Life with Christ: The Creed The Forgiveness of Sins

"I BELIEVE IN THE FORGIVENESS OF SINS"

984 The Creed links "the forgiveness of sins" with its profession of faith in the Holy Spirit, for the risen Christ entrusted to the apostles the power to forgive sins when he gave them the Holy Spirit.

985 Baptism is the first and chief sacrament of the forgiveness of sins: it unites us to Christ, who died and rose, and gives us the Holy Spirit.

986 By Christ's will, the Church possesses the power to forgive the sins of the baptized and exercises it through bishops and priests normally in the sacrament of Penance.

987 "In the forgiveness of sins, both priests and sacraments are instruments which our Lord Jesus Christ, the only author and liberal giver of salvation, wills to use in order to efface our sins and give us the grace of justification" (Roman Catechism, I, 11, 6).

And when the grain is ripe, he wields the sickle at once, for the harvest has come (Mark 4:29).

Growing up I always kept a vegetable garden in the backyard. It was situated between the swimming pool to the east, the septic tank to the south and the hedge row to the west. I grew anything from tomatoes, to green beans to crabgrass. It is the crabgrass of all things that bound me for hours in the garden. This evil creature would preoccupy my efforts beyond my patience. It reminds me now of my classroom. How I would spend 90% of my efforts on 10% of the students. Those weeds and misbehaved pupils however were a blessing. The slow and meticulous extraction of crabgrass actually gave me time to ponder the miracle of life; it was here that I would encounter God. I would contemplate the mysteries of nature and wonder how God created it all. How does a seed develop into a plant that feeds us with fruits and vegetables? By being still in the garden I felt the presence of God. No small wonder that man first encounters God in a garden and Jesus goes to a garden to converse with the Father. A garden is life giving and God the source of all life must be present. In fact God is always present where there is life: on the farm, in the wilds of nature, on the marriage bed, around the table and when the family gathers to place their loved ones to rest.

Yes, the Kingdom of God is like that Garden where the seed of faith and new life are sown and where the life giving Gospel flourishes in the heart of man. In the Garden of God new and eternal life now flourish. The fertile field of this Garden is the heart that is open to the Seed that was planted in times predestined. For some the Garden is bursting with fruit, for others it is just sprouting, and yet for others the crabgrass has taken over. But all is not lost, the crabgrass can be removed. The Gardener has patience. It can be difficult but in the end with diligence, faith, and perseverance the weeds are excised and the fruitful branches put forth in abundance. It is then that the Gardener comes to take his harvest home. Let's allow the Gardener to tend the garden and we will bear much fruit.

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**Worship Space or Sanctuary
Church or House of God
Temple or Chapel**

The place we come to worship and offer sacrifice of the Mass each Sunday and indeed daily goes by many names. Each of these names connote a particular purpose or importance. When I was in seminary, the liturgists were fond of "worship space". To me that was very bland and one dimensional. I felt it failed to convey the beauty of the place we celebrated Mass and restricted it. But my first assignment used an old gymnasium for Mass. By my time it had pews and stained glass but it was noticeably once a gym. However our worship was holy and the Mass was valid in that worship space but rarely did anyone come to light a candle or say a prayer.

I hear the term House of God often but it is quite generic. Any religions can claim their building to be a House of God. It is true however that in the Catholic Church we have the Tabernacle which holds the True Presence of Christ in reserve so that it is truly the House of God.

The term sanctuary is often used by some Protestant sects to describe the interior space of the building while we Catholics only refer to the area about the Altar as the Sanctuary where the Holy of Holies, the Tabernacle rests. And so it is that in this Sanctuary (holy place) we celebrate the Eucharist as opposed to other areas of the building: shrines, chapels, confessional, baptistry, narthex, etc.

There is the very common word for our building in which we gather and that is church. However, church comes from the Greek *ekklesia* which means assembly. So our theological understanding of Church is the Assembly of God and is not a building. Over the ages the term church was applied to the building in which the assembly gathers.

The one term I am fascinated by is Temple often used in the Spanish speaking countries. At first it sounds a bit pagan, but upon contemplating it I realized that the word temple is a place of sacrifice. It is in the Catholic Church that we offer the Sacrifice of the Mass. We offer the bread and wine which we believe to be and know in faith to be the Body and Blood of Christ once it is offered by the priest through the words of consecration that Christ asked us to do in remembrance of him.

So remember that when we enter the presence of Christ in the Tabernacle which is in all the Catholic churches of the world we must and ought to genuflect while making the sign of the cross before taking our seat and remind ourselves that the Temple of God is not a place for casual conversation but a place to worship, pray and be in the presence of Christ and his Church.
