Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our LORD

"HE WAS CONCEIVED BY THE POWER OF THE HOLY SPIRIT, AND WAS BORN OF THE VIRGIN MARY"
 479 At the time appointed by God, the only Son of the Father, the eternal Word, that is, the Word and substantial Image of the Father, became incarnate; without losing his divine nature he has assumed human nature.
 480 Jesus Christ is true God and true man, in the unity of his divine person; for this reason he is the one and only mediator between God and men.
 481 Jesus Christ possesses two natures, one divine and the other human, not confused, but united in the one person of God's Son.

Rejoice, heavenly powers! Sing, choirs of angels!
Exult, all creation around God's throne!
Jesus Christ, our King, is risen!
Sound the trumpet of salvation! (Exultet)

On Easter night, the deacon (or cantor) begins the celebration of the Lord's Resurrection with the Exultet. This ancient prayer proclaims Christ our Risen King. It acknowledges that sin is destroyed and darkness has been overcome by Light. Together the Church rejoices as a mother rejoices to hear that her son is no longer dead but lives; she is like the widow of Nain or more perfectly Our Blessed Lady who mourned her son's death, but now rejoices with the Apostles. Together with Mary we sing God's praises.

And we rejoice not only because our Savior lives, but because we too live. With the price of his blood we are saved, ransomed from the death that Adam brought upon us. We have passed over from death in Adam to life in Jesus Christ. We are made holy by the blood of the sacrificial lamb, our sins washed away. God has shown us the way out of (exodus) the slavery of sin and into the freedom of grace which God has poured over us like the flood that washed away the evil of the world in Noah's time.

In all this, we see that God loves us. His mercy cannot be comprehended. We can only accept such a gift in faith, perhaps never fully understanding, but always enjoying so unworthily this great gift of redemption. God gave us his Son to free a slave! It is like selling everything you have to feed all the prisoners in the world, for only a day.

If we look at Adam's sin we might want to condemn him for bringing us death, but God makes all things right which man screws up. The Exultet proclaims the necessity of Adam's sin, for without it, we would not know God's mercy and love. The Triduum is truly a blessed event though in human terms so violent and horrid, in the light of the Spirit we see the truth through the reality; the sun will rise and new life will dawn with the resurrection of Christ, with the resurrection of the dead. So while life is harsh, God has in store for those who love him a joy that cannot be quenched. An eternal happiness awaits those who love him. Our innocence will be restored, our mourning will turn to joy, and there will be peace of heart and peace amongst men. Pride will give way to mutual affection and hatred will vanish.

Once again man and God are better than together, they are one. They have been reconciled, restored to the Maker. The enmity between God and man is over. Christ has come back from the dead and gave us his light for he lives as he had promised and we know he will come again, as he promised, to carry us to God's throne. Rejoice for Christ has truly risen!

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Over the next two weeks, as we hear of the interior anguish of Jesus, we are led to the Garden of Gethsemane, the scene of a night of suffering, failure, and loss. In Hebrew, the word means “olive press,” and it was an olive grove, although only a few trees remain. Olives can’t be eaten off the trees, they need to be cured—knocked from the trees at harvest time, scooped into a stone basin, and cracked open by a heavy millstone. The crushing stone weight was itself called a “gethsemane,” and once it was lowered onto the olives, oil from the fruit and the inner stone would drip into a groove and flow into jars. The night before his death, Jesus experienced such anguish that scripture says his own blood perspired from him, an image no one who understands olive oil production could miss.

Today, the Mount of Olives is within the city of Jerusalem and the site of the Church of All Nations, also known as the Basilica of the Agony. It was built in 1924, funded by Catholics in twelve different countries. An open-air altar on the grounds is used by Anglicans on Holy Thursday every year. Nearby is the Russian Church of Mary Magdalene, built by the czar in 1888, its magnificent golden domes a distinctive landmark. There is also another tiny Catholic Church, called *Dominus Flevit*, or “The Cry of the Lord,” built in a teardrop shape in the mid-1950s. For centuries, the Franciscan order has had the care of the shrines of the Holy Land, and our Good Friday collection helps sustain these precious sites.
