**"Amen, I say to you, this poor widow put in more than all the other contributors to the treasury."**

Being a coin collector, I have always been impressed with this passage about the Widow's Mite. I have searched high and low looking to acquire a mite and have finally found one. I place it at the top of my collection though it only cost \$45.

It is quite small, about ¼ inch in diameter and made of bronze. In Jesus' time it wasn't worth much either. There were much nicer larger coins of bronze and coins of silver and gold. When Jesus told St. Peter to go fishing, St. Peter pulled a gold coin out of a fish's mouth – enough to pay the temple tax.. When Judas Iscariot betrayed our Lord, he receive 30 silver coins, the price of a slave. And when Jesus entered the temple grounds, he became angry and overthrew the money changers' tables (Roman coinage wasn't allowed in temple purchases). When the leaders asked Jesu if it were lawful to pay taxes to the Romans, Jesus looked at a Roman coin with the Emperor's image and said, "Give to Caesar what is Caesar's and to God what is God's. It seems we cannot get away from money; it invades every part of our life.

And so our poor widow approaches the collection box and deposits two small copper coins worth about two cents. It wasn't much at all but what her critics failed to notice was the love with which she gave. Sure, the onlookers gave much to the temple but they did it out of their surplus. It was money they didn't need. IN other words there was no sacrifice in what they gave. The widow on the other hand gave all she had. Tomorrow she would go hungry but for her it was an act of love, not of duty, obligation, guilt or show. Christ instructs us clearly to give in such a way that does not bring glory to ourselves but only to God. "Do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing" (John 7:17).

In the 10 years I have been here at Holy Trinity I have never asked you to increase your giving. Times had been lean until recently and so I was hesitant in asking. But I have to let you know that the collection has been sliding since I have arrived. Not by much but nevertheless it has gradually decreased. I believe this is because of attrition of the "old guard" and an increase in immigrants who have lesser means. So I ask that those who can to please increase your giving. I won't say by how much but keep in mind that giving is to be an act of love before it is an act of duty. My grandmother shared an interesting story with me. When she was a little girl her mother would give her a nickel for the church collection. Sometimes however she would take the nickel and spend it on a movie. Today a movie is about \$15. Our average collection per person on a Sunday ranges from \$2 to \$10 depending on the Mass. I would like to see the average giving rise to the cost of a movie. With 1000 adults and more attending Mass weekly that should raise the collection to \$15,000. It may sound farfetched but when we have the two collections: regular and maintenance we already get near \$13,000, however when we have one collection, we average around \$7,000. Forgive for asking for more, but if we can think about it and pray about it, I do believe we can make that goal. With the increase I will be able to hire some needed help around the parish.

I also want to inform you that the renovations of the church are planned to begin January 7, 2019 and be completed by Summer of 2019. Over the years many have made contributions to the renovation and I have saved money to do the work. The pews will be refinished, the floor will be redone, the walls will be painted and new lighting will be installed besides some other aesthetic finishes. Also we will have any funerals in nearby parishes in this time but Sunday celebrations will be held in the church though we may be sitting on folding chairs.

As the widow gave to the temple, may we too be so loving in how we give.

## LLAMADOS A SER DISCÍPULOS

La vocación central en el Evangelio según san Marcos es la vocación, o el llamado de ser discípulos. El pasaje del Evangelio de hoy nos brinda por lo menos un ejemplo de qué significa la vocación de ser discípulo y un ejemplo de lo que no significa. Una viuda pobre nos muestra que ser un buen discípulo significa seguir el camino de servicio de Jesús, incluso si implica entregar todo lo que tenemos para vivir (o incluso nuestra vida). Los letrados nos muestran con su mal ejemplo que ser un buen discípulo implica la vocación de hacer llegar el cuidado de Dios a los más necesitados.

En nuestra lectura del libro de los Reyes otra viuda y su hijo corren peligro de morir. Ellos también entregan lo poco que tienen, pero son recompensados por Elías con comida suficiente para un año. Y la lectura de la carta a los hebreos nos recuerda que Jesús sacrificó su vida "para salvación de aquellos que lo aguardan" (Hebreos 9:28).

Según testigos, Walter animaba a sus compañeros a la reconciliación y la Eucaristía. Hablaba tan elocuentemente del Santísimo Sacramento, que parecía sacerdote. Siendo laico, él supo ejercer su sacerdocio bautismal.

"El aborto y el racismo son dos síntomas de un error humano fundamental.
