THE SEVEN PETITIONS

2862 The fifth petition begs God's mercy for our offences, mercy which can penetrate our hearts only if we have learned to forgive our enemies, with the example and help of Christ.

2863 When we say "lead us not into temptation" we are asking God not to allow us to take the path that leads to sin. This petition implores the Spirit of discernment and strength; it requests the grace of vigilance and final perseverance.

2864 In the last petition, "but deliver us from evil," Christians pray to God with the Church to show forth the victory, already won by Christ, over the "ruler of this world," Satan, the angel personally opposed to God and to his plan of salvation.

2865 By the final "Amen," we express our "fiat" concerning the seven petitions: "So be it".

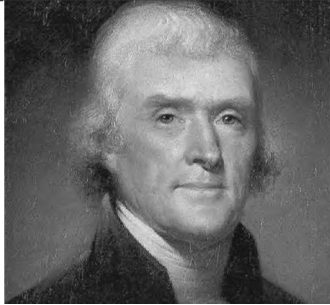

Courage is the choice and willingness to confront life each day in all its ugliness and thereby enjoy all its beauty. It is a very sad tragedy when someone takes his life. Suicide, the killing of the self, has been condemned for millennia. From the Bible to common law, suicide has been recognized as an evil. In fact up until recently the Church forbade a funeral Mass for and burial on Church grounds of someone who had committed suicide. With the rise of psychology and the understanding of duress, depression and other mitigating circumstances, it has been recognized that suicide is often not a willful act and therefore not a mortal sin. However, suicide still remains a grave matter and to willfully, freely and knowingly kill oneself is a mortal sin and to die in such a state is to condemn oneself.

There are two distinct scenarios. One, the suicide of a seemingly otherwise healthy individual. Two, the suicide of someone who is greatly suffering and/or is terminally ill. In either scenario suicide is always wrong. (*n.b.* Jumping in front of a bullet to save someone's life is not suicide but rather it is an unselfish act of great love for one's neighbor as Jesus said, "There is no greater love than to lay one's life down for one's friend.")

Scenario 1: a seemingly healthy young man kills himself because his girlfriend left him. He becomes deeply depressed and sees no hope in his life. He has fallen into despair. Some would say he has no choice since his mental state has been compromised. Yet he does have a choice: he could be courageous and get by this difficult moment in his life or he can allow his fear and excessive self-concern to override what he knows to be right, good and of help to others or himself in a time of need. Some said he was courageous but his mother said to me he was "selfish". He only thought about himself and not the pain that those who love him would have to endure. So the next time someone says to me, "He must have had a lot of courage to kill himself." I will say, it takes courage to live each day, to face the world and to live life knowing that in faith there is nothing to despair, nothing to fear. Trust in God and he will make all things possible.

Scenario 2: today the idea of euthanasia (assisted suicide included) is becoming more acceptable. Hollywood often glamorizes it as a viable solution. But remember, suicide is an intrinsic evil. It is never good to take one's life. If pain is our cross, then we must carry it. Christ suffered immense pain on the way to Calvary. He begged that this cup would pass him by, but as he said, "Father, your will be done." As Christians we must roundly reject the euthanasia of the human person, whether it is consensual or imposed. How much morphine is too much? When do we disconnect the respirator? Can we introduce chemicals/drugs that will hasten death? As believers in the Giver of Life, we can accept pain relievers but to go so far as to willingly, knowingly and freely end human life on our terms is usurping the sole privilege of God, otherwise it is called murder/suicide. The courageous person will endure his suffering and surrender to the will of God, the coward will say: No more, I do not want to carry my cross. I do not give myself over to God but to my will, my fears, and my despair.

We cannot judge any individual for taking his own life though we know it to be a grave sin, but we cannot condone it either. Where today's society seems to be condoning it and even promoting it in the case of extreme illness, we must always be beacons of hope in God's love and mercy especially when we unite our suffering to the Cross and receive the gift of eternal life trusting in the One who created us. Pray for those who have died, pray twice as much for those who have taken their own lives. They need your love now more than ever. Pax Christi, Fr. Paul

2864 En la última petición, “y libranos del mal”, el cristiano pide a Dios, con la Iglesia, que manifieste la victoria, ya conquistada por Cristo, sobre el “príncipe de este mundo”, sobre Satanás, el ángel que se opone personalmente a Dios y a su plan de salvación.

2865 Con el “Amén” final expresamos nuestro “fiat” respecto a las siete peticiones: “Así sea”.
