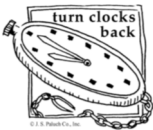

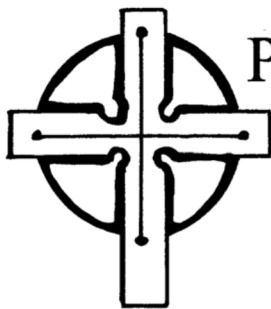

PRIESTHOOD SUNDAY

“You are a priest forever according to the order of Melchizedek” (Hebrews 7:17, Psalm 110:4).

Well, I am told that today is Priesthood Sunday or Priest Appreciation Day. Sister Emily is always fond of saying, “We’re all useful but not necessary.” How true that is, especially in God’s Church. We are here to be useful to the Kingdom of God, and though we are each important in the eyes of God we certainly are not necessary to the success of God’s Kingdom. St. Paul was a great persecutor of God’s Church but in the end he became her greatest evangelist. In bringing the Good News to many nations he established the Church throughout the Empire. His letters were considered so important that they were preserved by the early Church and came to be considered inspired texts. In the end St. Paul was executed however the Church endured.

Tertullian was a great theologian. His teachings are still studied by seminarians. However in the end he fell into heresy. His theology was useful but Tertullian himself was not necessary for the good of the Church.

Also half-jokingly Sr. Emily oft repeated a saying of her mother: “There is nothing deader than a dead priest.” So while we may all love our priests (or despise them), once he has passed and time moves on, who remembers their pastors? If I mention Fr. Van Wie or Bishop McDonnell, you may say I remember him but have you prayed for him. Yes, priests need your prayers both in life and in death. A good priest does not look for grand memorials, flashy eulogies or canonization. A priest who desires to have a fulfilling priesthood, desires to serve those put into his pastoral care. He gets up early to celebrate the holy Mass. He spends the day running the parish so that the spiritual and pastoral needs of his flock are available and provided for. The priest who loves Christ and his Church, makes himself the servant of all. He is at service to the institution by maintaining the deposit of faith; he is at service to the people by his willingness to provide the sacraments, hear the confession, and comfort the sorrowing. He also makes it possible for the People of God to flourish in their faith by supporting their apostolate and vocation. Perhaps when a priest dies he will be remembered for a short while and then forgotten, but hopefully what he has done will have a lasting (and positive) effect on the faith-life of the sheep that have been entrusted to him. Though a mother may forsake her child God will not abandon us, the priest and his parishioners. To be remembered by his parishioners is a blessing but to be remembered by God for the many good deeds he has done and the faith he has lived out is all a priest truly desires.

Keep Fr. Jose Pablo, Fr. Octavio, the many priests who have passed through Holy Trinity Church and me in your prayers that we may be good priests for the people of God and remain faithful to our calling. God bless you all.
