Mary conceived of the Holy Spirit and became the Mother of God. When the Holy Spirit descended upon her at Pentecost, she became the Mother of the Church.

Pentecost – the Forgotten Feast

The celebration of Pentecost, not Christmas, is the second greatest feast after Easter. When Jesus was crucified the Apostles fled and hid in the Cenacle (Upper Room) for fear of the Jews, that is, those Jewish leaders who would have them crucified as well if it were in their power. The news came that Jesus had risen from the dead, the Paschal Mystery. This Easter event is the highest feast of the Church, however we should never look at these events as singular disparate events, but see them as a whole mystical event where one could not exist without the other.

Jesus appeared to the Apostles over a 40 day period until he finally ascended into heaven. When He first appeared to them He breathed on them the Holy Spirit giving them the power to forgive sins and lead the Church. He revealed to them the Scriptures and the purpose of his mission and as He ascended he promised to send them an Advocate who would teach them all things.

Then as they gathered once again in the Cenacle along with the Blessed Mother, the Holy Spirit in a strong wind came upon them in form of tongues of fire. The descent of the Holy Spirit upon them gave them the courage to go out into the whole world and preach the Good News (evangelion). This event is considered to be the birth of the Church. When a mother is about to give birth her water breaks and as the child is birthed there is blood; the child passes through blood and water. On the cross water and blood flowed from the side of Christ and the Church was born. (This also reminds us of the creation of Eve, the bride of Adam (man). The Church is the bride of Christ and she too is born from his side.) This water and blood signify the Sacraments of initiation of Baptism and the Eucharist. The Sacrament of Confirmation is signified by the descent of the Holy Spirit. And so you can see that from the cross to the Descent of the Holy Spirit on the Feast of Pentecost the Church is born. What seem to be two separate events are in fact one continuous event, the creation of the Church. From her conception in the womb of the Virgin as the Body of Christ (The Church is defined as the Mystical Body of Christ.) to the breath (wind) of life given her in the room of the Cenacle, the Church is born.

So it is odd that this great feast is not highly celebrated by the community of believers, but perhaps that is a blessing. This feast lacks the commercialism and profanities that Christmas and Easter receive by the populous and so is celebrated with all the solemnity and dignity it deserves.

**Over the centuries many mal-intentioned Christians would exploit this to justify their prejudice and persecution of the Jewish people. In the Gospels, “Jews” refers to those who were from Judea. Later the term “Jew” or “Jewish” would refer to all those who worshipped the God of Abraham (YHWH or Elohim).*
