Extra ecclesiam, nulla salus

A house divided against itself cannot stand. These words of Scripture from the mouth of our Lord were repeated once again by our sixteenth president Abraham Lincoln in reference to a divided nation.

It seems at times that we are once again divided as a nation. Right v. left; conservative v. progressive, republican v. democrat. Which way do we go as Christians? There is an ancient Greek maxim: everything in moderation. Yet Our Lord Jesus said, I have come not to bring peace but war. I dare not take his message out of context since he was speaking about spiritual matters of conversion and faith, however we must not ignore the reality that socio-political matters often intersect with matters of faith for we are called to be witnesses in the world: You are the salt of the earth and the light of the world. St. Paul also clearly stated in his letter to Titus that we must be good citizens, witnessing to the Gospel with our integrity and public behavior.

Our nation is once again split and sometimes I believe that if we do not keep the faith it will only get worse. A democracy like ours can only endure if faithful men and women hold true to their Christian faith because it is through our faith that we respect others rights thereby securing our own. Respect for the other person is very important for democracy to work and common law to endure. (Common law is the practice of common sense basically. For example: a man marries a woman.) Since we no longer have the common law, we have now adjudicated that it is the right of a man to marry a man. Absurdity to some since it violates the natural law, accepted practice to others who no longer respect the common law and natural law but live by the whims of man.

But what I want to focus on is the dangers that arise from the extremes. If we have learned nothing from the past century, we must know this: Socialism/communism is an extreme leftist ideology which has resulted in the suffering and deaths of millions upon millions of people. Leftists like Hitler, Stalin, Mao, Che are among the many who imposed communism and national socialism on the population. Perhaps they believed they were doing good for the masses, but ultimately they starved farmers, committed genocide, stamped out cultures and tried to end belief in God. Today's left does it more subtly.... They have an almost evangelical like push of atheism (no public prayer, no displays of the Crèche or Ten Commandments on public property, and even in France no outward display of religiosity). The left pushes such abhorrent behavior as abortion, sodomy, a one-world order, the tyranny of the mob, anarchy, etc. There is even a very militant leftist group call Antifa (sort for antifascist) who actually use fascist methods of terror and intimidation by violently attacking those they feel are a danger to society, namely those they consider too much to the right.

On the far right we have supremacy movements: KKK, Evropa, Nation of Islam, Neo-Nazism etc. These movements play to religiosity but are in fact anti-Christ using religion to bolster their warped ideologies. They lack respect for the human individual and see only the select group as their cause ignoring the dignity of each human person.

Yes there are those who support abortion, gay marriage, and a non-religious society and there are those who know abortion to be murder, respect the traditional meaning of marriage, and see the benefits of religion in a civil society. But whatever side of the fence we stand, we must respect each other as human beings with dignity, endowed with inalienable rights given to us by God. When we forget this we begin to go off to the far right or the far left to which we are inclined as individuals without the objective measure of a loving personal God. Christians have survived and even flourished in societies that were often very anti-Christian (Imperial Rome, Moslem conquest, Protestant

reforms, Free Masonry, Communism and just plain indifference), because we kept the faith and trusted in Jesus, not solely in our own frail and fractured humanity which tends toward chaos, division, and ultimately death. America will come and go, but our faith will endure. Live in the freedom and love of Jesus and we will know a salvation that surpasses any party, any ideology, and any falsehood utopias thrown our way. Let us stay united in Christ for there is no salvation outside of Him and his Church.

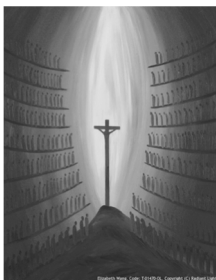
