Life with Christ: The Creed

Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our LORD

JESUS CHRIST WAS BURIED

629 To the benefit of every man, Jesus Christ tasted death (Heb 2:9). It is truly the Son of God made man who died and was buried.

630 During Christ's period in the tomb, his divine person continued to assume both his soul and his body, although they were separated from each other by death. For this reason the dead Christ's body "saw no corruption" (Acts 13:37).

"HE DESCENDED INTO HELL. ON THE THIRD DAY HE ROSE AGAIN"

631 Jesus "descended into the lower parts of the earth. He who descended is he who also ascended far above all the heavens."

The Apostles' Creed confesses in the same article Christ's descent into hell and his Resurrection from the dead on the third day, because in his Passover it was precisely out of the depths of death that he made life spring forth:

Christ, that Morning Star, who came back from the dead, and shed his peaceful light on all mankind, your Son who lives and reigns for ever and ever. Amen

I believe in the Resurrection of the Body.

It went like this: "Father, does the Church allow cremation?" "Yes," I said, "ever since 1969 but it is not the preferred way of burial. Burial of the body is normative. Also, the Church does not permit that the ashes be scattered or kept at home, but rather given the same respect that the body receives. They must be buried, placed in a crypt or buried at sea (not scattered). If someone desires to cremate the body as a denial of the bodily resurrection, then it is not permitted." "Why?" he replied, "after all only the soul is resurrected."

In the Apostles' Creed we profess: I believe...in the resurrection of the body." This article of faith is central to our Catholic religion. We believe that on the third day, Jesus rose from the dead, not as a disembodied soul but as a whole person, with a glorified body. When he encountered the Apostles, Jesus let them touch his hands and his side. He sat down and ate with them. He even said, "Look at my hands and my feet, that it is I myself. Touch me and see, because a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you can see I have." So it is an article of faith that cannot be denied but only affirmed by all who recognize Jesus as the Lord and God who rose from the dead on Easter morn.

What do the saints and Church have to say about the resurrection of the body?

St. Paul declared: "[I]f the dead are not raised, then Christ has not been raised. If Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile and you are still in your sins. Then those also who have fallen asleep in Christ have perished" (1 Cor. 15:13-18).

The **Fourth Lateran Council** (1215), infallibly defined that at the second coming Jesus "will judge the living and the dead. All of them will rise with their own bodies, which they now wear, so as to receive according to their deserts, whether these be good or bad [Rom. 2:6-11]"

The **Catechism of the Catholic Church** states, "'We believe in the true resurrection of this flesh that we now possess' (Council of Lyons II). We sow a corruptible body in the tomb, but he raises up an incorruptible body, a 'spiritual body' (cf. 1 Cor 15:42-44)" (CCC 1017).

St. Polycarp of Smyrna said, "[W]hoever perverts the sayings of the Lord for his own desires, and says that there is neither resurrection nor judgment, such a one is the firstborn of Satan."

St. Justin Martyr taught, "The prophets have proclaimed [that Jesus] shall come from the heavens in glory with his angelic host, when he shall raise the bodies of all the men who ever lived. Then he will clothe the worthy in immortality, but the wicked, clothed in eternal sensibility, he will commit to the eternal fire along with the evil demons" (First Apology 52 [A.D. 151]).

St. Augustine proclaimed, "Perish the thought that the omnipotence of the Creator is unable, for the raising of our bodies and for the restoring of them to life."

Finally, **Our Blessed Mother** "the ever Virgin Mary, having completed

JESUCRISTO FUE SEPULTADO

629 Jesús gustó la muerte para bien de todos (cf. Hb 2, 9). Es verdaderamente el Hijo de Dios hecho hombre que murió y fue sepultado.

630 Durante el tiempo que Cristo permaneció en el sepulcro su Persona divina continuó asumiendo tanto su alma como su cuerpo, separados sin embargo entre sí por causa de la muerte. Por eso el cuerpo muerto de Cristo "no conoció la corrupción" (Hch 13,37).
