"I am the voice of one crying out in the desert, 'make straight the way of the Lord,'" Jn 1

How much mankind has not changed in 2000 years! In the Gospel of St. John chapter 1, John the Baptist denied that he is the Christ. Many believed he was, and he had to dispel this error. He knew he had a mission and it was from God, that is, to prepare the way for the true Messiah who would come and baptize in fire and the Holy Spirit. Often we see greatness in someone or something and we confuse it with Truth.

Today we often place our hopes and our dreams in medical technology, in psychology, and in law. Some even put their hope in politics. But every time this has happened it has led to disaster. Many had put their hope in communism and fascism, so millions upon millions suffered and died. Many put their hopes in economics, only to see their 401Ks dry up and their stocks dwindle including yours truly. Some put their heart into psychology only to discover the sicknesses of the soul go more deeply than statistics, psychotropic drugs, and talking. And now the way for many is medical and reproductive technology. More and more couples are counting on medical science to help them reproduce using methods that frankly contradict the dignity of the human person. In vitro fertilization, surrogacy, contraception, freezing of human beings in their embryonic state and fetal stem cell research all disregard human dignity and count the person as a commodity; something to be used as one likes rather than being the object of their love. The marital act is being reduced to a function rather than an intimate union of two persons wholly in love for the purpose of strengthening that love and in the hope of bringing forth new life as its fruit. The Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith published Dignitas Personae, On the Dignity of the Person. It is a short document extolling the basic dignity of human life and how certain modern procedures may or may not respect human dignity. It is certainly worth the reading and reflection of all educated Catholics. You can look it up on the internet at websites such as the Vatican.va or Zenit.org.

Unless we Catholics begin to show the world how to respect the human person, no one will hear the Truth that St. John was preaching. We cannot expect anyone to respect their neighbor if we ourselves do not respect the human person as someone created in the image and likeness of God. We as Catholics must put our trust in Jesus, not in science, or money, or medicine. Of course we use these things but only as a means, not as an ends in themselves. Psychology should only be a tool we use to help understand people. Medicine is to aid us in living a healthier life; it is not going to give us eternal life. Economics are to help us live a decent standard of living; they are not good when people become another dispensable part of a machine.

The only Messiah and Savior is Jesus, anything else is to serve as a means to Jesus and bringing his good news of salvation to the world. Neither Marx nor Smith, neither Jonas Salk nor Margaret Sanger of Planned Parenthood notoriety can save the world; only the Truth can set us free and that Truth is that Jesus is Lord and God who has come to us and freed us from the false illusions of the devil who tries to make gods of things, knowledge, wealth, and technology. Come Lord Jesus fill the hearts of the faithful with your love that this new year we may know the truth that your coming to us as a man, has shown us the way to heaven.

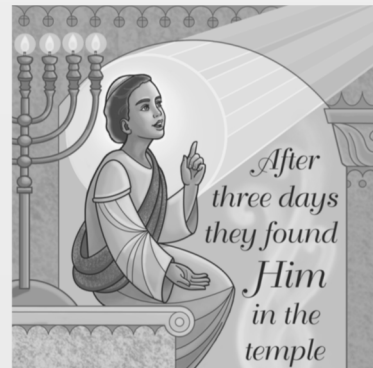

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Today's feast is new as feasts go, and it sets us this year in a very modern crisis. Amid conflicting schedules and commitments, a young man, testing the limits, has strayed from his parents and gone off to the big city. Mary and Joseph search frantically, only to find the child Jesus in the temple, conversing with the elders and scholars of the law, who are amazed at his wisdom.

In the time of Jesus, the temple was the religious center of Jewish ritual. Outside of Jerusalem, people gathered in the synagogues, centers of learning, for daily prayer and study. Still, everyone longed to journey to the temple to participate in the offerings, and to fulfill certain obligations of the law that could only be done there. On this feast, we catch a glimpse of the family of Jesus: parents dealing with the normal stresses of raising a child, and yet completely grounded in the ways of faith and tradition.

There has always been an appreciation in Christianity for the value of pilgrimage—the journey to holy places that is a symbol of our life's journey to God, and a sense of connection to important events in our family history. During the Christmas season, many of us undertake pilgrimages to the family homestead for festival meals, to the parishes where we were formed in the faith, or perhaps even to a beautiful manger scene or festival of lights. There are few better days than this in our calendar for spending time with the family, especially on a short pilgrimage to a favorite place. Just make sure that no one gets left behind!
