek city, the center for the worship of Diana, the goddess of the hunt. It was a vast city even by modern standards, having nearly half a million people in the time of Paul. Yet that was a time of economic recession and moral decay. No wonder Saint Paul stayed here the longest. It gave him an enormous and religiously curious audience. His preaching stirred up the artisans who depended on the pilgrims who came to honor (and buy mementos of) seventeen gods and goddesses enshrined in the city's temples. You can still see the open-air theater where Paul's homily triggered a riot. Paul did have success here, and many conversions among Jews and Gentiles. They seem to have struggled with hope, perhaps because of their suffering from economic woes and isolation.

Some old traditions say that the Apostle John lived out his days here, and that the Blessed Mother was cared for by him. There's no biblical basis for this, but it is certain that a small house just outside the city has been treasured by Christians and Muslims for centuries as the last dwelling of Mary. Long ago, the harbor silted up and the city was nearly abandoned, becoming a small village. As is so often the case, that accident of history preserved the ancient city, so that archeologists have been very successful in revealing ancient Christian sites. One such site is the Church of Mary, probably the first church to be dedicated to the Blessed Virgin, and the site of the Council of Ephesus in 431. Today, a visit to Ephesus is one of the most rewarding journeys for any pilgrim.

But if he did this with a view to the splendid reward that awaits those who had gone to rest in godliness, it was a holy and pious thought. Thus he made atonement for the dead that they might be freed from this sin" (2 Maccabees 12:43-46).



Vida con Cristo: El Credo Jesucristo, único Hijo de Dios, nuestro Señor

452 El nombre de Jesús significa "Dios salva". El niño nacido de la Virgen María se llama "Jesús" "porque él salvará a su pueblo de sus pecados" (Mt 1, 21); "No hay bajo el cielo otro nombre dado a los hombres por el que nosotros debamos salvarnos" (Hch 4, 12).

453 El nombre de Cristo significa "Ungido", "Mesías". Jesús es el Cristo porque "Dios le ungió con el Espíritu Santo y con poder" (Hch 10, 38). Era "el que ha de venir" (Lc 7, 19), el objeto de "la esperanza de Israel"(Hch 28, 20).

454 El nombre de Hijo de Dios significa la relación única y eterna de Jesucristo con Dios su Padre: el es el Hijo único del Padre (cf. Jn 1, 14. 18; 3, 16. 18) y Él mismo es Dios (cf. Jn 1, 1). Para ser cristiano es necesario creer que Jesucristo es el Hijo de Dios (cf. Hch 8, 37; 1 Jn 2, 23).

455 El nombre de Señor significa la soberanía divina. Confesar o invocar a Jesús como Señor es creer en su divinidad "Nadie puede decir: "¡Jesús es Señor!" sino por influjo del Espíritu Santo"(1 Co 12, 3).
