Life with Christ: The Creed The Communion of Saints

"I BELIEVE IN THE COMMUNION OF SAINTS"

960 The Church is a "communion of saints": this expression refers first to the "holy things" (sancta), above all the Eucharist, by which "the unity of believers, who form one body in Christ, is both represented and brought about" (LG 3).

961 The term "communion of saints" refers also to the communion of "holy persons" (sancti) in Christ who "died for all," so that what each one does or suffers in and for Christ bears fruit for all.

962 "We believe in the communion of all the faithful of Christ, those who are pilgrims on earth, the dead who are being purified, and the blessed in heaven, all together forming one Church; and we believe that in this communion, the merciful love of God and his saints is always [attentive] to our prayers" (Paul VI, CPG # 30).

Hurricane Harvey, *Humanae Vitae*

My dear friend , Fr Jim Ferry wrote this on the occasion of the 50th anniversary of *Humanae Vitae*. I thought it prudent to share it with you. Fr. Paul

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

To witness the famous film-producer, executive and multimillionaire, Harvey Weinstein indicted in Manhattan and elsewhere for great betrayals – in sordid detail – we have witnessed the equivalent of a seemingly unlikely tropical storm in the Hollywood ecosystem: Hurricane Harvey. Check your local listings.

And, the weather is hardly over. It is not over, it continues because there is more heat. And, the meteorologists tell us that heat brings more severe storms. Think global warming. Rising temperatures stirred up the ocean against the powerful and secretive Mr. Weinstein. Thus, the winds blow harder; the rain falls faster. And, if there were an arctic ice cap of those who would have stood by him, it has also melted under the media pressure. Harvey Weinstein and others are now underwater and had pretty far to fall. Few, if any, are throwing them a life preserver.

Should we not be shocked at his blatant disregard for his own talented workers, for they trusted his judgment and were victimized by it?

I bring up Hurricane Harvey not because we can easily condemn him, but because we can also understand him as a blatant disregard for our own Catholic Christian ethic, an ethic which asks us to protect and guard those in our care, both body and soul.

This was a thought echoed in 1968 when another storm was gathering in the post-Vatican-II era of the Catholic Church. The subject was not sexual harassment or assault but rather the means of artificial birth control and contraception.

Pope Paul VI took a risk – and suffered a loss of personal popularity – when he wrote his encyclical *Humanae Vitae* – which reminded all Catholics and Christians of the danger of artificial birth control and contraception. Paul VI was instructing us about the natural connection between the sexual relationships and childbearing. He was also providing guidance about the storms we might encounter in life and how we are called to care for and protect each other.

Bishop Robert Barron, in an article about *Humanae Vitae*, observes that Paul VI is prophetic in his observation about what could happen:

“[Paul VI] is convinced that artificial contraception is morally bad in itself, he’s also persuaded that it would, in the long run, adversely affect general societal attitudes regarding sex. Here is a first observation [by Paul VI]: ‘Let them consider how easily this course of action could open wide the way for marital infidelity and a general lowering of moral standards. Not much experience is needed to be fully aware of human weakness and to understand that human beings—and especially the young, who are so exposed to temptation—need incentives to keep the moral law, and it is an evil thing to make it easy for them to break that law.’” (*Humanae Vitae*, n. 17)

While I am not suggesting that we can find one particular reason why a hurricane such as Harvey Weinstein exists, or why he broke so many laws and lives, we also have to recognize that we all have a responsibility to uphold our ethic of respect and reverence for every human person who may become a victim. When we uphold this ethic, when we teach others to uphold this ethic, we protect them from the storms of life and we also raise the standard, we raise the bar and we bless them with a hope in their own true freedom that no earthly power or producer can give.


HOW TO RECEIVE COMMUNION REVERENTLY

1. Receive in the state of Grace. If you are aware of having committed grave sin, you must make a Sacramental confession before receiving.
2. Approach the Altar modestly. Scantly dressed is a sign of irreverence of both your neighbor and of God.
3. Before stepping up, bow your head and say, “AMEN” when the minister says, “The Body/Blood of Christ.”
4. Put one hand into your dominate hand to receive the Sacred Species. Stepping aside, take the Communion with the dominant hand and eat it immediately. Don't lap it up with your tongue. Don't grab the Host from the minister.
5. By mouth: Step up and open your mouth wide enough to receive on the tongue. Do not grab it with your teeth or lips. Do not lurch forward as if to grab it; Receive the Lord
6. Precious Blood: Receive the Chalice and take a small drink; neither a whiff nor as if to wet your lips only.
7. Return quietly to your pew and make a prayer of thanksgiving.

960 La Iglesia es "comunión de los santos": esta expresión designa primeramente las "cosas santas" (sancta), y ante todo la Eucaristía, "que significa y al mismo tiempo realiza la unidad de los creyentes, que forman un solo cuerpo en Cristo" (LG 3).

961 Este término designa también la comunión entre las "personas santas" (sancti) en Cristo que ha "muerto por todos", de modo que lo que cada uno hace o sufre en y por Cristo da fruto para todos.

962 "Creemos en la comunión de todos los fieles cristianos, es decir, de los que peregrinan en la tierra, de los que se purifican después de muertos y de los que gozan de la bienaventuranza celeste, y que todos se unen en una sola Iglesia; y creemos igualmente que en esa comunión está a nuestra disposición el amor misericordioso de Dios y de sus santos, que siempre ofrecen oídos atentos a nuestras oraciones" (Pablo VI, Credo del Pueblo de Dios, 30).
