**The Lord our God is Lord alone!  
You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart,  
with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your  
strength.**

*Shema Israel, Adonai eloheinu Adonai echad.* This quote from Deuteronomy 6:4 is the most sacred text for the Children of Abraham. According to the Mosaic Law they must wear it on their forehead and on their forearm (phylacteries). It is also contained in the mezuzah, that little box nailed to the door post of every Jewish home. When I was in seminary, Fr. Serratelli, now Bishop of Paterson, required us to memorize this line in Hebrew.

The Lord Jesus told the man in today's Gospel passage that he was not far from the Kingdom of God because he understood well the meaning of these words. Furthermore, he knew that to love God with all our being and to love our neighbor are intimately connected. We see this plainly in the life of Jesus who loved us with the same love that the Father and He share.

This past week, a disturbed and hate-filled man entered a synagogue and unleashed his anger on innocent people, our elder brothers in faith. As they prayed on the Sabbath and celebrated the naming of the children, many died because the love of God was absent in the heart of one man. How odd it is that someone could claim his belief in God and at the same time hate his neighbor. But that is the culture we live in. It was the culture Jesus lived in. That is why Jesus sees in this scribe the light of the Kingdom because he answered with understanding while many did not.

In Jesus' time many claimed to believe in God, even to love Him, but drastically forgot to love their neighbor, be he Jew or Gentile. The powers that be scorned the sinner (breaker of the Law). Yet Christ came to call that very sinner to salvation, teaching us that we too are redeemable, lovable, and desired by God. As Christians we need to love what seems unlovable, desire those who are undesirable, forgive those who feel unforgiven. As St. Francis said, we must be God's instruments of peace.

Today is not much different than 2000 years ago. Many still say they believe in God but in reality they are filled with hate and selfishness. Marriage of one man with one woman is seen as archaic but the right of two likes to marry is sanctioned by law. Children in the womb are given the name fetus so that we can more easily accept the right of a woman over the right to life of an infant human person. Yet if the child is aborted because of its sex that is considered unjust; however if it is aborted because it has a genetic anomaly, that is acceptable and even encouraged. What contradictions we live when our belief/love in God is separated from our love for others or vice versa. As long as we attempt to separate the divine from the human which Christ had united, we will continue to hate, destroy, and manipulate our neighbor for our greater glory. This man in Pittsburgh may have fulfilled his will by the destruction of life, but he is very far from the Kingdom for he loved neither God nor his neighbor, and I dare to say not even himself. But before

we judge let us be sure that our love for God is reflected in our love for our neighbors as we forgive one another, protect the innocent and care for those who cannot care or speak for themselves. Then we can say in our heart of hearts, "The Lord my God is Lord alone! I will love Him with all my heart, soul, mind and strength and love my neighbor as myself."

## TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Just two years ago, we engaged in one of the core activities of our democratic system: a presidential election. Actually, the institution of election can be traced to traditions in the Church, and although bishops are no longer chosen in this way, abbots and abbesses (heads of monastic communities) have almost always been elected by full voting members of their communities. The lifetime appointment begins when the monks or nuns are gathered in "chapter" at the death or resignation of the abbot, and fortunately for all involved, campaigning is not allowed! The members of the community discern, with prayer to the Holy Spirit, who among them is the best suited for leadership. Once chosen, the new leader requests the blessing of the local bishop, who usually presides at a ceremony of consecration or investiture. The ballots are always secret, and a simple majority must be achieved.

In our American system the Electoral College is the determining voice in the presidential election, not the popular election on a November Tuesday, just as the monastic chapter is the electorate. Today, most religious orders elect general superiors in "chapter" by delegates of the professed members, and usually for a term of six years. A few, like the Jesuits, elect for life. At least we don't have that weight on our shoulders when we choose a president. Four years at a time will do!

## TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

Uno de los santos más populares de la época medieval fue el soldado húngaro conocido como Martín Caballero o Martín de Tours (c. 315-397). Esta popularidad se debió a su biografía escrita por un discípulo, Sulpicio Severo. Su vida fue el mejor ejemplo de santidad a través de varios siglos. Contiene esta biografía muchos de los acontecimientos, enseñanzas y milagros de la vida del santo que fue soldado en el ejército romano antes de su conversión. Muchos ignoran que fue monje, misionero y obispo por muchos años.

Su imagen decora muchos almanaques latinoamericanos y él continúa siendo un santo popular. La representación más común de san Martín es la de un soldado romano sobre un caballo que rasga su manto rojo a la mitad con una espada para darle una parte a un pobre sentado a los pies del caballo. Según su biografía, Martín hizo esto durante el proceso de su conversión y resulta que el pobre limosnero se le aparece en un sueño revelándose como Cristo mismo, ya que lo que un cristiano hace por los pobres y marginados lo hace por Jesús.
