STRENGTHENED BY THE BREAD OF LIFE

Today we resume the “Bread of Life” discourse from John’s Gospel that began two weeks ago. He makes reference to the Jews’ ancestors who ate manna in the desert. These days we would think primarily of Israel wandering in the desert, but faithful Jews would also have known the story of Elijah that we hear today. Strengthened by food and drink in the desert, the angel of the Lord sends him on his forty-day and forty-night journey (the biblical number for a preparation time). Like the food given to Elijah in the desert, Jesus tells his listeners that he is bread for the life of the world. It is very important that we not stop listening to Jesus after his promise of eternal life—a marvelous promise, but this “reward” is not the only reason we feast on the Bread of Life. We also come to the table to be made strong for the journey of mission, that the whole world might have life in the fullness of Christ. We are compelled, if we have eaten of the bread of life, to go forth in service to all.

Did you realize that when we receive the Eucharist we are in communion with God and with the Church? Yes, when we consume the Sacred Species we consume Jesu in all his divinity. In reality we become one with Jesus, our Lord and our God and so we become divine, united through this communion to the divinity of Christ as well as his humanity. This is why it is so important to be in the state of Grace. To receive with mortal sin on our conscience or to receive because our state in life is contrary to Church discipline is to imply that what we receive has no real consequences.

Also in receiving we became one with the Church, that mystical body of Christ which consists of the faithful baptized. Now while none of us are holy, none of us are worthy, none of us are sinless, the Church herself is the sinless bride of Christ. And as a woman and man become one in the Sacrament of Matrimony, we become one in the sharing of the Eucharist—Communion, literally meaning one with. So it is incumbent upon us to seek out reconciliation with others and with God. If the breach is wide due to serious sin, especially mortal sin, then we must go to the Sacrament of Reconciliation and confess our misdeeds. If the breach is venial (minor), a simple act of penance or of love will wipe it away.

So when we receive the Blessed Sacrament know that you come into union with Christ (God-man) and his Church. Ponder that for a moment and believe.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Careful readers of the "Treasures" will have noticed that the two columns about the oldest monastic communities in the United States refer to the colonial states. The Louisiana Purchase gained a great treasure for our nation, the Ursuline monastery of New Orleans. Among the greatest pioneers of that city were nuns who came from France on a perilous voyage in 1727, pestered by pirates and tossed by fearsome storms. These were genteel, well-educated Ursulines, yet their first task was to roll up their sleeves and open a hospital to care for the pestilence-ridden colony. Next, they opened a school for girls and launched a plan to educate the women being shipped over from France to marry settlers. In this way, they had enormous influence in molding patterns of family and domestic life.

At Christmastime in 1814, the threat of a British assault on the city was growing. On the terrifying night of January 7, 1815, the women of New Orleans gathered in the monastery chapel to pray that the city be spared from destruction in battle. The mother superior made a vow to have a Mass of Thanksgiving on that date every year should the Americans win. That night, Our Lady of Prompt Succor, to whom the nuns had great devotion, became the protector and patron of this great city. The convent in the French Quarter is the oldest standing building in the Mississippi valley, and the only surviving building of the French colonial period. The nuns relocated in 1824, but their old monastery is preserved as a museum and archives for the Archdiocese of New Orleans. The school the nuns began, Ursuline Academy, is the oldest continuously operating Catholic school, and school for women, in the United States.

The Office of Family Life Ministries offers a **Bereavement Ministry Support Training Course** that is currently open for registration. This eight-session program is designed for those who wish to become facilitators for existing parish bereavement support groups or for those who wish to begin a bereavement support ministry at their parish. The course is not limited to those who wish to facilitate a support group, however it can also benefit those who minister to the bereaved. The program serves to increase enthusiasm and education for this ministry. Participants will gain an overview of Loss, Grief & Mourning, current theories and the process of healing. Basic counseling skills will be taught related to listening and asking questions that facilitate healing. Practical information will be given specific to ministering to the bereaved and starting up a parish based support group. Grief in special circumstances, how to assess risk and the need for referral will be taught. Upon successful completion of the program, participants will become Bereavement Support Group Facilitators for the Archdiocese of Newark. Two continuing education credits from Seton Hall University are awarded with completion. **The eight 2.5 hour classes are being offered on Friday mornings at the Archdiocesan Center in Newark. They will begin in Sept. and continue into Nov. of 2018. Tuition is \$175 per participant.**

FORTALECIDOS POR EL PAN DE VIDA
