Life with Christ: The Creed Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our LORD

THE MYSTERIES OF CHRIST'S LIFE

566 The temptation in the desert shows Jesus, the humble Messiah, who triumphs over Satan by his total adherence to the plan of salvation willed by the Father.

567 The kingdom of heaven was inaugurated on earth by Christ. "This kingdom shone out before men in the word, in the works and in the presence of Christ" (LG 5). the Church is the seed and beginning of this kingdom. Its keys are entrusted to Peter. 568 Christ's Transfiguration aims at strengthening the apostles' faith in anticipation of his Passion: the ascent on to the "high mountain" prepares for the ascent to Calvary. Christ, Head of the Church, manifests what his Body contains and radiates in the sacraments: "the hope of glory" (Col 1:27; cf.: St. Leo the Great, Sermo 51, 3: PL 54, 310C).

569 Jesus went up to Jerusalem voluntarily, knowing well that there he would die a violent death because of the opposition of sinners (cf Heb 12:3).

570 Jesus' entry into Jerusalem manifests the coming of the kingdom that the Messiah-King, welcomed into his city by children and the humble of heart, is going to accomplish by the Passover of his Death and Resurrection.

Before St. John Paull II declared the Second Sunday of Easter to be known as Divine Mercy Sunday, the liturgy already focused on God's great mercy. The Gospel reading in particular reminds us of his unrelenting mercy, his stubborn inclination to forgive, and his almost obsessive compulsion to call us back regardless of our insistent inclination to turn away from Him.

Right away, after the Apostles had abandoned him to the cross, Jesus appears to the Eleven bestowing upon them the power of the Holy Spirit to forgive the sins of men. He did not return in anger, disappointment, or judgment but rather with an understanding and forgiving heart. He breathed on them his Spirit to forgive others as He had forgiven them. An awesome responsibility but one that the Church has taken seriously through the ages. To this day, we have the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation (Confession) where we who have turned our backs on God and offended our neighbors can ask forgiveness and receive it! How our acts of penance pale in comparison to the enormity of God's mercy. And as our Lord professed, if we want mercy we must show mercy:

"Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us."

"It is mercy that I desire, not sacrifice."

"Love one another as I have loved you."

In other words, Our Lord Jesus asks us to pay it forward. If He has forgiven us, we must forgive others. If He has shown us mercy we must show mercy (Parable of the Unforgiving Servant, Matthew 18:21-35). So on this Solemnity of Divine Mercy, let us take time to ask God's forgiveness and moreover forgive those who have offended us.

PARA QUE CREAS

No sucede demasiado a menudo que el autor de uno de los libros de la Biblia se dirija directamente a nosotros para explicarnos por qué está escribiendo lo que está escribiendo. En la lectura del Evangelio de este domingo, que pertenece a la conclusión del Evangelio según san Juan, el autor nos dice que ha elegido escribir estos acontecimientos para que "crean que Jesús es el Mesías, el Hijo de Dios, y para que, creyendo, tengan vida en su Nombre" (20:31).

La carta de san Juan retoma esta idea diciendo que: "todo el que cree que Jesús es el Cristo ha nacido de Dios" (5:1); lo que llamaríamos "nacer de nuevo". Nuestra lectura de los Hechos de los Apóstoles para este Segundo Domingo de Pascua nos muestra exactamente qué sucede cuando los creyentes nacen de nuevo por medio de la fe.
