“The Son of Man is to be handed over to men and they will kill him.”

Due process of law. We have all heard this term and society says it is sacrosanct, but why is it so often forgotten? The above quote from St. Mark's Gospel makes it clear to us that Jesus our Lord and God was not even given the privilege of due process. He was arrested for no crime. He was tried within a few hours. Witnesses bore false testimony against him though his judges knew of their duplicity. Pontius Pilate allowed an angry mob to override Roman justice and his own judgment that Jesus was innocent. Is it so different today?

During the Inquisition in Spain (15th thru 19th centuries) many people were not allowed due process of law. Regardless of what you might have heard about the Inquisition, it was instituted by the Church to try heretics, that is, baptized Christians who practiced or preached false doctrine. The Inquisition had to respect the rights of the accused such as facing one's accuser, being advised of the crime he was accused of, a quick and speedy trial and so on. In Spain however, the government controlled the Inquisition and much of due process was ignored. People were arrested and thrown in jail without a trial or ever knowing their supposed crime and their accuser. The poor fellow could not defend himself. Then there was a trial and often the accused was convicted to torture, sever fines, or even capital punishment. This abuse of due process resulted in the conviction of many innocent people or at least disproportionate punishment for the crime. The Pope objected but it fell on deaf ears. The Spaniards were all too powerful. Has much changed?

Today I can still see where due process and the rights of the accused are abused or ignored. A friend of mine was a chaplain to a nearby jail. Men are incarcerated for one or more years awaiting trial. Many others are jailed for failure to pay child support which basically ignores the prohibition of debtor's prison. In the nomination process for a Supreme Court Justice, Judge Kavanaugh is being convicted in the court of public opinion. Accusations which cannot be proven were introduced without an accusers name attached and are accepted as fact by too many. (Fortunately the accuser did reveal herself.) Though no crime is proven, this man is being accused of sexual abuse and may lose out on his appointment. How does one prove a negative?

In the Dallas Charter (the process approved by the US Bishops for dealing with sexual abuse accusations against priests), states that if a priest is accused of child abuse then he is to be immediately removed from his rectory residence though there has been no conviction, no trial, and no due process of law. It seems that a priest is guilty until proven innocent these days. This is a violation of what most Americans hold dear. In Europe that is not the case. When my great-grandfather was accused of a murder, he was jailed. There was no evidence, no motive. If it were not for the real murderer confessing, my great-grandfather could have rotted in jail. How could he prove he did not murder if a "witness" says he did?

2000 years ago, witnesses accused Jesus of crimes he did not commit and he was crucified. We would expect that 2 millennia later it has gotten better but it has not. Many are accused of crimes they did not commit only to have their reputations tarnished. Even if shown to be innocent later on, the damage is done. Let us pray for the accused that they receive due process of law and their rights are protected. This is not to deny justice for victims but to ensure that the accused, esp. the innocent, does not become a victim him/herself.

TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

Últimamente, hay mucho interés en los ángeles y sobre todo en los arcángeles. Según el catecismo católico, los ángeles existen para glorificar y servir a Dios y para ayudar con el plan salvífico de Jesucristo, cooperando con nuestras buenas obras. Lamentablemente muchos, en especial los de la *New Age*, se interesan sólo en los ángeles con el fin de utilizarlos en lugar de dejarse guiar por ellos.

La Tradición ha designado una jerarquía de 9 rangos entre los seres espirituales. Los serafines son los primeros y más cercanos a Dios y los ángeles son los últimos y más cercanos a la humanidad. En esta jerarquía, los arcángeles son los penúltimos en poder, aunque sí son los más buscados por su responsabilidad de cuidar los cuatro puntos cardinales de la creación. Según la tradición hebrea, hay siete arcángeles (Tobías 12:15), de los cuales las Sagradas Escrituras sólo mencionan tres por nombre, Miguel (¿Quién como Dios?), Gabriel (hombre de Dios) y Rafael (Dios sana). De estos, Miguel parece ser el más popular gracias a su poder contra el mal.
