Welcome the Stranger.

As Christmas approaches and we see thousands of immigrants pounding at our door, what is a Catholic to do? We know from the stories of the Bible that immigration is a constant theme. Beginning with Abraham and his family immigrating to Canaan as directed by the LORD. Then in a time of famine Israel (Jacob) and his sons and their families immigrated to Egypt where they were fortuitously welcomed by the Vizier of Egypt, their brother Joseph. And when pharaoh no longer knew Joseph, the now enslaved Hebrews were returned to their homeland with Moses. We hear about Jesus, Mary & Joseph to Egypt out of the reach of the maniac, Herod. Immigration is a constant biblical theme and one of human history.

Today we still see hoards migrating around the world either willfully or under duress. The Rohingya are being forced out of Myanmar. Syrians are fleeing a civil war. Africans are avoiding hunger and Muslim terrorists. In Latin America the people are running from gangs and organized criminals.

So it is no wonder that many seek a life in the United States where there is freedom, peace and abundance. So what is a Catholic citizen to do and understand? Our Catholic teaching is not silent on immigration. It puts out three principles which I'll mention briefly but you can discover more at <http://www.usccb.org/issues-and-action/human-life-and-dignity/immigration/catholic-teaching-on-immigration-and-the-movement-of-peoples.cfm>

You'll be surprised how close our present US Policy is to Catholic teaching.

The First Principle: People have the right to migrate to sustain their lives and the lives of their families. The ancient Christian teaching is that the goods of the earth belong to all people. While the right to private property is defended, individuals don't have the right to use private property without regard for the common good. When a person cannot achieve a meaningful life in his own land, then he has the right to move.

The Second Principle: A country has the right to regulate its borders and to control immigration.

A moral person must act for the good of all people. While individuals have the right to move in search of a safe and humane life, no country is bound to accept all those who wish to resettle there or receive so many migrants that its social and economic life are jeopardized. Thus, Catholics should not view the work of the government as negative or evil. Those who work to enforce our nation's immigration laws often do so out of a sense of loyalty to the common good and compassion for poor people seeking a better life.

The Third Principle: A country must regulate its borders with justice and mercy.

All Catholic social teaching is understood in light of the absolute

equality of all people and the commitment to the common good. A nation may not simply decide that it wants to provide for its own people and no others. A developed nation's right to limit immigration must be based on justice, mercy, and the common good, not on self-interest.

Undocumented immigrants: Often their presence is considered criminal since they arrive without legal permission. Regardless every person has basic human rights and is entitled to have basic human needs met—food, shelter, clothing, education, and health care. In the Bible, God promises that our judgment will be based on our treatment of the most vulnerable.

The US is a welcoming country. We or our ancestors have all come here from other places. Some to escape religious persecution, others to have a better life, but whatever the reason they came. For some the road was difficult: Slavery, xenophobia, Irish need not apply, anti-Catholicism, etc. But they made the best of it and have achieved the American dream. Let us welcome new peoples while defending the integrity of our borders, the righteousness of our laws, and the dignity of every human person. As Christ taught us: Do unto others as you would have them do unto you.

Chanukkah



The Feast of Lights or the Feast of Dedication marks the victory of Judah of Maccabee over the Syrian and Greek armies of 167 B.C. The story of the profanation of the Temple and its subsequent cleansing and rededication is retold, with particular emphasis on the miracle of the oil. In restoring the Temple, Judah needed pure olive oil for the “eternal light” which burned con-

tinuously. He was unable to find enough oil for more than one day’s burning; however, the lamp continued to burn for eight days until more oil could be obtained.

In Jewish homes, candles set in a special menorah are lit for the eight days of Chanukkah: one on the first night, two on the second and so on until eight lights are glowing on the last night. Celebrations include singing songs, spinning tops called dreidels, and playing games. Foods fried in oil, commonly potato pancakes for Jews of European descent, are traditionally served. Chanukkah begins December 3rd and lasts 8 days. Let us pray for our elder brothers & sisters in faith, especially for the congregation in Pittsburgh that suffered so much this year.
