Life with Christ: The Creed

Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our LORD

JESUS CRUCIFIED

619 "Christ died for our sins in accordance with the scriptures" (I Cor 15:3).

620 Our salvation flows from God's initiative of love for us, because "he loved us and sent his Son to be the expiation for our sins" (I Jn 4:10). "God was in Christ reconciling the world to himself" (2 Cor 5:19).

621 Jesus freely offered himself for our salvation. Beforehand, during the Last Supper, he both symbolized this offering and made it really present: "This is my body which is given for you" (Lk 22:19).

622 The redemption won by Christ consists in this, that he came "to give his life as a ransom for many" (Mt 20:28), that is, he "loved [his own] to the end" (Jn 13:1), so that they might be "ransomed from the futile ways inherited from [their] fathers" (I Pt 1:18).

623 By his loving obedience to the Father, "unto death, even death on a cross" (Phil 2:8), Jesus fulfils the atoning mission (cf Is 53:10) of the suffering Servant, who will "make many righteous; and he shall bear their iniquities" (Is 53:11; cf. Rom 5:19).

St. Peter said, "There is no salvation through anyone else, nor is there any other name under heaven given to the human race by which we are to be saved." (Acts 4:12).

Extra ecclesiam, nulla salus. This Latin phrase meaning "outside the Church, there is no salvation" is a dogma of our faith which means it can neither be doubted nor denied by the faithful. Yet it sounds harsh, exclusionary, and arrogant. But to understand this doctrine we must understand the full union of Christ and his Church. Can a body exist without a head or a head without a body? The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* (1997) helps us understand this teaching when it explained "all salvation comes from Christ the Head through the Church which is his Body. [Christ] himself explicitly asserted the necessity of faith and Baptism, and thereby affirmed at the same time the necessity of the Church which men enter through Baptism as through a door. Hence they could not be saved who, knowing that the Catholic Church was founded as necessary by God through Christ, would refuse either to enter it or to remain in it" (CCC 846). But for those who do not know Christ, Vatican II declared: Those who, through no fault of their own, do not know the Gospel of Christ or his Church, but who nevertheless seek God with a sincere heart, and, moved by grace, try in their actions to do his will as they know it through the dictates of their conscience - those too may achieve eternal salvation. (Lumen Gentium, 16). Meanwhile the Church still has the responsibility to evangelize those who are ignorant of the Gospels.

There is also the question of those who are members of God's Church. Are they necessarily saved? St. Augustine wisely remarked: "How many sheep there are without, how many wolves within!" Also we pray for those who are not explicit members of the Church in the Mass. In the Eucharistic Prayers we pray for "all who were pleasing to you at their passing" (EP III); "all who seek you with a sincere heart" and "all the dead whose faith you alone have known" (EP IV); "all who have died in your mercy" (EP II).

In 2000, the declaration *Dominus Iesus* stated that "it must be firmly believed that the Church is necessary for salvation: the one Christ is the mediator and the way of salvation; he is present to us in his body which is the Church. He himself explicitly asserted the necessity of faith and baptism (cf. Mk 16:16; Jn 3:5), and thereby affirmed at the same time the necessity of the Church which men enter through baptism as through a door...for those who are not formally and visibly members of the Church, salvation in Christ is accessible by virtue of a grace which, while having a mysterious relationship to the Church, does not make them formally part of the Church, but enlightens them in a way which is accommodated to their spiritual and material situation." So let us not lament the loss of souls of righteous men and women but rejoice that they too can enjoy the mercy of Jesus Christ and the benefits of his sacrifice on the cross.
