**J**esus, looking at him, loved him and said, "You are lacking in one thing. Go, sell what you have, and give to the poor and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me."

At that statement his face fell, and he went away sad, for he had many possessions. So does the Lord expect us all to sell all that we have and give it to the poor? Yes, but not necessarily as you are thinking. Our Lord was given to much hyperbole. For instance: If your eye causes you to sin, pluck it out. When this man asked Jesus what he must do to inherit eternal life, Jesus pointed out the Ten Commandments. The man responded that he did keep the commandments well. With love Jesus saw into his heart and knew that he was a man attached to his possessions and this is what was keeping him from totally giving himself to God. He needed to divest himself of the very things that held him back. Now many of us have possessions too, but the question arises, "Do I possess my possessions or do my possessions possess me?" Like demonic possession, it is either perfect or imperfect. If it is perfect then we are completely at ease with our possessions. They become our best friend, our total preoccupation, our end-all. If however we are not totally possessed by our possessions, then we struggle with having too much. We realize that we have more than we need yet we cannot let go. Then there are those of us who realize that what we have is a gift of God. It is by God's grace that we are blessed to have all our material needs and then some. So we are generous with the things God has given and share it especially with those in need. There are also those who are "called" to the evangelical life, that is a life of poverty, chastity, and obedience. It is in the life of poverty that one learns to completely rely on the providence of God our Father who knows every hair on our head. Jesus was calling that man that day to live the evangelical life but he went away sad because he loved his possessions more than the prospect of eternal life. I do hope that later he reconsidered and followed Jesus.

In our own lives let's never love this life, this life's possessions and this life's relationships more than the prospect of eternal life. Perhaps it is that those who possess things can reach heaven before those who have nothing because they know that what they possess is by the grace of God and as it is a gift they give to others and those who have nothing may only live to get and keep the few possessions they have. For those who have been given much, much will be expected. And those who have little may lose the little they have. My great-aunt gave me some sound advice a long time ago and I try to live by it faithfully, so I pass it on to you: Give a little, save a little, spend a little. This has always helped me to keep a balanced approach to my possessions.

This week I want to announce the beginning of an important journey of deepening our Christian faith. Our culture continues to eat away at our faith life and community through messages of relativism, materialism and egoism. We are confronted with situations and decisions that can weary us and cause suffering and a loss of hope. Why is this happening to me? Why is someone I love suffering? What is my life about anyway? Where am I going? The ultimate answers to these questions is in Christianity which in the final analysis is not about rules and regulations, but about an encounter with Jesus Christ.

The journey of which I speak begins **Monday night, October 15 at 8 PM in the School**. These are an opportunity to experience the Good News of Christianity as directly relevant to our lives. Everyone is welcome – those with faith, those who question their faith and those without faith, those baptized and those who have not been baptized, those who may have left the Church, those who have wondered about whether this is the time to return.

# ¿QUE PASA?

## PALABRAS DE SABIDURÍA

Hoy aprendemos en la primera lectura que el espíritu de la sabiduría llega a los que lo invocan. La sabiduría, como la Palabra de Dios, lleva un mensaje de consuelo y a la vez constituye un gran desafío. La carta a los hebreos nos cuenta que la Palabra de Dios, que está empapada con la sabiduría de Dios, es “más penetrante que una espada de dos filos”. No podemos acobardarnos ante la sabiduría de Dios ni ante la palabra que tiene el poder de penetrar nuestro corazón y mente. Jesús, la Palabra viva de Dios, la encarnación de la sabiduría, le dice cosas fuertes y muy penetrantes al joven rico que acude a Jesús en busca de respuestas a sus dudas más profundas. Precisamente, cuando el joven pensaba que había hecho lo suficiente para cumplir los mandamientos de Dios, se le exigió más. Lo mismo sucede en nuestro caso.

## TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

Existe en Perú un mural milagroso de la Pasión de Jesucristo. Esta imagen reconocida como el Señor de los Milagros, el Cristo Moreno o el Cristo de Pachacamilla fue pintada por un angoleño en el siglo XVII para una cofradía de africanos. A mitad del siglo un fuerte terremoto sacudió a Lima y las paredes de la cofradía se cayeron, sin que se dañara el mural. Eventualmente la imagen se reveló como milagrosa para los que oran delante de ella.

En la imagen aparece Jesús crucificado. Sobre él está el Espíritu Santo y el Padre. A la derecha de la cruz está su Madre con el corazón traspasado por una lanza y a su derecha, el fiel discípulo amado. Esta imagen es venerada como el Señor de los Milagros. Sin saberlo el artista angoleño ha pintado una reflexión teológica sobre la divinidad y la humanidad de Jesucristo. En su pasión redentora Jesús abre las puertas del cielo y de la comunicación entre el cielo y la tierra, entre Dios y la humanidad representada por la Madre y el discípulo.
