"Whoever causes one of these little ones who believe in me to sin, it would be better for him if a great millstone were put around his neck and he were thrown into the sea."

What is scandal? When we cause someone else to sin because of our actions or inactions, we commit scandal. Scandal surrounds us like the ocean. It is everywhere but like the fish in the sea, we do not notice it until it is drowning us. We are at that point now.

Beginning nearly a century ago, the sexual revolution has reached a crescendo. I mark the approval of contraception by the Anglican Church as the start of the sexual revolution. Protestantism from the Reformation until 1930 had strongly condemned contraception. At the 1930 Lambeth Conference of the Anglican Communion contraception was even approved within marriage. Soon the major Protestant denominations shifted their doctrine to accepting contraception. What contraception does besides thwarting the procreative nature of sexual intercourse, it also opens up the sexual act to abandon. Now a couple, married or not, can have sex on demand without fear of pregnancy or disease. The sexual act becomes divorced from its intended nature – that is the procreative and unitive nature. In essence sexual intercourse becomes recreational. One of my colleagues years ago, said, "The Pope has to wake up and realize that sex is recreational." It turned out later that he was recreating with the students. In other words contraception cheapened sexual intercourse and now sex and sex-like acts are practiced outside of marriage and with anyone with whom one pleases and without a sense of right or wrong.

When we as Catholics buy into this licentious attitude toward sexual intercourse we become complicit in evil causing scandal in the face of the youth. They too grow up believing that sex is nothing more than some physical activity with no moral weight. Evil has triumphed because good Catholics have accepted this scandalous approach to sexuality. As Edmund Burke (1730-1797), an Irish statesman, said, "The only thing necessary for the triumph of evil is for good men to do nothing."

From the acceptance of contraception by the Anglican Church to clergy who have abused minors, a great scandal has arisen precisely because good Catholics did nothing. We cannot be passive in this fight against liberalism, modernism and a laissez faire attitude toward sexuality. Our youth are being lost to secularism, atheism and promiscuity. Fewer and fewer are getting married in the Church or married at all. The population is plummeting and in some western countries it is at the point of no return. A contraceptive mentality belongs to the culture of death.

Pope Paul VI warned in *Humanae Vitae* that contraception opens "wide the way for marital infidelity and a general lowering of moral standards" and in addition, "a man who grows accustomed to the use of contraceptive methods may forget the reverence due to a woman, and, disregarding her physical and emotional equilibrium, reduce her to being a mere instrument for the satisfaction of his own desires, no longer considering her as his partner whom he should surround with care and affection" (§17). In other words, the husband is tempted to see his wife no longer as a person but as an object of his pleasure to be used. This is a direct result of the joint decision to say no to God by saying yes to sex without its procreative purpose (<http://www.catholicstand.com/humanae-vitae-nfp-contraception/>, 9/26/2018).

Sex and marriage have been attacked because "good men" have kept silent. This scandal, amongst many others, has put us in the sad situation we are now in where marriage suffers, children are hurt, and the future looks dismal. May we have the fortitude to do what is good and right and avoid evil so as not to be the cause of scandal but rather the cause of our salvation.

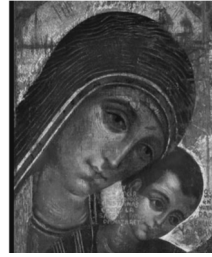

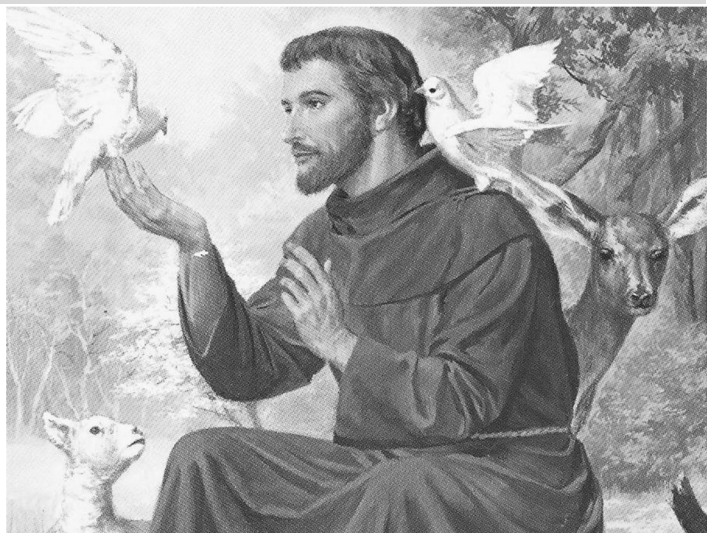
St. Francis of Assisi (1182-1226)

TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

En 1648 el franciscano Matías Abad llegó a la selva chocona en la costa pacífica de Colombia. Allí, a pesar de los ataques indígenas en contra de los misioneros, pudo celebrar la fiesta de san Francisco (4 de octubre). Al pasar de los años la devoción a san Francisco en Chocó se convirtió en una mezcla de la fe católica, las religiones africanas y la brujería. Este sincretismo es una forma de superstición que busca utilizar al santo en lugar de imitarlo.

Esta confianza en imágenes y estatuas es común y hasta peligrosa entre los latinoamericanos. Las hazañas de ciertas imágenes milagrosas llegan a proporciones exageradas. Por ejemplo, la imagen de "san Pachito", como lo llaman los choconos, se le atribuye haber apagado un incendio que amenazaba la población. La pusieron delante de las llamas y las apagó con su propio sudor.

Hay que tener cuidado con la importancia de las imágenes sagradas de nuestras tradiciones. En un descuido pueden convertirse en ídolos o amuletos en lugar del recuerdo de la presencia divina y el desafío de vivir en santidad.
