No God, No Truth; Know God Know the Truth.

And so my heart sinks, again. A few weeks ago we were greeted with the sad news that our former Archbishop, Theodore McCarrick, had credible evidence against him that he molested a youngster over 50 years ago. This past Tuesday we heard that a Pennsylvania Grand Jury alleges that 300+ Catholic priests abused children over the past 70 years.

Personally I can hardly believe this. I was in the seminary system for 8 years and have been a priest for 22 years and I have known of only one priest who had abused a child. If the numbers of the Pennsylvania grand jury are correct that means more than 4 priests a year abused a child in Pennsylvania and I'm sure that is not unique to PA. Yet somehow this is what has happened. How is it that those who were to be models of sanctity turned out to be models of impurity? Without excusing their abusive and destructive behavior and their homosexual tendencies (most of the abuses were against adolescent boys), man is weak and prone to sin, and sin gravely. (Mind you, don't for a moment think this is unique to priests.) Many of these men lost their moral compass and gave into their depravity. While Catholics have high moral standards we are living in a depraved generation which has forgotten that God is the moral compass and man is to obey God not himself. Once man begins to obey himself, all moral laws become arbitrary, relative and subjective. Remember the clichés: *What's good for me, may not be good for you?* and, *Who is to say what is normal?* This moral subjectivism and lack of a moral absolute affects even the most "religious" of our community. None of us are immune to the moral decadence and moral subjectivism that rages all around us. We must as Catholics clearly and without equivocation and mindfully reject what is contrary to the Gospel. We cannot equivocate on moral issues: we cannot attend marriages of same-sex people because they have a right to be happy, and we must teach our children to choose God's way even when it goes against what we think or feel will make us happy. Happiness in this life is not an ends of the Christian vocation. The ends we must desire are to do God's will, to live by his Truth and achieve heaven (true happiness) by denying ourselves, doing to others what we would have them do to us, and love one another as Jesus loves us all the while being faithful to our Church and her teachings.

Today, our children are being battered. The little devices they hold in their hands can and often are gateways into hell. While there are many benefits, there are many dangers. They meet unsavory characters, they see more pornography than is imaginable, they are bombarded by ads, bullying, and finally they are distracted from life. In France they have just made it illegal for a child to have a Smartphone in class so that they can read more and play more with their friends. Bravo!

After decades and even centuries of moral relativism, lack of moral absolutes and distraction away from community, the world, and many Catholics and their priests have gone astray. Be firm in your Catholic faith for it is true religion; reject what is evil and pray for those who have fallen *for but by the grace of God there go we.* Pax Christi, Fr. Paul

(Lib. 5, 2, 2-3: SC 153, 30-38)

The Eucharist, pledge of our resurrection

If our flesh is not saved, then the Lord has not redeemed us with his blood, the Eucharistic chalice does not make us sharers in his blood, and the bread we break does not make us sharers in his body. There can be no blood without veins, flesh and the rest of the human substance, and this the Word of God actually became: it was with his own blood that he redeemed us. As the Apostle says: In him, through his blood, we have been redeemed, our sins have been forgiven.

We are his members and we are nourished by creatures, which is his gift to us, for it is he who causes the sun to rise and the rain to fall. He declared that the chalice, which comes from his creation, was his blood, and he makes it the nourishment of our blood. He affirmed that the bread, which comes from his creation, was his body, and he makes it the nourishment of our body. When the chalice we mix and the bread we bake receive the word of God, the eucharistic elements become the body and blood of Christ, by which our bodies live and grow. How then can it be said that flesh belonging to the Lord's own body and nourished by his body and blood is incapable of receiving God's gift of eternal life? Saint Paul says in his letter to the Ephesians that we are members of his body, of his flesh and bones. He is not speaking of some spiritual and incorporeal kind of man, for spirits do not have flesh and bones. He is speaking of a real human body composed of flesh, sinews and bones, nourished by the chalice of Christ's blood and receiving growth from the bread which is his body.

The slip of a vine planted in the ground bears fruit at the proper time. The grain of wheat falls into the ground and decays only to be raised up again and multiplied by the Spirit of God who sustains all things. The Wisdom of God places these things at the service of man and when they receive God's word they become the Eucharist, which is the body and blood of Christ. In the same way our bodies, which have been nourished by the Eucharist, will be buried in the earth and will decay, but they will rise again at the appointed time, for the Word of God will raise them up to the glory of God the Father. Then the Father will clothe our mortal nature in immortality and freely endow our corruptible nature with incorruptibility, for God's power is shown most perfectly in weakness.

The Office of Family Life Ministries offers a **Bereavement Ministry Support Training Course** that is currently open for registration. This eight-session program is designed for those who wish to become facilitators for existing parish bereavement support groups or for those who wish to begin a bereavement support ministry at their parish. The course is not limited to those who wish to facilitate a support group, however it can also benefit those who minister to the bereaved. The program serves to increase enthusiasm and education for this ministry. Participants will gain an overview of Loss, Grief & Mourning, current theories and the process of healing. Basic counseling skills will be taught related to listening and asking questions that facilitate healing. Practical information will be given specific to ministering to the bereaved and starting up a parish based support group. Grief in special circumstances, how to assess risk and the need for referral will be taught. Upon successful completion of the program, participants will become Bereavement Support Group Facilitators for the Archdiocese of Newark. Two continuing education credits from Seton Hall University are awarded with completion. **The eight 2.5 hour classes are being offered on Friday mornings at the Archdiocesan Center in Newark. They will begin in Sept. and continue into Nov. of 2018. Tuition is \$175 per participant.**

El Sacramento de la Unción de los Enfermos: Por favor llame a sacerdote a celebrar este sacramento de sanación y perdón para alguien que está enfermo gravemente. Favor de no esperar hasta que el enfermo este inconsciente.

El Sacramento del Matrimonio: Las parejas deben contactar a un sacerdote con un año de anterioridad a la fecha deseada del matrimonio. Es un pecado grave no casarse sin el Sacramento del Matrimonio; Ud. no puede recibir los otros Sacramentos.

TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

Entre los varios santitos que de niño recuerdo haber visto en el templo, santa Rosa de Lima (1586-1617) se me ha quedado grabada por su belleza y humildad. No sé quién fue el que me la presentó por primera vez, sólo sé que la recuerdo porque era latina como yo. En su cabeza llevaba una corona de espinas de la cual brotaban rositas rojas. Según mis catequistas, ella había usado una corona de espinas a escondidas debajo de su velo de monja para recordarle que si era bella lo debía a Dios y no a sus propios méritos.

Santa Rosa (Isabel Flores de Oliva) fue canonizada en 1667 como la primera santa americana. Ella encarnaba la expresión "Gracias a Dios". Esta frase la utilizan muchos latinos cuando reciben un cumplido o halago, para reconocer que sus talentos y virtudes se deben a Dios que bendice sus esfuerzos. Ellos, como Santa Rosa, aceptan las limitaciones de su condición humana pero también aceptan la gracia de ser hijas e hijos del Dios que siempre nos ayuda.
