Life with Christ: The Creed Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our LORD

"JESUS CHRIST SUFFERED UNDER PONTIUS PILATE, WAS CRUCIFIED, DIED AND WAS BURIED"

571 The Paschal mystery of Christ's cross and Resurrection stands at the center of the Good News that the apostles, and the Church following them, are to proclaim to the world. God's saving plan was accomplished "once for all" by the redemptive death of his Son Jesus Christ.

572 The Church remains faithful to the interpretation of "all the Scriptures" that Jesus gave both before and after his Passover: "Was it not necessary that the Christ should suffer these things and enter into his glory?" Jesus' sufferings took their historical, concrete form from the fact that he was "rejected by the elders and the chief priests and the scribes", who handed "him to the Gentiles to be mocked and scourged and crucified".

573 Faith can therefore try to examine the circumstances of Jesus' death, faithfully handed on by the Gospels and illuminated by other historical sources, the better to understand the meaning of the Redemption.

Immediately after Easter I took off to a short retreat down in Boston, Virginia. I stayed at the Longlea Conference Center with about 40 other priests, most of whom come from the Washington and Arlington Dioceses. The center was the old getaway for President Johnson where he enjoyed the company of his lady friend. Now it is a place of retreat, prayers and holy Mass. How good comes from evil never ceases to amaze me.

Our speaker was Dr. Arthur Brooks, a social scientist, of the American Enterprise Institute, a think tank in Washington, DC. He is also the father of three and a convert to Catholicism since his visit to the Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe when he was 16.

The theme was happiness in this world. As I have always said happiness ultimately and exclusively can only be experienced in heaven, in the eternal presence of God, but here on earth we can experience happiness to some degree and its antithesis sadness. Dr. Brooks pointed out that 89% of the American population say it is happy which is relatively high. As it turns out studies have discovered that 40% of our happiness is genetically based. Some are naturally jolly while others are not. 48% of our happiness is based on circumstances. Over these two things we have no control and so that leaves us with the 12% that we can control or have influence over. The 12% includes FAITH, FAMILY, COMMUNITY (friends), and WORK. We choose our faith or at least the amount of faith we want in our lives. Dr. Brooks has found that devout people (of all religions) are much happier that secularists and those who call themselves conservative are twice as likely as liberals to be very happy. This is borne out by the fact that liberals by nature are not happy with the status quo and so they are always looking to be agents of change whilee conservatives want to save the status quo. So religiosity and faith are very important in our general happiness.

Second, family is important to happiness. Child-bearing offers meaning to life. Aristotle attested to this also. He called it *eudaimonia*. Ironically as children grow the happiness level of parents dips but as they mature into independent children, the happiness level increases and brings joy to the home.

Then there is community. This includes friends and social groups. Happiest people are those who get involved with the community (e.g. Knights of Columbus, sodalities, prayer groups, volunteer services, etc.). It turns out that the unhappiest people in America are 60 year old men. They are nearing the end of their careers and they realize that they have few to no friends. Many have worked so hard and got so involved with family that they forgot to make new friends. It is not uncommon that their only friends were those from school and those they know through their wives. If they failed to get involved with church and community, they are bereft of friends. (n.b. the happiest men are the ones overweight who know how to sit back and enjoy a cold brew with some friends.)

Finally there is work. Most Americans are happy with their jobs. Work lends to the dignity of human person giving him purpose and a sense of earned success. In the beginning, God placed Adam and Eve in a garden and commanded them to care

TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

En 1563 el Concilio de Trento estableció que todos los católicos debían recibir la comunión por lo menos una vez al año, de preferencia, durante el Tiempo de Pascua, los 50 días desde la Pascua Florida a la Pascua de Pentecostés. En Chile los sacerdotes en siglos pasados llevaban la Eucaristía a todos aquellos que no pudieron asistir a Misa en la Pascua Florida. Comenzando con el Segundo Domingo de Pascua y acompañados de huasos (vaqueros) quienes los protegían de bandidos llevando el Sacramento en cálices de plata por toda la región. Esto llegó a llamarse Cuasimodo, en base a la frase inicial de la Misa del Segundo Domingo de Pascua: Quasi modo géniti infantes (Casi como recién nacidos).

Hoy día la fiesta también es conocida como "correr a Cristo," por el hecho de llevar a Cristo en carretas decoradas por las calles de los pueblitos mientras los niños corren por delante gritando "¡Viva Cristo Rey!" De esta manera los niños anuncian la venida de Cristo, algo que todo cristiano debería hacer con hechos y palabras todos los días de año.

(Lc 24, 26). Los padecimientos de Jesús han tomado una forma histórica concreta por el hecho de haber sido "reprobado por los ancianos, los sumos sacerdotes y los escribas" (Mc 8, 31), que lo "entregaron a los gentiles, para burlarse de él, azotarle y crucificarle" (Mt 20, 19). 573 Por lo tanto, la fe puede escrutar las circunstancias de la muerte de Jesús, que han sido transmitidas fielmente por los evangelios (cf. DV 19) e iluminadas por otras fuentes históricas, a fin de comprender mejor el sentido de la Redención.
